

Window Cling

You will need: a ruler, scissors or a craft knife, water and a rubber scraper or a cloth.

Step 1 - Choose or print your image

You can use almost any image in conjunction with window cling to make a flexible, reusable window sticker; pick an image from a magazine or print an image onto paper. So long as the paper is quite thin and flexible and not too stiff it doesn't matter what you use.

Step 2 - Apply the window cling

Place your chosen image face up on a flat surface. If your image is not A4 size, cut a piece of window cling that is the same size as your image. Peel the paper backing away from the clear plastic sheet, exposing just the top edge. Line up the exposed top edge of the sticky plastic sheet with the edge of your chosen image and stick it down. Run a ruler down the clear plastic sheet, peeling back the paper backing as you go and ensuring there are no air bubbles between the two layers.

Step 3 - Cut out your image

If you want to cut around your image, use a pair of scissors or a craft knife to do this now, before proceeding to the next step.

Step 4 - Peel off the clear film

Now peel off the clear plastic film. If you are having trouble, use a sharp knife to catch and lift up the edge of the plastic film. Your chosen image should be left with a sticky coating on the surface.

Step 5 - Apply your window sticker

Wet the surface of the window with water then press the sticky side of your window sticker onto the glass and rub firmly over the back of the sticker with your hand. Use a rubber scraper or a cloth to remove any water or air bubbles, pressing gently and working from the centre of the image to the edges before wiping off any remaining water.

Your finished window sticker can be peeled off and reapplied at any time without leaving any residues behind.
