### Lets remember Sharpville Massacre

Human Rights Day (21 March) was officially declared a public holiday in 1994 following the inauguration of former president Nelson Mandela. This national day-off is both a stark reminder of the tragic Sharpeville massacre and a celebration of South Africa's unique constitution, which gives equal rights to all. On March 21 in 1960 police opened fire, without order, on a crowd that had gathered at the Sharpeville station to protest pass laws, stipulations that required Africans to carry pass books and produce them for law enforcement officials on request; 69 unarmed people were killed and another 180 were injured. The *Tshwane Sun* calls on our readers to take a moment of silence on Human Rights Day to remember those who have passed away.

## Taxi driver shot dead at Phomolong informal settlement

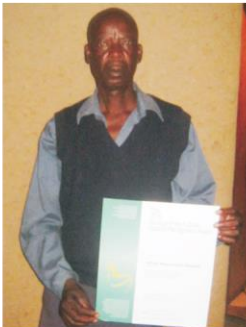
A 28 year old man, believed to be a taxi driver was shot three times and killed at Maunde Street near Phomolong informal settlement on 13 February. A resident who preferred to remain anonymous told the *Tshwane Sun* that the taxi driver allegedly forced passengers to use his taxi. Three men, travelling in a Toyota conquest found the taxi driver standing on the pavement, shot him three times and then fled the scene. Residents said that this is

not the first incident in which a taxi driver was killed. In 2015, a taxi marshal was gunned down on this very same street. Atteridgeville Police Spokesperson, Captain Thomas Mufumadi, confirmed that a murder docket had been opened and that his department was still busy with investigations. No arrests have been made. The Atteridgeville / Saulsville Taxi Association declined to comment on the incident.

## Former NECSA worker takes the anti-nuclear fight to Turkey

Alfred Sapepe, a former worker and spokesperson of the South African Nuclear Energy Corporation (NECSA) will be heading off to Turkey in March 2017 where he will be representing his former co-workers. He plans to meet with other

like-minded people (people who are against nuclear programmes). Sapepe is fighting for the rights of former workers of NECSA and he is demanding compensation for workers who allegedly contracted diseases whilst in the employ of NECSA. These workers from Atteridgeville and Saulsville allegedly suffer from a range of illnesses, including, but not limited to: stomach cancer and kidney diseases. Some workers have already passed away as a result of these ailments. Many of those who passed away were in the middle of fighting NECSA for compensation. Sapepe claimed to have been awarded with a Nuclear-free-Future war from an anti-nuclear organization in November 2016, for the work he was done so far. His message to workers is that they should not allow themselves to be misled by people in their fight for compensation. He added that he is still waiting for feedback from the office of the public protector about this matter. And that is also awaiting feedback from the doctors who examined the former workers, as instructed by the public protector, to prove that the illnesses were contracted while working for NECSA. ## Foreigner's shops looted in Atteridgeville

Foreign-owned spaza shops in Atteridgeville and Pretoria West were looted on Monday night, February 20, at around 10pm. Atteridgeville Police spokesperson, Captain Thomas Mufumadi said that more than 10 shops, belonging to foreigners, were looted by the residents of Atteridgeville and Saulsville. The reasons for of such chaos is still unknown. Captain Mufumadi was unable to confirm the finer details but described the situation as 'serious'.

"The police have opened cases of burglary and robbery. We have not arrested anyone in this regard as we are still investigating," explained Mufumadi. In a separate incident, community members looted stores and torched the homes of suspected drug dealers and brothels on Saturday, February 18, in Pretoria West. The perpetrators are suspected to have come from Atteridgeville. According to Captain Mufumadi, no arrests have been made yet.

## Illegal mental home-ex MMC cashes in?



An ANC councillor in Tshwane, and former MMC for Sports and Recreation, is believed to be under investigation for fraud and neglect of mentally ill patients. Recently, South Africans received shocking news that at least one hundred mentally ill patients had died after their sudden transfer from Gauteng's Life Esidimeni Health Centre, to 27 NGOs who were not licensed and did not have the proper facilities to cater for these patients. The DA has accused councillor Nozipho Makeke and others who are involved in running a home for domestic violence victims, for unlawfully taking on more than one hundred mentally ill patients despite the home having no license, experience or facilities for mentally ill patients. Furthermore, the home is believed to have received payment of about R270 000 per month for the patients it was supposed to professionally take care of. Councillor Nozipho is well-known in Atteridgeville circles and has, on many occasions, whilst serving as MMC, addressed the community on various issues.

