ARTIST STATEMENT

My digital print works attempt to reflect sentiments of the real, messy human condition. I find myself thirsty for real experiences in the deep ocean of controlled online public facades. I use the sensuous material of the virtual realm to speak back into the void.

Heal.

This series was commissioned by the city for the project "Microcosm". As the selected artist for Ward 8, I used the pathways of Centrepointe Park to explore a mental pathway of conflict resolution. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, a long list of new and old conflicts have taken center stage in our everyday psyche. Being stuck at home has made conflict inescapable, be it personal or shared. Many community members walk the pathways of parks as a break, and as a method for processing thoughts and feelings. This act of co-ambulation is key to seeking resolution and healing in our community at both the individual and collective level. Walking is meditative, and visiting a community space can reaffirm our connectedness.

I chose to create three stations within Centrepointe Park to feature a 24"x36" poster illustrating a statement relevant to the healing process. Each was stationed around the loop to highlight that they do not run in any particular sequence and that viewing them can be repeated multiple times. My hope was that community members sit with these statements and meditate on their personal meaning.

Each poster depicts a statement erected as a large monument on a journey across an expansive internal geography. Water floods each landscape, sitting quiet and deep while the landscape rises up to meet us. The horizon is always visible, hinting that the journey forward continues.

WEAKNESS

Continuing my work on isolation, WEAKNESS is a series of text works that stand in opposition to the colourful and alluring marketing slogans found online. Our increased need for virtual connection has necessitated a renewed ignorance of the dangers of social media. The free labour we gave companies like Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook has multiplied as we desperately "like" and "retweet" as a way to feel connected to anyone and anything.



We have forgotten that social media is marketing in the disguise of free life advice, therapy, beauty routines, exercise regimens, social activism, and cute animals. One post after another tells us how to better manage our time, fix our trauma, and find our true purpose so that we can be the most productive version of ourselves and still somehow be happy. And if you aren't happy yet, there are posts about being unhappy that find a way to sell you something.

God forbid you are a sad, messy, stupid, ugly, quiet, weak, unambitious pushover who spends your time questioning yourself. Of course, all of us are these things. Humans hold a multitude within us, and this is something these slogans will never capture. WEAKNESS playfully spells out our imperfections and celebrates them using the visual language of the immaculate digital realm.

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Marianne Burlew is an installation artist whose work focuses on themes of identity via multi-sensory media such as video and sculpture. She received her MFA from the University of Waterloo in 2016. There she was able to complete internships with artists Saskia Olde Wolbers and Anne Hardy in London (UK) through the Keith and Win Shantz scholarship. Prior to her return to school, Burlew participated as an artist-in-residence in the textile studio at the Harbourfront Centre for two years. Burlew earned her BFA from York University. She has exhibited around southern Ontario in such galleries as the Idea Exchange, Red Head Gallery, the Harbourfront Centre, the Gladstone Hotel, Craft Ontario Gallery, and the Mississauga Living Arts Centre. Her work is part of private collections as well as the City of Ottawa art collection and the Fibre Art Collection at Cambridge Art Galleries.
