

Growing Tips



SUN

Pick a sunny spot with well-drained soil. Six or more hours of direct sun daily for health + blooms.



OWN ROOT

For hardy plants use "own root" roses, grown from a single variety cutting that develops its own root system.



PLANT DEEP

Plant grafted roses 2 in. deeper to ensure winter hardiness.



MULCH

Use fine-textured mulch such as shredded pine or leaf mulch to add nutrients to the soil as it breaks down.



WATER

Water the roots, not the leaves for even moisture and to minimize fugal problems.
Sprinklers are not recommended.



ROSE FOOD

Use Rose Food
Formula applied 3
times a season
starting in April
and ending by
August 1 st.

HYBRID TEA + GRANDIFLORA

Hybrid Tea (HT) is the traditional, long-stemmed cutting rose to display in a vase or floral arrangement. The flowers are large, usually produced one per stem.

Grandiflora (GR) is similar to a hybrid tea, but the flowers are produced in clusters on multi-branched stems. The plant tends to be tall (4-5') and lends itself to background use.





PINK HYBRID TEA+ GRANDIFLORA

- 1. ELIZABETH TAYLOR (HT). 5-6 ft. tall. Shocking deep pink double flower with smoky edges. Medium large flowers.
- 2. HEAVENLY SCENTED (HT). 4-6ft. tall. Very large classic hybrid tea that blooms salmon pink. Blooms late spring through fall. Flowers are 4-5" diameter. Spicy fruit fragrance.
- GEMINI (HT). This continual blooming rose produces constantly perfect pink and beautiful, massive, 5 1/2" blooms with a petal count of 25+. FR
- 4. MEMORIAL DAY (HT). Upright, bushy hybrid tea up to 4' tall. Clear pink with a lavender wash. Very large spiraled flowers, with a diameter up to 5". Thrives in heat. DR

 Height 3' tall. Medium large
 3.5"diameter flowers. Double, high centered. White with pink picotee. DR
- 6. MOONSTONE (HT). Unique soft cream with the finest edge of deeper pink, up to 5". Strong repeat bloom throughout the season. **DR**
- 7. NEW ZEALAND (HT). Pale pink flowers that can reach 6". Intense honeysuckle fragrance Deep green, glossy leaves. DR, FR
- 8. **PERFUME DELIGHT** (HT). Deep rose-pink buds open into large, fully double, 5" blooms with 32+ petals. Emits a strong, rose fragrance. **FR**
- 9. PRETTY LADY ROSE (HT). Beautiful even-pink color, the blooms reach 4-5" across. This is a compact grower and looks best toward the front of the garden bed.FR
- 10. QUEEN ELIZABETH (GR). Lovely pink flowers clustered on a sturdy, full bush with dark green glossy foliage. Mild tea rose fragrance. DR
- 11. TIFFANY (HT). Named for the American artisan family, this tall fragrant plant produces, large, high-centered, classic blooms of pink and yellow blend. **DR**

WHITE HYBRID TEA

- 12. CHANTILLY CREAM (HT). 4-5" cream colored classic blooms packed with 50-60 petals. Unsurpassed resistance to major rose diseases. **DR**
- HONOR (HT). Satiny white flowers with light fragrance, shade tolerant and disease resistant. DR
- 14. JOHN F KENNEDY (HT). Very large (5.5") high-centered glistening white flowers. Bloom in flushes from spring to early fall. **DR**
- 15. POPE JOHN PAUL II (HT). Pure white blossoms with over 45 petals blossoms. Glossy, disease resistant foliage. DR,FR
- 16. SUGAR MOON (HT). Pure white flowers on lengthy stems exude a powerful citrus and rose aroma. Good re-bloom and natural vigor. FR

RED HYBRID TEA + GRANDIFLORA

17. INK SPOTS (HT). Blackened, velvety red medium flowers. Super dark green foliage. Stands up to all types of weather. Size can shrink in heat.

HYBRID TEA (HT) + GRANDIFLORA (GR)

- 18. OLYMPIAD (HT). True red, prolific 4-6" diameter flowers that are excellent for cutting. Tall plant.
- 19. PROUD LAND (HT). Deep red blooms and strong tea fragrance to match. Large buds mature into very double, 5-7", massive blooms all season long.
- 20. VETERAN'S HONOR (HT). Flowers in continuous flushes of vivid red over a long season, from late spring to late fall. Medium-tall.

