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Facing Change – God's Provision

he director of an Irish mission was planning to retire in four years, and he had already started praying for his replacement. The mission wanted to identify the new director within the following year so that this individual could be adequately mentored for the position. Why so soon? Change is challenging, and a smooth transition would benefit both parties and prevent the work of the ministry from being hindered.
