

WHITE WINES

Lucchetti Birbaccio, 2018 – 14.99

Fresh, sweet honeysuckle nose, white flowers. Lemon curd, guava, gravel, lime. Delicate, pretty, with weight and minerality. Mario Lucchetti focuses on the importance of restoring the native grapes of the Le Marche region of Italy, Lacrima di Morro (previous wine club selection) and Verdicchio. The soils are potassium-rich and iron-poor, creating distinctive and aromatic wines.

100% Verdicchio di Castelli de Jesi.

Malabaila Roero Arneis "Le Tre", 2018 – 15.99

Honeyed apricot, bartlett pear, lemon zest, magnolia. Crisp palate, with a mineral undertone. This wine is light, delicate, complex and alluring; made of 100% Roero Arneis by the Malabaila family in Piedmont. The Arneis grape was almost extinct in the 1970s, but due to the demand for white wine from the makers of Barolo and Barbaresco, it has survived.

RED WINES

Lapis Luna Red Wine Blend, 2017 – 14.99

Dark boysenberry, black cherry, cassis, clove. Leather, tobacco, menthol. Blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Sangiovese and Barbera from Mendocino vineyards in the North Coast of California. Barrel aged 20 months in nearly all neutral oak.

Dancing Coyote Petite Sirah, 2016 – 15.99

Plum, holiday spice, barnwood, tobacco. Black cherry, roasted chestnuts on a bright yet smooth palate. Pump overs to extract flavor and aged in oak barrels for 12 months to create structure. Clarksburg appellation is ideally suited for the Petite Sirah grape with its nutrient rich soils, hot days cooled off with maritime breezes.

Vigneti Ettore Valpolicella Classico, 2017 – 16.99

Black cherry, blackberries, violets. Tar, black currant, purple flowers, forest floor. The Estate was established in 1930, but wines did not start being vinified here until 2011. Planted with all indigenous varieties, this is a small family venture in producing the classic Valpolicella wines - fresh, vibrant with a light hand in the cellar. 35% Corvina 30% Corvinone 25% Rondinella 5% Dindarella 5% Molinara. Fermented and aged in Stainless Steel.

Sottimano Maté, 2018 – 16.99

Rose, hibiscus, strawberry shortcake, rhubarb. Bright cherry with spearmint and honeysuckle undertones. Fresh, bright, light but with a clear tannic structure. Young, but sophisticated. Notably light ruby in color. Sottimano produces beautiful wines in the Piedmont region of Italy.

This one is 100% Brachetto from a small vineyard, "Maté" in the Comune di Neive. Unfined, unfiltered. Indigenous yeasts. Stainless Steel.

PREMIUM SELECTIONS

Vino Lauria "Solerte", 2017 – 25.99

Golden apple, yellow flowers, honeydew, lilies, peonies, jasmine. Soft with a saline and mineral focus driving the palate, and its incredibly rewarding focus. Floral, charming, exuding the beach vibes of Alcamo in Southern Italy. 100% Zibibbo, a grape usually made sweet, a handful are creating these dry treasures. Calcareous soil. Stainless Steel fermentation and aging.

Intellego "Halagasha" Pinotage, 2019 – 26.99

Strawberry, candied raspberry; super light, bright color. Suede, red cherries, cranberry, Boston creme pie, nutmeg. Light palate, soft. Fleeting white pepper on finish. Made from 100% bush vine Pinotage (cross of Pinot Noir and Cinsault). This is a beautiful example of this grape, sort of a hope for the future of what will be done with this variety. Historically it was over-oaked in style, and generally disregarded as a serious wine. Whole cluster fermentation, under semi carbonic conditions, aged in barrel 5 months. Dry farmed.

The Barrel Blend, 2015 – 27.99

Elevated vanilla, clove, leather, black currant, cedar, anise, menthol. Smooth, dark berries, and bark on a lingering palate filled with pepper, leather and edge. Hill Family Estate is born out of third generation Napa Valley farmers by siblings eager to make wine out of their harvests. Blend of Merlot, Zinfandel and Malbec from varied Napa Valley vineyards. Partial new oak, mostly French though, gives this wine vibrancy while still presenting itself as thoroughly Napa in pedigree.
