WHITE WINES -

SCARPETTA PINOT GRIGIO, 2023

14.99

Lavender, peach, white flowers, honey and pear on a dry, lively and minerally palate. Pulling from both the Grave and Colli Orientali regions of Friuli-Venezia Giulia, we get a incredibly complex yet friendly Pinot Grigio. The Scarpetta brand is inspired by the soul of the Friuli region of Italy, created as an homage to the everyday Italian lifestyle of "drinking good wine, great conversation, and little moments of celebration" by Master Sommelier Bobby Stuckey and Chef Lachlan Patterson of Michelin-starred restaurants, The French Laundry and Frasca. DOMAINE VETRICCIE CORSE BLANC, 2023

100% Vermentinu from the island of Corsica, situated in the Mediterranean between Italy & France. Fresh and citrus driven, with citrus peel, white flowers and a mineral finish – fresh, delicate and refreshing. Domaine Vetriccie was acquired by the Barcelo family in 1966, currently run by Daniel Barcelo in the town of Aghione, on the Costa Serena. The vineyards are sustainably farmed, poised between sea and mountain, allowing for ideal Mediterranean influences. CORSE AOP | FRANCE

RED WINES

ZENI "MR. LAKE" BARDOLINO, 2023

Blend of Corvina and Rondinella from the Bardolino DOC which lies on the hills of the eastern shore of Lago di Garda, the largest lake in Italy. With fresh cherry, wild strawberry and spice notes, it is a fruity, fun-spirited wine, with "Mr. Lake" on the label referencing Lake Guarda. Zeni is a historic winery producing wine in Bardolino, in the province of Verona for over 150 years, since 1870. With wineries now in both Bardolino and Valpolicella, the current generation of siblings Fausto, Elena and Federica, along with their mother Mariarosa, lead the way following in their father Gaetano 'Nino' Zeni's footsteps.

GROWER'S GUILD SYRAH, 2020

Dark ruby color with blackberry and allspice; hints of tobacco and anise layered with fruit notes and dusty earth; balanced and lingering finish. From Owen Roe, Growers Guild references the longtime relationship between the winery and early vineyard partners; relationships that have spanned decades. Winemaker and co-founder David O'Reilly established Owen Roe in 1999 in the Northwest, focusing on the unique terroir and vineyards of Yakima and Willamette Valleys. The focus on selecting vineyards allows a light hand in the cellar, creating wine that reflects the region.

TRENEL MÂCON-VILLAGES, 2021

Founded in 1928 by Henri Claudius Trénel, Maison Trénel is one of the most ancient and well-known houses of the Beaujolais and Mâcon wine regions of France. For almost 100 years, they have been guided by seeking authenticity in fruit and terroir. This beautiful Chardonnay has floral and citrus notes on a soft and round yet crisp palate. Fermented in cement and stainless steel, completing malolactic fermentation; this gives the wine freshness, richness and depth without being heavy-handed. The vineyards are varied with clay and limestone soils between the Côte Chalonnaise and the rock of Solutré, giving the wine its wonderful balance.

MÂCON-VILLAGES | BURGUNDY, FRANCE

COTTANERA ETNA ROSSO, 2022

26.99

100% Nerello Mascalese from 25-30 year old vines on the northern slope of Etna, where the soil is sandy volcanic ash. Francesco Cambria bought 100 hectares of vines and hazelnut groves in 1962, seeking a retreat from his career. At first focused on hazelnuts, he sold off the grapes to the local co-op. Over time, and through the generations, the focus evolved to today where the winery is led by siblings Mariangela and Francesco Cambria with focused passion for indigenous varietals and the distinct Etna terroir. The Etna Rosso is from 4 of their 5 Contradas, giving a pure and focused expression of Nerello Mascalese in this distinct terroir.

GILBERT CELLARS ALLOBROGES, 2022

A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre all from the Sugar Loaf Vineyard. The Gilbert family history is deep and long in the Yakima Valley where they have historically been farmers of apples, pears and stone fruits from the 1890s. Now fifth generation, the family bought a vineyard in 2002 and instead of tearing out the vines to plant more apples, they made a turn and ventured into wine. At first a hobby, this small winery with deep roots has become a shining star and heart of the Yakima community. The Allobroges bottling is a nod to Rhone style reds, with notes of blackberry, black tea and lavender on a fruit-foward, terroir driven frame. YAKIMA VALLEY AVA | WASHINGTON

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
