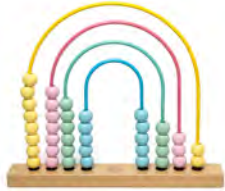

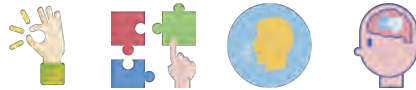

COLOURFUL ABACUS

Counting is an essential skill and much more fun now with this colorful abacus. The rainbow is made up of coloured metal arches on a wooden base with 10 wooden beads in each arc. A lovely and long lasting educational material.

WHAT DO YOU STIMULATE?



HOW TO PLAY?

It is an ideal game to reinforce colour vocabulary, start learning numbers and the ability to count and classify. It is about guiding with your finger through the rainbow, showing the pieces of different colours. At the same time, you can add the beads. It is a way to play, learn and develop motor skills. At this point, your toddler will enjoy moving the beads side to side while speaking out the numbers. Correct them if a number is missing or wrongly said, in order to correctly acquire the sequence of digits and memorize them while they are playing.

CYLINDER PEGS

This Montessori inspired material allows the development of concepts such as order, concentration, coordination and distinguishing the dimensions of objects. Children work by sorting cylinders by size and are able to distinguish various dimensions simply by visual perception. In addition, they will be able to train the pincer grasp, which is an indirect preparation for future writing.

WHAT DO YOU STIMULATE?



HOW TO PLAY?

Sit next to your little one and remove all the cylinders one by one from their place. Mention each of the colours as you pick them up, and compare their sizes between them ("this one is thicker than this one", "this one narrower", "this one larger", etc ...). Once you pulled all the pegs out, show your child the empty board and let them put them back in place. You can guide them with indications of colours and sizes, but let them be the one to introduce them into the holes.



SNAIL LABYRINTH

The magnetic pencil will drag the little balls through this portable labyrinth. This fantastic game will stimulate your kid's concentration skills while practicing the pencil grip.

HOW TO PLAY?

The first time your kid plays this game, just let him try to find out how it works. Sometimes it is not that easy to understand the objective of the game, so if you see that he is not succeeding, show him how it works to avoid frustration. From there, your child will begin to understand the cause and effect relationship when he realizes that the balls move when he drags the pencil over them. It is a great exercise that will boost concentration and fine motor skills, while allowing your little one to make decisions on the right path to take in order to drag all the balls to the finish line.



LOCK BOX

This Montessori methodology material is perfect for working on fine motor skills and ingenuity with your hands. It is a tactile exercise, which allows little ones to focus on opening or closing the different compartments. An intelligence challenge that requires concentration and perseverance.

HOW TO PLAY?

Let your child discover how to open the box, how to close it, manipulate each of the mechanisms, look inside the box, put and remove objects from it ... It is undoubtedly a toy full of possibilities. By playing, children work on hand-eye coordination, the ability to solve problems and even give a start to symbolic play. Give the box to your little one with all the doors closed and let them find out for themselves how each lock works. To stimulate them, introduce an object that they really like in the box as a treasure or prize, so that once they manage to open one of the doors, they can reach their reward.



What do we want to stimulate in this period?

It's time to play! But before we get started, here is a description of the meaning of the symbols we use to make it easier for you to understand and follow the play guides.



FINE MOTRICITY

Coordination of muscles, bones and nerves to produce small and precise movements.



COORDINATION

Respond to what the baby wants to obtain based on what he looks at and control these movements with the help of his sight.



LANGUAGE

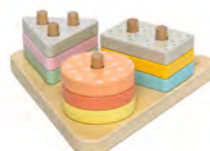
Stimulation of the baby's language, communication and expression abilities



COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT

Acquire new knowledge about your surroundings and develop your intelligence.

Please have in mind...

Each baby develops in a different way and at a different pace, so never compare your baby with another baby. Our Play Boxes contain many toys. We advise you to introduce them one by one, if possible on different days (and leaving a few days between them). In this way, you will be able to focus on just one of them and making the most of the learning. If it seems that your baby doesn't like one of the toys, don't worry! Timing is essential and maybe that day is not the right one.. Set it aside and try again in a few days.

Care of toys ...

- **Wooden:** Wash the surface with a cloth dampened in soapy water and drained. Dry with another clean, dry cloth.
- **Made of fabric:** Machine wash on delicate program with cold water



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
