# Rapist father took daughter for family planning

A teenager (15) told the police how her father used to rape her every morning before she went to school, when her mother was not home. The abuse started while the girl was only 13, she said.

According to Tshwane North Police Cluster spokesperson, Constable Herman Moremi, when the abusive father (whose identity cannot be revealed to protect the identity of the victim) was arrested early last year, he claimed that he had discussed and reached an agreement with his wife

that he would entertain the teenager sexually since she had started dating boys and in doing so they hoped that she would forget the other boys. Moremi said; "The matter came to light after the victim told a teacher at school that her father raped her every morning before she left for school when her mother was not present. She further revealed that her father had taken her to a family planning clinic to put her on contraceptives so that he could rape her without any fear of

impregnating her. When the matter was reported to the police, the man was arrested. He pleaded guilty to the rape charge. He will remain in jail until his next court appearance. The 45-year-old father from Hammanskraal, North of Tshwane to appeared at the Moretele Regional Court on March 13, whereafter the matter was postponed to May 29 because the CCTV cameras which were to be used to allow the teenager to testify were not working. Moremi added; "We hope that our

justice system will take its course and send a serious message to those who abuse children. We also appeal to the whole community at large to blow the whistle on any suspicious activity by reporting it at the nearest police station. We also advise learners to be open to their teachers if they experience abuse of any sort." Attempts by the Tshwane Sun team to get comments from the victim's mother were fruitless.

#### The body of a young man (25) from Ratjiepan Village was found with gunshot wounds near a bus stop, on March 5.

Tshwane North Police Cluster spokesperson, Constable Herman Moremi said that it appeared that the killer tried to clean up evidence from

The deceased was shot several times in the upper body. There were more than two bullet wounds on the body but only two cartridges were found which leads us to believe that the killer had picked up of the rest of the cartridges," said Moremi

The dead man has been positively identified but the family has asked the media to withhold his name until all his next of kin have been informed. The family told the Tshwane Sun that,

when the deceased left home that night he said he was going to meet with somebody at the bus stop regarding work issues. However, he never returned and his lifeless body was found near the very same bus stop the next morning.

Constable Herman Moremi, added that nearby residents had confirmed that



gunshots were heard around 10pm on March 4 but they were too scared to go out to investigate. The next morning, when curious residents went to check the area where the gunshots seemed to emanate from, they found the bulletridden body. The police were then alerted. The motive behind the killing is currently unknown and an investigation is underway.

Constable Moremi pleaded with the public, "We appeal to anyone with any information to contact the nearest police station or Crime Stop on 0800010111.3



Academy Spokesperson Calvin Maluleke further commented, "We are confident that the hidden talents of our youth will finally be exposed and this will boost the image of our country in terms of sports. South Africa is not performing very well in sport, so we plan to groom young people to take South African sports to the next level."

Calvin also explained that a serious challenge being experienced by the academy is the lack of sponsors. He urged businesses and individuals alike to support the academy financially so that South Africa as a country can get a boost, in terms of the talent that will be available for sports.

## **Mother Elizabeth** - Mother of Kasi Netball

Some time ago, Mama Elizabeth Nyofane made a vow to herself that she would help youngsters beat addiction. Today she is proud that she kept her promise in a round about way, by ensuring that countless young women focused on sports instead of substance

Mama Elizabeth told the Tshwane Sun how, during 2004, she used to work as a caretaker for a local netball team that later fell apart.

However, life is very different for her now as she manages three netball teams (under-13 side, under-15, under-17 sides) and all three teams are performing very well since its formation

She reminisced that it all started when some of the netball players approached her at home, begging her to teach them netball. Their enthusiasm moved her to help them and they are now part of her teams.

"When I started out, I must admit that I was really taking a chance but I believe that nothing is impossible in life, if I persevere. It took a lot of sacrifice, dedication and hard work but I succeeded in making these children's dreams come true. I myself was astounded that it took me less than three months to learn about the rules of the sport from other netball trainers," she confided.

Currently, Mama Elizabeth is training more than 40 youngsters in the game of netball, and they practise at a local soccer ground.

She told the Tshwane Sun that she had never imagined that one day she would be managing a netball team let alone coaching three! Her teams have been in existence for 13 years now!

"I now believe that these youngsters are angels sent by God. And I am happy to have been given such a great opportunity by these youngsters! They needed an adult to lead them and, I

am glad they trusted me to be this person. I did not want to disappoint them, so I set out to learn everything I could about the sport," She enthusiastically clarified. Today, Mama Elizabeth's teams are proud that they have won a number of tournaments held around the Tshwane townships.
