ARTIST STATEMENT

"A change of scenery was in order for Winter 2021. I rented a cottage in Prince Edward County on the shore of Lake Ontario, where I routinely started my days rising before the light. Pulling on my winter gear, coffee in hand, I headed out to wait for the sun to rise over the Sand Banks Provincial Park. Without a doubt, some days were absolutely spectacular while others were only glorious. This ritual filled my heart with hope and gratitude.

Back at the cottage, a makeshift studio was created in the kitchen and eating areas, providing just enough space for small works. I travelled to PEC with supplies to try my hand at cold wax, deciding that this was the season to try something new. I have always painted with acrylics, drawn to the rapid drying time which allows for a multitude of layers to be built up in one session. Conversely, using oils requires more patience. Here and now was the location to try it.

The pieces produced during those three months were closer to the Canadian Landscape genre, not my normal approach. They are celebrating Lake Ontario, with white sand beaches and a touch of cloud appreciation. I worked from memory and imagination as I always have, never relying on photographs. The sculptural viscosity of the cold wax invited painting with palette knives more than brushes, an opportunity I embraced. The first layers were always done in acrylics with subconscious mark making. The next layers introduced the textural cold wax. The goal for winter 2021 was to work in a less dreamy and atmospheric aesthetic and more in the tradition of historic Canadian landscape painters."

BIOGRAPHY

Sharon Kelly is a contemporary artist known for her tranquil paintings inspired by the oceans and waterways. "I grew up living on the St. Lawrence River observing its inherent beauty and power. I remain mesmerized and transfixed by the way water moves, reflects, glimmers and glows. Water and our connection to it features predominantly in my artistic practice."

Kelly creates paintings from memory using the freedom of abstraction to explore and respond to her experiences. "My paintings evolve slowly over time, often beginning with vibrant gestural marks, finishing with softer calmer emotions. I repeat this process several times until the composition satisfies me. My process of trial and error, random and controlled, hidden and obvious, results in hazy layers of accumulated history."

In 2016, I was struck by the imagery and words of Dr. Wallace J. Nichols, author of The Blue Mind Theory. Blue Mind theory, "Shows the science of how being near, in, on or even under water can make you happier, healthier and more connected..." The Blue Mind has influenced my life each time I am within water's reach. She is my muse, in all her forms. My intention remains to give tangible expression to landscapes that exist for me in both memory and imagination.

Sharon Kelly was born in Montreal and studied Art History at Queens University. A self-taught artist, Kelly now maintains a full-time studio in Ottawa by the Rideau River. She has been featured in several solo and group exhibitions since 1999. Her works are in both private and corporate collections.
