JESUS'DEATH & RESURRECTION MATCH GAME

Help your kids get familiar with the people and events surrounding Jesus' death and resurrection with this fun match game - perfect to play as a Bible lesson filler or anytime!


Who is this game for? This game is perfect for 1st graders through 4rth graders. It can be played with two or more people.


Game Preparation: Before playing, print and cut out the match cards. You may choose to print them out on cardstock or heavier copy paper (so the paper is not see-through). You can also laminate these cards so they will last for years to come.

Game Play: Turn the cards picture side down and mix them. Arrange them in columns and rows. Each player gets the chance to turn over two cards. If the *pictures* on the cards match (one card will have a name on it and one card will have a description on it), the player gets to keep that match and try again. If the cards don't match, the player turns those cards picture side down and replaces them in the spot where he found them. It is then the next player's turn.


Classroom Suggestion: If you are playing this game with a class and the cards are laminated, use masking tape and tape the cards so only the backs are showing to a dry erase or chalk board. This makes it easier for a large group of kids to see the cards. Call students one at a time to the front of the class to choose their cards.


OR, you could print a few sets of cards and have several different games going on at once. Store each set in a separate bag so the sets don't get mixed.






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
