A1 Product Description


The EK series is an outdoor cooking woodfire with the ability to seamlessly transform from a cooking appliance into a fireplace for entertainment. It is designed for outdoor use ONLY.

A2 Product Dimensions

The EK series consists of three different sizes of fireplace: the EK950, the EK1250, and the EK1550. Dimensions for each fireplace can be found on the next pages.



C1 Minimum Requirements of the Cavity

This appliance is designed for outdoor use ONLY.


When the appliance forms part of a building, or is installed attached to the building, then the entire appliance must be fully enclosed in concrete material (concrete block and/or poured concrete) of 140mm thickness or greater.

Cladding over the concrete cavity can consist of any heat resistant material.

When the appliance is installed in a remote, freestanding structure that is not attached to or encompassed within the envelope of the building and is at least 2000mm from any combustible material in any direction, then the enclosure may be constructed from any heat resistant material. If any combustible material is within 2000mm of the fire in any direction, then the enclosure **must** comply with the concrete structure specified above.


Platform Minimum Requirements

The platform must be installed at a height to satisfy the requirements listed in section "B1 Clearances to Combustible Surfaces" on page 8.



The air vent(s) can be any size or shape, provided that the total *combined* open surface area is at least 28000mm².

Note: The EK1250/EK950 are shown as an example; the EK1550 requires two flues.




C2 Sealing Requirements

All joints in the flue system and between the gather / chassis should be sealed with a suitable high temperature fire cement (able to operate at temperatures greater than 500°C) sealant / cement.





E1 Gather Installation

Gather Weight EK950: 60 kg EK1250: 80 kg EK1550: 120 kg


Once the gather is in place, attach using the bolts, nuts, and washers provided.


E2 Securing the Base of the Appliance

Remove the shaded parts below to access the securing holes. The EK1250 has been used as an example; the EK950 and EK1550 would be secured in the same manner.

Secure the appliance base suitably using any 4 of the holes circled below.





The EK1250 has been used as an example in the images below. The EK950 will have one fewer panel and racking strip; the EK1550 will have one more panel and racking strip.







E4 Attaching and Removing the Pivot Drawer

The stainless steel pivot drawer at the front of the fire, shaded grey in the diagram below, can be attached and removed from the fire for cleaning or repair. To remove the drawer, follow the instructions below.





The drawer is centrally located by a spring on both the right and left hand sides.







With the screw removed, pull on the pin to remove it. Place one hand beneath the spring to catch it as the pin is removed. Repeat this on the opposite side to remove the other pin. The drawer will now slide out.


To replace the drawer, reverse the above steps.



E5 Using the Weather Cover (Optional Accessory)


The weather cover (shown below) provides protection from the elements for the interior of the firebox. It is an optional accessory that can be purchased from your local Escea dealer. Ensure that the firebox is cool prior to fitting the weather cover.



To install the weather cover, position the hooks at the bottom of the weather cover on the pins located on either side of the pivot drawer of the fireplace, as shown below.



With the bottom hooks in place, rotate the weather cover up until it slides into the top, as shown below. Use the latch to ensure that the weather cover is locked into place.


F1 Fuel Selection

For optimal wood burning, use firewood with a moisture content of less than 20%.

F2 Starting the Fire

If you are starting your fire for the purpose of cooking, then please proceed to section "G Cooking Guide" on page 18.

To start the fire, stack kindling so that it leans against the back panels, allowing sufficient airflow between pieces. The use of firestarters is recommended. Continue adding kindling until you have established an ember bed across the entire width of the fire. Use the provided fire poker to arrange the embers across the firebed.



DO NOT load wood higher than 33% the height of the firebox

For an optimal lighting time, stack kindling vertically against the back of the firebox and use fire-starters to ignite the wood in a timely manner. ⋖

Note: Expansion/contraction noises during heating up and cooling down cycles are normal and to be expected.

F3 Loading the Fire

Once an ember bed has been established, continue loading larger pieces of firewood onto the fire until the desired temperature or look has been reached. Ensure that all pieces of firewood do not protrude past the bottom stainless steel bar on the fireplace.

Do not load wood higher than 1/3 (33%) of the height of the firebox.

