

Land Acknowledgement

We are currently standing on the unceded and occupied territory of the Ramaytush Ohlone (Lisjan), the past, present and future custodians of the land of this park and city. We invoke with hope that their connection to the land and wisdom can help forge a path toward justice and healing.

We also acknowledge at the outset of this exhibition that some countercultural movements of the 1960s and 1970s appropriated imagery, sacred paraphernalia, terminology, and costumes from the Native peoples of North America. While some of these acts were committed from a desire to do reverence or in solidarity with Native peoples, we understand the practice of appropriation and its consequences differently today.

As part of our reckoning with the visual history of San Francisco's countercultural movements, we have chosen to show these images, and welcome all feedback on how to continue reckoning with the both the legacies and present realities of displacement and violence.





Mari Tepper

One of the most iconic artists of the San Francisco poster scene of the 1960s, Mari Bianca Tepper worked for Bill Graham and many important concert venues in the city. A strong proponent of women's rights, sustainable living, and mental healthcare, Tepper has made art that contributed to the cultural discourse as well as serving as an activist and organizer around these issues. She has lived and worked in California and New Mexico, and has illustrated album covers, books, and posters for decades.



Bonnie MacLean

Bonnie MacLean was a central figure in the development of the iconic poster style of the San Francisco counterculture. Born in Philadelphia in 1939, she moved to San Francisco in 1963, when she met Bill Graham. After Graham and Wes Wilson had a falling out, MacLean effectively replaced him as one of the key artists for the BG poster series. MacLean and Graham married in 1967 and divorced in 1975. A life-long learner and artist, MacLean passed away in 2020.
