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Hebrews 1

- God Speaks to Us by a Son

Then we find accident victims lying unconscious, our first impulse is to get them to speak, since we can tell a lot more about their condition if they say something to us. Under normal conditions, our power of speech identifies us. New parents eagerly await their child's first words. Speech makes meaningful communication possible. Speech enhances human relationships.

The letter to the Hebrews begins with an astounding statement: *God spoke*. The Christian faith rests on the conviction that God is knowable as a person and speaks to us. This is called God's self-revelation; and He spoke finally and completely by his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Chapter 1 sets forth the unique nature of the Son of God. His superiority to the ancient Jewish religion occupies most of this letter. Because angels were considered intermediaries between God and man, the author makes a special point of describing them in relation to the Son.

Read Hebrews 1:5-14

6.	Follow the line of argument through this section. (Noting the connecting words such as <i>for</i> , <i>or</i> , and <i>but</i> will help you do this.) What does the writer intend to prove about Jesus Christ's position in relation to angels?
7.	The writer quotes God, not man, in verse 5. What do the question and quote in verse 5 reveal about Jesus?
8.	How is Jesus different from, and superior to, both the prophets and the angels?
9.	What is your concept of angels? Compare it with what the writer says about the duties and position of angels in verses 6-7 and 14.
10.	What contrast does <i>but</i> at the beginning of verse 8 introduce?

11.	What responsibilities and authority does the Son have (verses 8-9)?
12.	The writer has shown Jesus as superior in rank and in power to the prophets and to angels. What is the comparison with the creation meant to reveal about the Son in verses 10-12?
13.	List the words that describe the creation and those that describe the Son.
14.	What thoughts do verses 13 and 14 add to the contrasting functions of angels and the Son?
15.	What locations are suggested (verses 13-14) for the present activities of the Son and of angels?
16.	What relationship do angels have with human beings?

Read the Key Verses together

In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven.