ORANGE HYBRID TEA + GRANDIFLORA

- 21. ARIZONA (GR). Perfect blooms with up to 40 petals in a blend of striking orange, bronze, and rich gold. A strong, upright bush with glossy, rich green leaves. **DR,FR**
- 22. FRAGRANT CLOUD (HT). Rich dark red oval buds open into high-centered double blooms of bright coral orange. Heady, luxuriant fragrance of sweet spice and rose. DR,FR
- 23. GOOD AS GOLD (HT). Orange-yellow blooms burst with a kiss of red on the petal edges. A powerhouse bloomer all season long. 5" in diameter blooms have 26-40 petals.

- **24. JUST JOEY** (*HT*). Height up to 4 ' tall. Petals are ruffled and flowers are a rich apricot, fading to buff orange.
- **25.** MARILYN MONROE (HT). Creamy apricot colored blooms open to a gown of deep green leaves. Does best in hot weather.
- 26. OVER THE MOON (HT). Height up to 4' tall. Upright, slightly spreading. Warm apricot, very large blooms. Classic double spiraled.

YELLOW HYBRID TEA + GRANDIFLORA

- 27. CH-CHING! (GR). Height 5-6 feet tall, Bright, clear, yellow, double, informal, large flowers up to 5" in diameter. Deep green leaves with red new shoots. **DR**
- 28. HOTEL CALIFORNIA (HT). Height 4'-6' tall. Even, clear, yellow, fully double, large, spiraled flowers. Best color and flower size in cooler temps. DR
- 29. RADIANT PERFUME (GR). 4-5", deep yellow blooms have a delicious lemony scent. Graceful form and long stems complete the picture. 4-5' tall. FR

30. ST. PATRICK (HR). The luck of the Irish brought a super slow-opening yellow rose that blooms best and brightest in the heat.

BI-COLOR HYBRID TEA + GRANDIFLORA

- 31. DICK CLARK (GR). Classically formed flowers are a luscious blend of cherry pink and cream. The cherry pink deepens to burgundy then dark red as the flower matures.
- 32. DOUBLE DELIGHT (HT).

 Spectacular creamy ivory flowers tinged with cherry red tips.

 Fascinating to watch, as the color changes each day. Strong spicy fragrance. FR
- 33. FRAGRANT PLUM (GR). Lavender flowers full of fragrance will be lighter in heat. Plant performs best in cooler temperatures. FR.
- 34. MAURICE UTRILLO (HT). Named for the French painter, Maurice Utrillo is an easy to grow rose with petals painted in splattered red, white, and yellow stripes. **DR**
- 35. NEIL DIAMOND (HT). Fragrant rose with pink and white striped flower coloration. Stands strong and upright. A true "diamond". DR

- 36. NEPTUNE (HT). Lavender, blushed purple on the edge of petals. Large 5" diameter flower, high centered. Best bloom size in cooler temps.
- 37. PARADE DAY (GR). Medium tall, upright & bushy, with medium large (3"-4") formal, spiral & double flowers. Fuchsia pink, striped with bright white. Strong citrus fragrance. FR
- **38. PEACE** (HT). Large, double, high-centered blooms open golden yellow edged with rose pink.
- 39. PERFUME FACTORY (HT). 42-66".
 Purple lavender blooms perfect for cutting. Upright, bushy plant. DR, FR
- 40. POP ART (GR). Height 20-60". This Grandiflora rose blooms late spring until fall. Full flowers with 4-5" diameter. Flowers are pastel pink with deep yellow stripes. Moderately fruity scent. Very disease resistant. DR, FR
- 41. ROCK & ROLL (GR). Creamy buds that open to stripes and splotches of red, burgundy and white. Flowers are large, 4-6" diameter. **DR**, **FR**

MINIATURE

Miniature roses have been bred to stay under three feet tall while still putting out clusters of colorful blooms. This makes them ideal additions to rock gardens, tight border spots, the edges of rose gardens and patio or porch container gardens.