# Protesting residents leave commuters stranded



On February 24, commuters were left stranded when residents of the Atteridgeville informal settlement unleashed their anger through protesting. Maude Street was barricaded with stones and burning tyres with protesters saying they wanted to put an end to the growth of foreign-owned businesses. Several foreigners closed their shops and fled Atteridgeville fearing for their safety and that of their establishments. The violence spread to other areas such as Marabastad. On the night of February 20, several shops belonging to foreigners were looted by residents of Atteridgeville. The alleged xenophobic attacks erupted in Pretoria West on February 18, after several shops and houses of foreigners, which were believed to be brothels, were torched by enraged residents.

A resident from the Jeffsville informal settlement who wished to remain anonymous, told the *Tshwane Sun* that residents were sick and tired of foreigners in their area. He said that the government is not doing anything to address the issue of foreigners in the country who take their business opportunities. "Some of these foreigners, especially Nigerians, are selling drugs and turning our women into prostitutes. Many brothels in South Africa are owned by foreigners... many Nigerians are also behind several human trafficking cases," concluded the resident furiously. He added that some foreigners are entering the country illegally; he then described certain officials from home affairs as unscrupulous. Another resident from Atteridgeville, Jason Letsoalo said that the people of South

Africa are lazy and not business-minded, thus they are jealous of hard-working foreigners. "The people who loot foreign-owned shops are criminals who exploit the situation and tarnish the image of our country," he concluded. Atteridgeville Police spokesperson, Captain Thomas Mufumadi said that the police have arrested three people who were trying to loot a foreign-owned shop, adjacent to the police station. The suspects will be charged with public violence and attempted burglary and are soon to appear in court.

# Cable theft rife in Atteridgeville

Medupi Selota of Sithole Street, has urged his fellow residents of Atteridgeville and Sausville to be vigilant; especially at night & the early hours of the morning since there are criminals on the prowl for electricity cables.

Selota told the *Tshwane Sun* that the cable theft incident which occurred earlier this month at about 3am, was in fact the third incident on his street thus far. He relayed the shock of the residents when they had awoken to find that the cables were stolen. He then described the thieves as heartless since they have no consideration for others. He further mentioned that several cases have been opened in this regard and implores the Atteridgeville Police to take these crimes more seriously. As a result of these thefts, the council loses money whilst these cable thieves continue to benefit. Selota continued to say, "Our area is not the only one being affected by such crimes, there are other areas around Tshwane which are inundated with these problems. The police will have to patrol our streets at night to help us apprehend these greedy

criminals. Life without electricity is difficult and the council officials take time to replace our cables. Sometimes we spend days without electricity". When the *Tshwane Sun* contacted spokesperson for the Atteridgeville Police, Captain Thomas Mufumadi, he said if the residents have opened a case the police would investigate

# Chaos on the roads

Motorists have lashed out at the Atteridgeville Bus Services to improve the state of their buses as they claim that unroadworthy buses cause unnecessary traffic congestions and risks the lives of commuters. A motorist from Atteridgeville, Petrus Mascemola told the *Tshwane Sun* that the bus drivers have no consideration either for the rules of the roads or for other motorists for that matter. Petrus said that those drivers are complacent because action is not taken to reprimand them when complaints are made to their companies. There have been incidents when the buses broke down in transit, due to mechanical problems, thus proving the unsatisfactory roadworthiness. "There was an incident where a bus driver failed to apply brakes and rammed into my car from the back. How could they allow the bus back on the roads... they are putting the lives of many commuters at risk," he fumed. Another motorist, who wished to remain anonymous, complained that ticket fares were exorbitant, yet the condition of the buses is not up to standard. The bus services have to ensure that their vehicles are well maintained because they are getting paid for their services. When the *Tshwane Sun* contacted the Atteridgeville Bus Services for comment, our calls went unanswered.

