



Gladstone Mohair Version

An easy tubular cowl that's as light as air.

Yarn: Lang Muse (80% Suri Alpaca, 3% Merino, 17% Nylon; 624yds per 100g), 1 skein, or Filcolana Tilia (70% Kid Mohair, 30% Silk; 230yds per 25g), 3 balls.

Needles: 3.75mm/US5 16"/40cm circular needle,
- additional 16" circular of similar or smaller size
- one 4.5mm needle for the bind off.

Gauge: 20 sts = 4"/10cm

Finished Measurements: 12" wide x 28" circumference.

Other tools: stitch marker, darning needle, crochet hook, scrap yarn.

Provisional Cast On 120 sts (a tutorial can be found at: <https://tinyurl.com/5yuabkdd>).

Knit in the round until work measures 28" from the cast on edge.

Unpick the crochet chain and put the exposed live stitches on a second circular needle (same needle size or slightly smaller).

Align the two ends of the tube, matching up the Beginning of Round on both ends. Using the larger extra needle, loosely work a Three Needle Bind Off (with wrong sides of fabric facing each other) all the way around to attach the two ends together.

(An explanation and tutorial of the Three Needle Bind Off can be found at <http://tinyurl.com/yz8xz33c>. In our instance, the wrong sides of the fabric (i.e. the insides of the tube) are held facing each other resulting in a small seam of stitches all the way around the outside of the cowl)