- 42. MINI LEMON SUNBLAZE. Soft yellow, fading to cream-white flowers contrast dark green, glossy foliage. Blooms continuously spring through fall. Fade-resistant petals.
- 43. MINI PINK SUNBLAZE. This deep pink rose with a light pink color spread throughout making it a great rose for a garden or a container. Blooms throughout the season. **DR**

44. MINI RAINBOW SUNBLAZE.

Small buds that have a bright yellow cast with red undertones, transforming into stunning orange red when open. This vigorous and bushy plant is perfect for containers, walkways and mixed borders. **DR**

They are the epitome of sophistication, adding a touch of class and romance to any garden or landscape.

- 45. AMERICA. Climbs to 12' tall. Coral pink buds, exudes spicy fragrance. Late to flower in spring. DR, FR
- 46. BLAZE. Climbs to 12' tall. Semidouble scarlet red flowers. Flowers heavily in early summer and again in late summer. DR, SH
- 47. CECILE BRUNNER. Great
 Heritage rose, from 1894. Light
 fragrance, will tolerate some
 light shade. Properly a climbing
 polyantha.
- 48. DUBLIN BAY. Climbs to 12' tall.
 True red flowers open in cool weather.
 Heat tolerant. Lots of deep green
 leaves. Can be trained as a pillar.
- 49. GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY. Each 3.5-4" flower head contains 35-45 petals and gives off a deliciously fruity scent that attracts pollinators. Heights of over 10' tall. FR
- 50. ICEBERG. Fully double blooms are borne in appealing clusters. Light, sweet fragrance makes for excellent cut flowers.

- 51. JOSEPH'S COAT. 4" blooms are fragrant and will attract pollinators. This ever-changing climbing rose bush features a kaleidoscope effect of bright red buds tinged with coral that open to reveal stunning blooms of gold.
- 52. PEARLY GATES. Grows 8'-12' tall. Pure, pastel, pink, big gorgeous flowers with sweet spicy fragrance. Late bloom in spring. FR
- 53. ROYAL GOLD. Grows 8-10' tall.
 Rich, deep, yellow blooms, with cutting length stems. Best color & size when cooler.
- 54. SALLY HOLMES. A vigorous, heat and cold hardy beauty that is sure to be a dominant presence in the garden. From late spring to mid fall she produces hydrangea-like clusters of white flowers flushed in soft-pink shades that open from apricot colored buds. DR
- 55. WHITE DAWN. Climbs to 12' tall. Loads of bright white flowers. Flowers in early summer and again in late summer. DR, FR







FLORIBUNDA

These roses are prized for their prolific blooms and easy care, making them ideal for both novice and experienced gardeners. A cross between hybrid teas and polyanthas, floribunda produce clusters of blooms – in a wide range of colors – at a smaller scale than grandiflora. A truly stunning addition to any garden.





- 58. BOLERO. 3" Pure white flowers, 100+ petals, very strong fragrance, glossy dark green foliage.
- 59. CHINA DOLL. Petite pink petals of this beautiful rose make a sophisticated statement in the garden. This Floribunda does not like cold weather.
- 60. COLORIFIC. 4-4.5' tall with big pointed buds that swirl open to shades of peach, coral & salmon. As the sun "tans" flowers, petals blush into deeper tones of orange, scarlet & burgundy. Great addition to the cutting garden. **DR**
- 61. DROP DEAD RED. Jaw-droppingly delicious red blooms, set against highly-glossed deep green leaves. Best flower size in cooler conditions. DR
- 62. EASY DOES IT. Free-flowing swirling shades of sunset show up in fragrant large colorful clusters atop a rounded bushy plant. DR

- 63. EASY GOING. Peachy golden yellow color that holds to the very end. Consistent in every climate. Great in mass plantings. **DR**
- 64. EASY SPIRIT. Naturally disease resistant with large white flowers. DR

- 66. EBB TIDE. Height 2-3' tall. Dusky deep purple buds open to double old fashioned flowers of velvet plum, washed with a haze of sultry smoke. Intensive clove fragrance and deep green foliage. FR
- 67. FRIDA KAHLO. Medium height, upright & bushy. Flowers are scarlet red, striped gold with red blush on finish. Swirls of color intensify as the flower ages. FR
- **68. ICEBERG.** This floribunda rose reaches 4' tall with broad, white flowers. **DR FR, SH**
- 69. JULIA CHILD. A floribunda worthy of its namesake. Clusters of full, buttery gold flowers emit a delicious licorice and spice fragrance. Hardy and floriferous in all weather. 4-5' tall, 3' wide. FR

