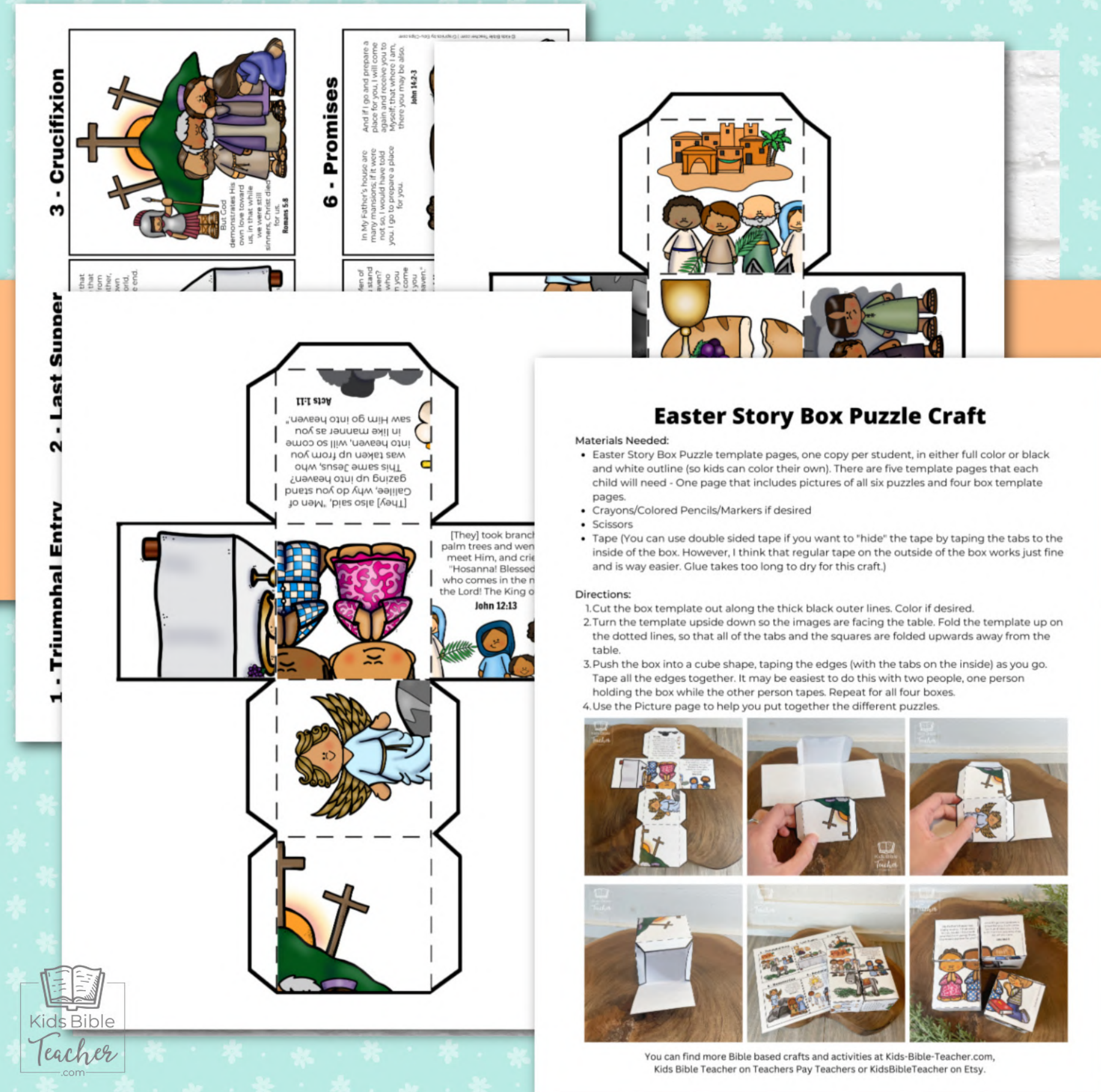
Help your kids learn the story of Jesus' Resurrection with these unique box puzzles - featuring six different puzzles on four boxes!

Easter Story Box Puzzle Craft

Materials Needed:

- Easter Story Box Puzzle template pages, one copy per student, in either full color or black and white outline (so kids can color their own). There are five template pages that each child will need - One page that includes pictures of all six puzzles and four box template pages.
- Crayons/Colored Pencils/Markers if desired
- Scissors
- Tape (You can use double sided tape if you want to "hide" the tape by taping the tabs to the inside of the box. However, I think that regular tape on the outside of the box works just fine and is way easier. Glue takes too long to dry for this craft.)

