

An extra-squashy, oversized ribbed scarf for beating that winter chill. Knit with super-bulky yarn on large needles, this scarf comes together in record time.

This pattern includes instructions for 3 different sizes, each intended to use the full amount of yarn.

Approximate Sizes: Short-Wide (76x10") / Medium (88x8.5") / Long-Narrow (100x7")

Yarn: 2 skeins of Cascade Magnum (100% Wool; 123 yds per 250g). *Shown in 9565 Sphere.*

Needles: 12.0mm (US17)

Gauge: ~6 sts = 4" in ribbed pattern

Other Tools: darning needle, crochet hook.

Special Abbreviation: K1b – K1 below – insert right needle into the stitch underneath the next stitch on the left needle (i.e. the same stitch from the previous row). K as usual through this stitch, then let the stitch above drop off the left needle.

Cast on 17 / 15 / 13 sts

Set up row: P1, *K1, P1, rep from * to end of row

Row A: K1, *P1, K1b, rep from * to last 2 sts, P1, K1

Row B: P1, *K1b, P1, rep from * to end of row.

Repeat Rows A and B until scarf reaches desired length, being sure to leave some yarn for tassels.

Bind off in rib. Weave in ends.

Cut 36 18" lengths of yarn. Using bundles of 3, fold the bundle in half and, using a crochet hook, poke the folded end through the edge of the scarf. Pull cut ends through the loop created by the fold. Pull tight. Attach six bundles to each end.

Abbreviations:

K – knit K1b – Knit 1 below P – purl

St(s) – stitch(es) rep - repeat