- 70. JUMP FOR JOY. Height 32 43". Peachy-pink color. Large showy clusters of long lived flowers. Round bushy and super flowerful. Loads of glossy green leaves.
- 71. LIFE OF THE PARTY. Powerful fragrance of fruit and citrus coming from her old-fashioned, 3- 3½" blooms of soft yellow that finish with a kiss of pink on the petal edges. FR
- 72. LIVIN EASY. Clouds of bright and bold orange decorate a continually blooming plant. Her semi-double 3 ½" blooms have 25-30 petals with a clove and spicy fragrance. FR

73. QUEEN OF ELEGANCE.

Non-fading blooms of mauve to medium pink. Double, 3.5" flowers. Blooms in flushes throughout the season and fills the garden with the fragrance of old roses. **FR**

74. SHOWBIZ. Hardy clusters of vivid red bloom all season. Lightly scented flower-heads attract pollinators. Long-lived flowers spiral out from an abundance of lovely, pointed buds. DR

 cool. More white when warm. FR







OWN ROOT ROSES

Own Root roses are a unique type of rose that grow on their own rootstock, providing numerous benefits. Unlike grafted roses, they are naturally disease resistant and hardy.





78. BLANC DOUBLE DE COUBERT.

Hybrid rugosa shrub rose. Grows to 5-7' tall and as wide. Features strongly fragrant, pure white, 2-3" diameter, semi-double flowers which bloom throughout the summer and into fall. **DR**

- 79. EASY ON THE EYES. 3 3.5" flowers are peachy-pink with red eyes that change to lavender with purple eyes, creating a novel floral display of complementary colors. DR FR
- 80. FOREVER & EVER PINK. Flowers are delicately ruffled, single medium pink blooms in huge clusters. A light tea scent accents the clusters and makes it wonderfully inviting for pollinators. Ideal for mass plantings and borders. DR FR
- 81. HANSA. Rugosa shrub rose with height up to 7 feet. Vibrant violet red, large full flower. Very hardy. Red hips in fall so avoid chemicals. FR

- 83. OUTTA THE BLUE. Upright, sightly rounded and bushy. Magenta, blended with yellow that age to many shades of blue lavender. Medium, full, old fashioned flowers in clusters. Sweet spicy scent. Very hardy and disease resistant. DR, FR, SH
- 84. ORANGES N LEMONS. Height 30" 10'. Brilliant orange, striped yellow. Full medium size flowers. Mahogany red new foliage maturing to a very deep green. More blooms in cool weather. FR
- 85. PILLOW FIGHT. 2' Tall shrub rose. Bright white, full cluster small flowers. Very deep glossy green foliage. Fragrant flowers.
- 86. TAKE IT EASY. 2' Tall shrub rose.
 Bright white, full cluster small flowers.
 Very deep glossy green foliage.
 Fragrant flowers.

- 87. THERESE BUGNET. An extremely hardy and disease resistant shrub. Beautiful, loosely double, rich pink flowers of Old Rose character. DR, FR
- 88. TOP GUN. Top Gun is the "best" and a must for any garden. The rounded, bushy plant produces vigorous stems ending in clusters of long-lasting, dark red flowers. Outstanding disease resistance. **DR**

DAVID AUSTIN

Hybridized by Englishman David Austin, these shrub roses are well-known for their deeply cupped, heavily petaled flowers with rich, complex fragrances. Those with longer canes may be grown as climbing roses. We expect the following varieties in late April.





104. CROWN PRINCESS MARGARTA.

A vigorous climber, bearing quite large, many petaled, neat rosette flowers in a lovely shade of apricotorange. They have a medium-strong Tea fragrance. *Climbing Rose*

105. DESDEMONA. Peachy pink buds open to beautiful, white, chalice-shaped blooms, with a pinkish hue. FR

106. EMILY BRONTE. Each bloom is a lovely soft pink, the smaller central petals deepening to rich apricot and surrounding deep-set stamens. Strong tea scent. DR, FR

107. GABRIEL OAK. Striking shade of deep pink, the outer petals of each bloom paling slightly over time. The beauty of the blooms is enhanced by a wonderful, strong fruity fragrance.

108. GERTRUDE JEKYLL. One of the first English Roses to start flowering, its perfect scrolled buds open to large, rosette-shaped flowers of bright glowing pink.