Directions:

1. Cut the box template out along the thick black outer lines. Color if desired.
2. Turn the template upside down so the images are facing the table. Fold the template up on the dotted lines, so that all of the tabs and the squares are folded upwards away from the table.
3. Push the box into a cube shape, taping the edges (with the tabs on the inside) as you go. Tape all the edges together. It may be easiest to do this with two people, one person holding the box while the other person tapes. Repeat for all four boxes.
4. Use the Picture page to help you put together the different puzzles.

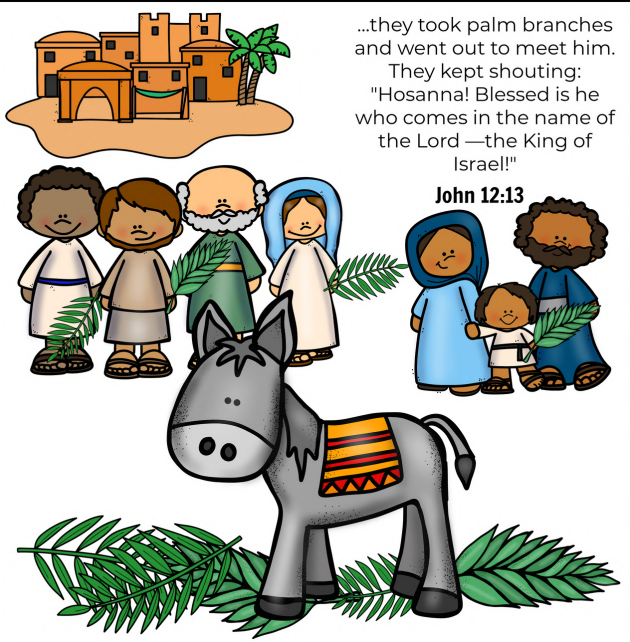

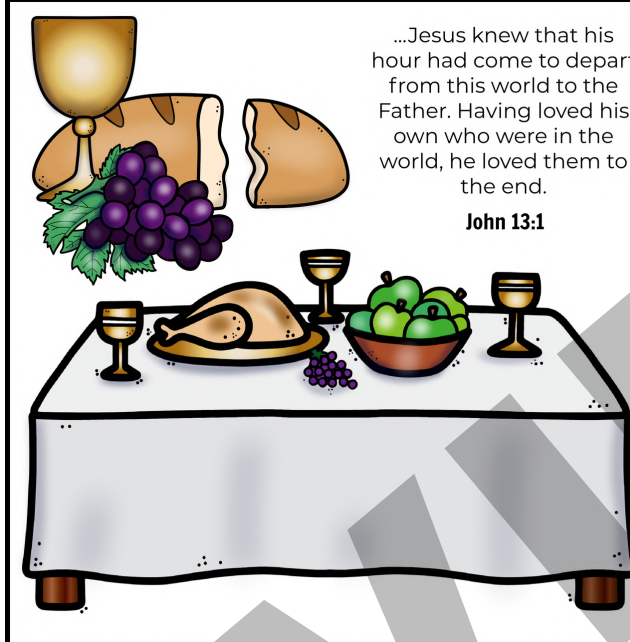
4 - Resurrection

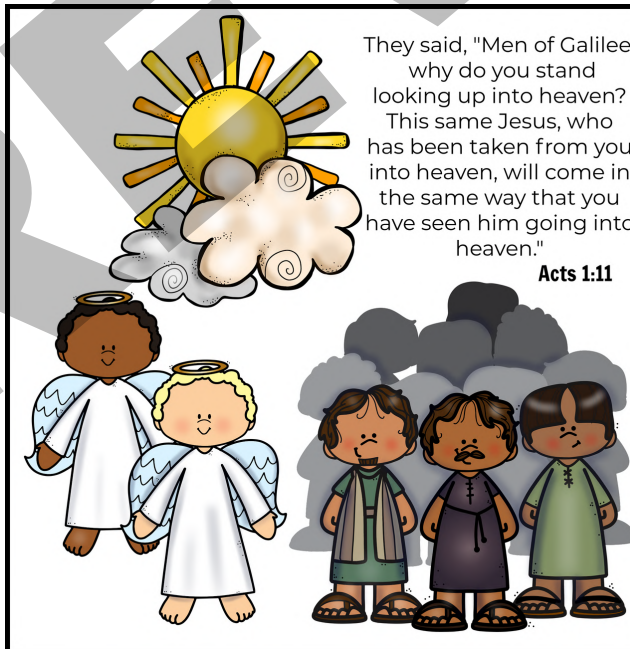
2 - Last Supper
