


Rusting Product Information Sheet

The steel bowl of this fire pit is intended to rust over time, creating a patina look.

How do I make my fire pit rust?

This fire pit will naturally rust over time due to exposure to natural elements. However, if you wish to accelerate the rusting process, you can create a spray-on solution to help. You will need:

- White Vinegar
- Hydrogen Peroxide
- Salt
- Safety Goggles
- Protective Gloves
- Spray Bottle



- 1. Wearing gloves and goggles, mix 16oz. hydrogen peroxide, 1/2 Tbsp salt, and 2oz. white vinegar.
- 2. Shake well until the salt has dissolved.
- 3. Place the metal fire pit on a covered surface to prevent staining.
- **4.** Spray the whole unit with the solution, let dry fully, and repeat the process. Continue this process until the desired result is achieved.

This product is designed to age to a natural patina finish. Depending on environmental conditions, this process can take more or less time than listed to achieve the colorations shown below.



PLEASE NOTE: During this process, some color can transfer and stain other surfaces. Instructions for simple methods to remove rust from various surfaces can be found online.