109. OLIVIA ROSE AUSTIN. Beautiful, cupped rosettes of an even, mid pink coloring. Light to medium fruity fragrance. Flowers early in the season and continues into the fall.

110. PRINCESS ALEX OF KENT.

Unusually large, bright pink flowers are full-petaled and deeply cupped. Strong tea fragrance. *FR*

- 111. RONALD DAHL. Soft orange-red buds open to medium-sized, cupped rosettes of perfect apricot coloring. Extremely robust and have a lovely fruity Tea scent. DR, FR
- 112. STRAWBERRY HILL. Beautiful at all stages, bearing small clusters of large, mid pink, cupped rosettes. FR Climbing Rose
- 113. TEASING GEORGIA. The rosette blooms are a rich shade of yellow, the outer petals fade to pale yellow, providing a most pleasing two-tone effect. Strong tea rose scent. FR, Climbing Rose

114. TESS OF THE D'UBERVILLES.

Large, bright crimson-red blooms, with a pleasing Old Rose fragrance. It is a relatively compact climber clothed in large, dark green leaves. *Climbing Rose*

115. THE GENEROUS GARDENER.

Beautifully formed flowers. When the petals open they expose numerous stamens, providing an almost water lily-like effect. The flowers are a pale glowing pink. *Climbing Rose*

- 116. THE POET'S WIFE. Rich yellow flowers, which pale over time. Their formation is most pleasing, having a neat outer ring of petals enclosing an informal group of petals within. FR
- 117. WOLLERTON OLD HALL. Fragrant climber. The buds have flashes of red, open to beautifully rounded, blooms of pale apricot, eventually paling to cream. FR, Climbing Rose

PLANTING + CARE



SITE SELECTION

Select a site that provides plenty of air circulation, good soil drainage, and ideally, at least 6 hours of direct sun daily.



PREPARATION

Dig the soil to a depth of 18" and mix in organic matter such as Chalet Leaf Mulch, cotton burr compost or dehydrated manure. The ratio should be 1 part organic matter to 3 parts soil. This is also a good time to mix in a starter food with beneficial soil microbes.



PLANT SPACING

Roses should be spaced 24 to 30" apart or more.



GRAFTED ROSES

If grafted, the depth should be that when the root ball is set in the hole, the graft union (the knobby growth between the branches and the roots) is 1 to 2" below ground level. This is important in our climate to increase winter hardiness.



OWN ROOT ROSES

If the rose is own root, the rose should be planted with the top of the root ball level with the soil surface.

PLANTING + CARE



WATERING

Water the roots, not the leaves. Roses like even moisture, so if there is no rain, water 3 times per week. To minimize the chance of fungal problems, it's best to water roses in the morning and at the base only. Overhead sprinklers are not advised.



PRUNING

Roses are flowering woody shrubs. They bloom the best on new wood (stems that are produced in the current growing season). The first pruning of the year should be around April 15th. Hybrid-Teas, Floribundas, Grandifloras should all be pruned to 12 to 18 inches from the ground, removing stems growing into the center of the shrub. The goal is to leave 3-5 stems that form an open vase shape. The goal is to force the roots to make new stems. You are managing "your crop" by pruning.

The second type of pruning is after the first flush of flowers. By removing the spent flowers, new flowers are made. Prune down the stem below the flower(s) above a leaf that has 5 leaflets. The adventitious bud that forms at that node will produce flowers. If cutting at a 3 leaflet node only vegetative growth will form. Shrub roses should be pruned like other flowering shrubs (Viburnums & Lilacs). Every 3 years cut the length of the branches down by 1/3 and cut 1/3 of the oldest stems to the ground. This is known as the "Rule of 3" pruning of shrubs.



WINTER PROTECTION

It is best to wait until the soil has frozen (end of November). Start with a Fall pruning - cutting the longest branches to 3 feet from the ground to prevent them from whipping around in the winter winds and breaking the feeder roots. Use Rose Collars to surround the crown of the plant where the stems emerge from the ground. Fill the 6-8 inches from the ground to the top of the collar with top soil. After it freezes, cove with leaf mulch or bark mulch to hide the white rose collar. After April 15, move the mulch away, remove the collar and wash the topsoil away from the stems. Then proceed with the Spring pruning.

 first in April after pruning or planting.
 Apply fertilizer again after the first flush of
 blooms and lastly at the end of July.