The ARP was launched in late 2016 and is a partnership between the City of Tshwane and New GX Enviro, a black owned, managed and controlled waste management company. The composting section of the facility was successfully piloted during October 2016 and since then has allowed 10,018 tons of shredded garden waste to be diverted from being buried in landfills. The composting of garden waste allows the City and its residents to reduce their carbon footprint and assist in the fight against global warming. (Classes on how to do your own composting at home will be given at the open day.) This is because when garden waste decomposes in the absence of oxygen (as happens in a landfill site) it produces methane which has a Global Warming Potential 28 – 36 times that of carbon dioxide over 100 years, whereas when

garden waste is composted aerobically (i.e. in the presence of oxygen) it produces mainly carbon dioxide and heat.

Compost is the single most important supplement for soil. Composting is a simple way to add nutrient-rich humus which fuels plant growth and restores vitality to depleted soil. It is a completely natural and safe process. It's easy to make, is good for the environment and will cause no harm to residents in the area as it doesn't need or use any chemicals. Bulk compost is used at homes, businesses and schools for gardening, landscaping, horticulture and agriculture. Compost improves the ability of the soil to retain water and acts as a natural pesticide, in turn reducing the need for chemical fertilisers. It introduces beneficial organisms into the soil, aerates the soil, breaks down organic material for plant use and aids in warding off plant disease.

Residents in the area have been in contact with the City of Tshwane regarding their queries and concerns about the composting process. The City of Tshwane and New GX Enviro are currently engaging with these residents to ensure that appropriate measures are put in place to minimise any nuisances that the ARP may cause.

The ARP represents a significant township economy, industrialisation and revitalisation initiative bringing jobs and SMME development opportunities to Atteridgeville.

Currently the ARP employs 75 residents from Atteridgeville and this number will increase significantly as the volumes of garden waste and other recyclable waste processed at the facility increase. Please do your part in helping the City of Tshwane improve service levels, create jobs and save the environment by recycling.

