
- · Water can be supplied to the system using a pump or mains water.

- The Rainmaker can be mounted on the gutters, a star post, our bracket, or simply hung on a fence


Our systems will reduce the theoretical Bushfire Attack Level of your home, increasing the prospect of your home surviving a direct flame or ember attack.
