## CARE AND MAINTENANCE GUIDE

Conversion Varnish is the predominant finish in high-end furniture, ensuring enduring beauty for generations with proper application and care. It offers exceptional resistance to foods, beverages, and household chemicals. To preserve your furniture's exquisite appearance, follow these care guidelines.

- Excessive waxing can cause moisture from beverages or glasses to leave milky white rings on the surface.
- Do not use cleaners containing bleach.
- Avoid cleaners with abrasives, as they may scratch the finish.
- Do not allow cleaners containing ammonia to come in contact with your furniture's finish. Ammonia may turn oak black and painted pieces yellow.
- Dyes and inks may discolor the finish. The ink and dyes from newsprint and plastic bags may penetrate into the finish when moist.
- Conversion Varnish offers a very hard mar resistant surface, but like any finish, it may still be scratched or damaged if not cared for properly.



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## **Cleaning Guidlines**

In general, a soft damp cloth followed by a dry one is sufficient for cleaning the finish. If a cleaner is necessary, use an very mild soap and ensure thorough drying. Occasionally, you can apply a high-quality furniture polish following the manufacturer's instructions. By following these steps, you can ensure that your finished piece will maintain its appearance for many years.

Cleaning: Fingerprints, cooking residues, tobacco smoke, and similar substances can accumulate on any finished surface. While they won't harm the finish, periodic removal is necessary to restore it to its original state. To do so, wipe the finish with a damp cloth using a non-wax polish or mild soap.

**Dust Removal:** Dust buildup consists of airborne particles that collect on the finish. To address this, simply wipe the finish with a cloth dampened with a mild detergent or polish.

**Spills:** The finish is resistant to most household spills. However, in case of a spill, it should be promptly wiped up to prevent potential damage.

**Excessive Exposure:** Heat, high humidity, direct sunlight, or liquids can damage both the finish and the wood. Take care to avoid these conditions.

It should be noted that your new Conversion Varnish finish does not achieve its maximum performance properties for at least 30 days from the time it was finished. This is based on maintaining a temperature of at least 70 degrees.