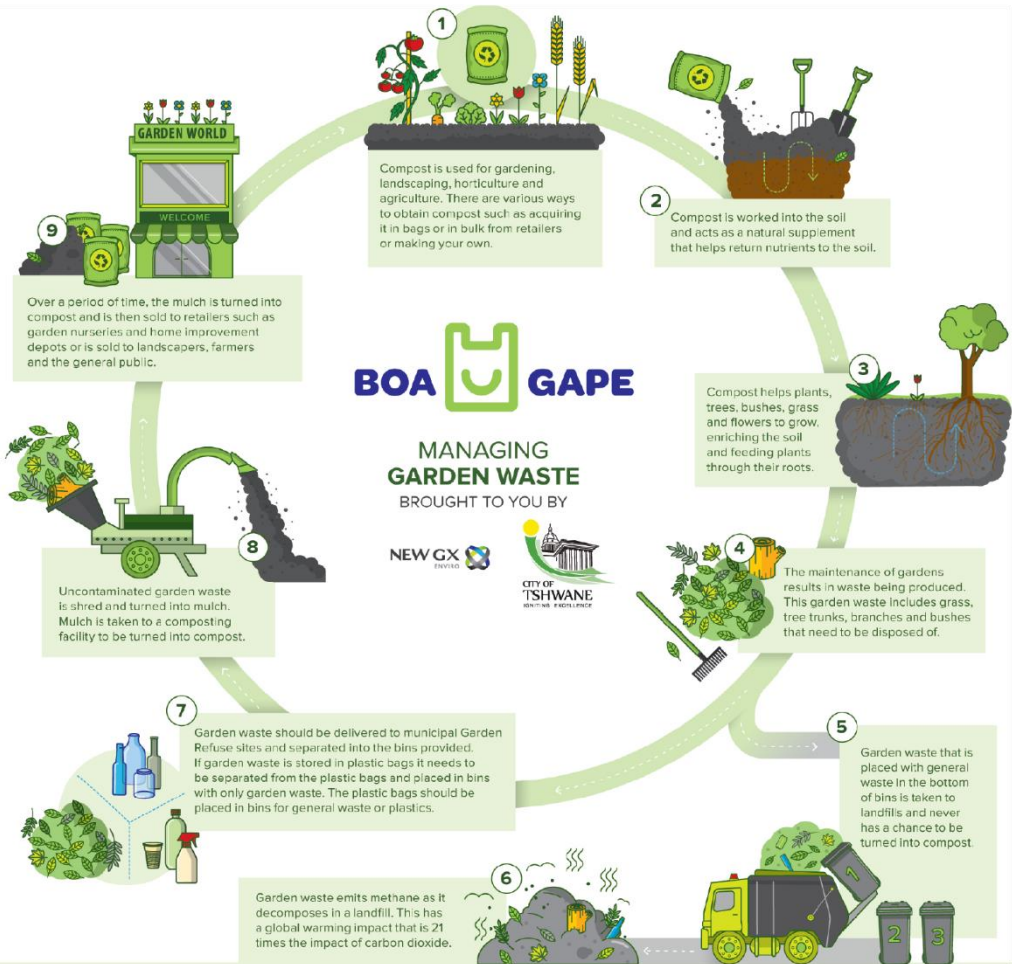

## SMS campaign changes lives of drug addicts

Aga Sechaba Community Project would like to thank the residents who donated money towards their SMS Campaign as they have managed to send three drug addicts to rehabilitation centres.


Lethogonolo Letsolo, founder of Aga Sechaba Community Project told the *Tshwane Sun* that they launched an SMS Campaign to encourage residents, who are concerned about drugs, to donate R10 to help drug addicts get rehabilitated. They managed to raise R90 000 to send 3 drug addicts, living in the areas of Atteridgeville and Saulsville, to a rehab centre.

"The rehabilitated addicts are now employed, hence doing something positive with their lives. The donations also helped with the to purchase of 3 lap tops for community projects. We would like to thank our community newspaper, the *Tshwane Sun*, for the stories which were published regarding our SMS Campaign. It encouraged residents to fight the scourge of drug abuse in our community. It costs about R40 000 for rehabilitation and most parents cannot afford to pay such a hefty amount for rehab," said Letsolo.

Aga Sechaba Community Project is affiliated with the Atteridgeville Local Drug Action Forum and has another branch at Seshego in Limpopo. This non-profit organization was founded in 2010. It is registered with the Department of Social Development.

Our vision, as an organization, is to ensure a drug-free society and maintain healthy lifestyles.

"Our mission is to also educate community members, especially the youth about the repercussions of substance use and abuse. We want to propagate awareness and offer skills development to school drop-outs, unemployed youth and drug addicts... in short, to provide access to rehabilitation and treatment services. We are planning to launch another SMS Campaign for youth development to help disadvantaged youth improve their lives. We will provide the SMS number and details in the near future," concluded Letsolo.

It made sense for us to help them by assisting with the technical aspect for those young people who want to specialise in printing and embroidery. Whilst we are working with big organisations and companies, it gives us

pleasure to partner with and give back to the community," said Baloyi. Another businessman, Dickson Jumah Ukoleko, owner of a dressmaking and design company, Dickson Enterprise and Manufacture, also commented on the partnership with excitement, "I have been partnering with organisations to help develop local talent but our partnerships have hit rock bottom. I believe this partnership will bear fruit as the nature of it is beneficial to everyone." Owner of Refiloe's Hair and Beauty Salon, Refiloe Lesufi, who was also a beneficiary and facilitator of Rearabilwe was also excited at the partnership. "I've come a long way with Rearabilwe, I was a student and then appointed as a facilitator and now they are mentoring me in my own business. What better way of giving back to my community than partnering with them and helping my community out? I hope to make changes in the lives many in my community" she enthused. Charles Malatie said "We still welcome local people, who are willing to improve the lives of our youth, to contact our offices so that we can chat. Challenges of substance abuse, especially Nyaope can never be solved by one person or one organisation alone. We need to build a united front with everyone including local drug-action committees, NGO's and the

government. Our offices are open to all. Even our ex-users whom we helped to turn around their lives are also contributing to this programme."

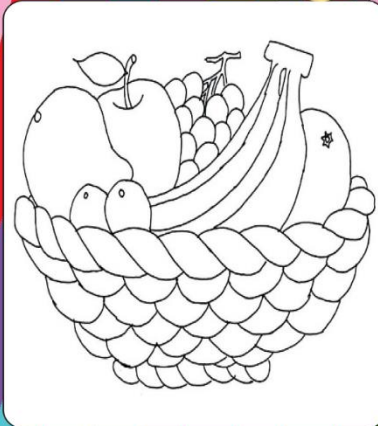
