But not everything at the shop is an antique. Modern items include artisan chandeliers designed by Florence-based Sabrina Landini and Sugahara crystal from Japan. The store recently introduced a unique collection of jewelry by local designers Alda & Nancy, Sandy Zavzavadjian and Leon, all made with semi-precious stones.
