Ask for someone to read Mark 2:1-12. Then begin asking the following questions and discussing them as a group:

- 1. Imagine you are making a video of this incident. Describe the setting and the characters. As the scene opens, what is going on?
 - Note: Jesus had taught and healed many people during a previous visit in Capernaum (Mark 1:21-33).
- 2. What indicates Jesus' popularity at this time?
- 3. Why and how is Jesus' preaching interrupted? How does he react to this interruption?
- 4. What do you think the paralyzed man's friends have in mind? How does that compare with what Jesus says in verse 5?
- 5. How do the scribes or teachers of the law react to this statement and why?
 - Note: Blasphemy is showing contempt or irreverance for God or claiming attributes that belong to God alone. Under Jewish law, blasphemy was punishable by death.
- 6. In your own words, what are the scribes thinking? What is the point of the question Jesus asks in reply (verse 9)?
- 7. What do you think Jesus expects to prove to the scribes by healing the paralyzed man?
- 8. How does the healed man express his faith? How do the people react to his healing?
- 9. To sum up briefly, what have you discovered about Jesus from this story? What impressed you the most, or what did you see for the first time?