F4 Extinguishing the Fire

Once you have finished with burning the fire, remove all embers and remaining wood pieces from the fire and place them in a fireproof pail. Soak them well. Store them for a minimum of 5 days prior to disposing of them safely.

Supervise the fire until all logs and embers have been removed.

Note: The firebox will remain warm for several hours after the embers have been removed. Use caution when touching any parts of the firebox (i.e. the bricks, pivot drawer, or back panels) and supervise small children until the firebox has cooled completely.

G1 Cast Iron Instructions

All cast iron parts lock into the grill frames provided with the appliance. Ensure that they are securely set prior to cooking.

The cast iron parts supplied are coated in a vitreous enamel. In the event of decay or chipping, the cast iron can be seasoned by rubbing a thin layer of oil on the cast iron and heating the surface.

Seasoning will protect the surface from rusting and reduce the likelihood of food sticking to the surface.





The EK range of fireplaces is designed to allow storage of cooking implements within the fire. To access the storage area, lift the pivot drawer as shown in the diagram below.



G3 Optimal Ember Generation

The most efficient way to cook on a wood fire is over a consistent bed of embers. To achieve this, an ember generation box has been provided. To begin, affix the ember generator to any of the racking sets on the back of the fireplace and follow the instructions below.



Step 1: Affix the ember generator to the back of the firebox

Step 2: Vertically stack kindling

Step 3: Place and ignite fire-starters on the base of the ember generator

Step 4: Place more logs, & if necessary, more fire-starters


Step 5: For optimal ember generation, keep the ember generator fueled with pieces of hardwood that will roughly fit inside the opening of a drinking mug (80mm cross-section).

Note: Other wood or larger wood diameters can be used but will not perform as well. Softwood embers will burn out more quickly and larger diameter wood will take longer to produce embers.


Continue to load the ember generator with wood. Use the fire poker provided to get embers to fall through the grate on the bottom of the ember generator.

G4 Cooking on the Fire

Begin by positioning the desired number of cooking plates at the desired height in the fire. For a warmer grill, position the cooking grills closer to the bottom of the fire. For lower heat, position the cooking grills higher.



For the slotted grill, it is best to position the fat drip tray on the front of the grill prior to cooking. The fat drip tray will collect any grease drips to provide easy cleanup. Align the hooks of the fat drip tray with the slots in the grill, then pull forward and hook the fat drip tray to the grill frame.



To heat the grills, use the fire poker to scrape the embers from under the ember generator to beneath the desired grill. Continue to load the ember generator so that fresh embers continue to drop through the grate. To maintain heat, continue to scrape fresh embers beneath the cooking area until cooking is complete.

The EK range also comes with meat hooks, as shown in the image above, that can be used to hang and cook large pieces of meat (for example, a whole chicken). The process is the same as with the grills; scrape embers beneath the meat hooks to cook the meat.

It is also possible to use damp wood chips (i.e. cedar, hickory, etc.) thrown directly onto the embers to provide a smoky flavour to the cooking food.

Once you have finished cooking, remove all cooking trays and the ember generator prior to using the fire for standard outdoor heating.

Use the provided gloves when handling the hot cooking trays and the ember generator. Heat will begin to transfer through the gloves after 30 seconds. It is recommended to move the hot trays within 30 seconds. It is also possible to scrape the embers away from the ember generator and cooking trays to allow them to cool; it takes approximately 20 minutes to be able to move them without the heat transferring through the gloves.

H1 Chimney Maintenance

The chimney must be inspected & cleaned at least once per year.

A chimney fire can permanently damage your chimney system; this damage can only be repaired by replacing the damaged component parts.

Chimney fires are not covered by the warranty.

H2 Recommended Refurbishment Products Stovebright Metallic Black Spray Paint

This product may be used on all black painted surfaces and is available from your Escea dealer.

Before application, ensure any corrosion is removed by a wire brush; also ensure that the surface is clean and free of any dust.

There is no guarantee the parts can be returned to a new finish.

Autosol Metal Polish

This product may be used on any stainless steel surfaces and applied with a soft cloth.

There is no guarantee the parts can be returned to a new finish.

