Maybe Job's friends wanted to accuse Job of some secret sin so that they could rest assured that they would not have to suffer like Job. Maybe they were trying to defend God by saying that God would never allow good people to suffer like this. But, they were wrong. What happens to us here on earth is not a reflection of our goodness or badness nor is it a reflection of God's justice or power.
