

We began the fiscal year on solid financial footing, as we began to put COVID-19 behind us. Fall classes were robust, and we had several fundraisers planned for the first half of the fiscal year. Unfortunately, both our classes and fundraisers were disrupted by Hurricane lan, which hit Punta Gorda in late September. Ian caused delays and cancellations of classes and events, as well as damage to the facility, which led to a disappointing first half. In true VAC style, however, we picked ourselves up, dusted ourselves off, rolled up our sleeves and got on with business. Although we fell short of budget, our successful second half enabled us to finish the fiscal year in a positive net revenue position.

Despite the challenges posed by Ian, the VAC remains in a good financial position as it enters the next fiscal year. With continued support from its loyal members and patrons, the addition of a new classroom and promising fundraisers on the horizon, we are optimistic that the 2023-24 fiscal year will be a financial success.







Art Book Cozy Corner