General Warranty Terms and Conditions

General Information

This quality manufactured product is state of the art. The materials used were meticulously selected and are constantly checked, as is our entire production process.

Setting up or installing this product requires specialised knowledge. Escea products may therefore only be installed and commissioned by specialised firms and in compliance with statutory regulations as amended.

Warranty Conditions for Escea Outdoor Wood Fires

This warranty is provided by Escea Limited (referred to in this document as Escea). The warranty applies from the date of purchase from or through an authorised Escea dealer.

Nature of Warranty

Subject to the exclusions in section 2 & 3, Escea may undertake to put right any defects in the Escea Outdoor Wood Fire products supplied by Escea for the periods specified below:

Escea must pre-authorise all warranty work.

The benefits provided under this warranty are in addition to the consumer guarantees and any other statutory rights you may have under the consumer law and/or other applicable laws.

Warranty Exclusions

This warranty does not apply and will be void where:

The Escea Outdoor Wood Fire is not installed in accordance with AS/NZS 2918:2001 and any building code and consent (if required).

The Escea Outdoor Wood Fire has not been installed or operated in accordance to the Escea Outdoor Wood Fire installation manual, in particular, defects, malfunctions or failures caused by incorrect installation, normal wear and tear, misuse, neglect, lack of proper and regular maintenance, accidental damage, any other alteration, or failure to follow operating instructions in the installation manual or any misuse that causes an overfired situation resulting in heat damage.

^{**} Failure is considered a physical crack or hole that stops the fire functioning as it is designed to.

The use of products, including flue systems, that are not specified in accordance with the installation manual.

Repairs or modifications by persons not authorised by Escea, use of parts not supplied by Escea, or damage or other events which have occurred since the product left the control of Escea.

Any scratches, dints, finger print marks, and melted items that occurred after the arrival of the product to the Escea Dealer.

Discolouration of the enamel, galvanized surfaces, or glass caused by soiling by soot or built-in residues of burnt materials as well as visibly changed colour or other aspects due to thermal stress or overloading.

Changes in the interior / exterior surfaces of the house, fire, or flue (e.g. any staining or soot / smoke damage, cracking, discoloration or degradation of surfaces caused by thermal stress or overloading).

Damage caused by abnormally corrosive environments (e.g. sea salt corrosion).

Escea wood fires are coated with high temperature paint that may show signs of surface rust if exposed to moisture for an extended period of time. Any repair and replacements of parts that are subject to normal wear and tear expected with any outdoor fire product. Any rust damage discolouration or corrosion in any part of the fire over life of the fire is not covered by warranty.

Damage caused by water affecting the Escea outdoor wood fire.

Operation of the Escea outdoor wood fire without its back panels (if applicable).

Damage caused by chimney fires.

This warranty does not cover paint blemishes or imperfections because of the uneven nature of high temperature paint. A spray can of touch up paint is available at a local paint merchant.

Subject to any statutory provisions to the contrary, at Escea's discretion, Escea's liability in respect of EK Series products that are found to have manufacturing defects will be limited to refunding, repairing, or replacing the defective products. The reinstatement and replacement of any affected outside wall, ceiling, or floor coverings, coatings, or claddings are not covered by warranty. Escea does not accept liability for consequential damage or any incidental expenses resulting directly or indirectly from any defect or breach of warranty, claims for damage to building or any other consequential loss.

Other Escea Outdoor Wood Fire Warranty Conditions

No dealer, distributor, or similar person has the authority to warrant Escea products beyond the terms contained in this warranty.

This warranty is automatically voided if the appliance's serial number has been removed or altered in anyway.

Replace the relevant part of the Escea product with a product of identical specification (or where the product is superseded or no longer in stock, with a product of as close a specification as possible).

How to Make a Warranty Claim

To make a valid claim under this warranty, you must:

- Lodge the claim through the dealer who supplied the fire, as soon as you first become aware of the breakdown. The Escea Dealer will then follow Escea's warranty claim process.
- Provide the Escea product serial number.
- Provide reasonable proof of purchase for the Escea product.
- If required, provide access to the premises at which the Escea product is located (so it can be inspected).
