

**Series Snapshot** | The Christian faith is one of constant growth. A student once told me, "I'm tired of having things to do." #### I. Introduction

- A. We're launching a brand-new series called "Grow." A big part of what it means to be a Christ-follower is the expectation of growth. You hear words like discipleship or spiritual fruit when describing your faith. All of those are words centered on the same concept or idea: to be in a relationship with God means to continue to grow in our understanding of who He is.
- B. You decided to commit yourself to Christ at some point in your life. From that day forward, this decision requires you to grow in your faith and Christ-likeness. This isn't much different from our life in general.
  - 1. Optional Illustration: Growing Children
    - a) NOTE: Tell a story about children growing up using pictures of them. If you're a parent, talk about your children. If you're not a parent but have nieces or nephews, consider talking about them. Or, use pictures of yourself or your team to show how kids grow over time.
    - b) Make the point that while a part of us gets sentimental about seeing children grow, children are supposed to grow. It's normative and healthy.

#### II. Tension

- A. Let's think about this another way. How many of you in here can drive? Legally? How old are you when you're allowed to get your driver's permit? How many of you, ten years from now, want to still have only your permit? Do you want to be in a situation when you're 25 where your parents are still in the passenger seat with you every time you drive? Of course not! And yet many of us are living our lives as Christ-followers like we have our "Spiritual Driver's Permit." We're saved by faith in Christ but haven't moved further past that.
- **B.** And as we grow older in life, we can look at things like photos or report cards to measure our progress. But here's the question we're wrestling with in this session: How do you know you're growing spiritually?

#### III. Scripture

- A. Read Galatians 5:16-25
  - 1. But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things, there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its

passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

- B. In this passage, the Apostle Paul, the author of the letter to the Galatians, sets up what you might recognize from English class as a contrast. Paul is contrasting two things: what it means to live your life according to your wishes and desires or to live your life according to the leading of the Holy Spirit. These two ways of living are not just different; they are enemies of one another!
- C. Paul uses the word "flesh" to describe our sinful desires. We come under judgment and condemnation when we try to live according to our flesh. Our sinfulness puts us at odds with God. <u>OUR SIN MAKES IT IMPOSSIBLE TO BE IN A RIGHT RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD.</u> By trying to do things our way, we make it so that we'll never experience the true life offered by God through saving faith in His Son, Jesus, and the spiritual renewal that happens as a result.
- D. But if we live according to God's ways and listen to and follow the Holy Spirit, we live in the freedom of God's grace and salvation. It's wild to think about it: <u>WHEN WE</u> <u>SURRENDER TO GOD</u>, <u>WE EXPERIENCE TRUE FREEDOM</u>. And this freedom, this surrender, empowers our spiritual growth. We see this in the two lists Paul provides in the passage we read. Paul shows what a life led by the flesh looks like. And it's not pretty. We can see this in verses 19-21. But in verses 22-23, Paul shows us a picture of the life of someone who surrenders to the leading of the Spirit. This list of attributes is only possible because the Holy Spirit produces this growth in our lives.
- E. Verses 24 and 25 are Paul's way of saying that if we are saved by faith in Jesus, we should expect to look differently than those who are not. <u>OUR LIVES SHOULD BE FULL OF THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT. THIS FRUIT IS EVIDENCE OF OUR SPIRITUAL GROWTH.</u>

#### IV. Application

- A. The first way we should consider applying this to our lives is to <u>ACTIVELY SURRENDER</u> <u>OUR LIVES TO THE HOLY SPIRIT</u> (vs. 16).
  - 1. As Paul Said, "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh." It's through giving our lives to Him that we won't continue sinning.
  - Here is what you must understand about sin: <u>SIN WILL TAKE YOU FURTHER</u> <u>THAN YOU WANT TO BE TAKEN. KEEP YOU LONGER THAN YOU WANT TO STAY.</u> <u>AND COST YOU MORE THAN YOU WANT TO PAY.</u> Sin will severely hamper your ability to grow, but the way to be convicted, corrected, and brought back on course is through a relationship with the Holy Spirit. Give him the wheel of your life!
  - 3. You might feel the tension between yourself trying to take over the wheel and allowing the Holy Spirit to take the wheel. It may feel something like this:

- b) That's exactly how Paul describes it, right? Verses 19-21 show what it looks like to battle our sinful desires. Verses 22-23 are what the Spirit desires. So, once you lean on and rely on the Holy Spirit, then what?
- B. WHEN WE SURRENDER TO THE LEADING OF THE SPIRIT, WE WILL SEE FRUIT (vs. 22-23)
  - 1. Look back at verses 22-23. It's OK to admit if this feels a little oversimplified. Is it that easy? I mean, it kind of is! The Holy Spirit of God lives in us. And if we follow His leading and stay in tune with His presence, He will produce good fruit in us. And this fruit is the "report card" of our growth. The bottom line is fruit is the evidence of growth in your life.

#### V. Gospel

- A. This is made possible by submitting and surrendering your life completely to Christ. This, in Christian circles, is called "salvation." The Bible teaches that sin earns us a spiritual death, an eternal separation from God, the worst possible place a person could find themselves in. We are saved from this penalty when we come to faith in Jesus. On the cross, Jesus paid the penalty of death that our sin rightfully earned for us. And God, in His goodness, allows Jesus' payment to count on our behalf if we simply believe that Jesus is who He says he is and did all He said He did. That is what salvation is.
- B. Everything we've been talking about tonight takes place after salvation; using another big Christian word, this is called "sanctification." Sanctification means "to be made holy." The Holy Spirit works in our lives to make us more Christ-like, more holy.
  But sanctification can't happen without the initial first moment of salvation.
- C. Have you given your life and heart to Jesus? Have you had a moment where you profess your faith in Jesus and accept His payment on your behalf? If you have, you have been saved by faith in the person and work of Jesus Christ and have God's Spirit dwelling within you, working to make you more like Him. If you haven't, I'd like to challenge you to consider why not. What are you waiting on? I'd love to talk with you about anything that might be keeping you from experiencing new life in Christ.

#### VI. Conclusion

- A. Another great way to frame this question is to ask: <u>IS THERE MORE FRUIT IN MY WALK</u> <u>WITH JESUS THAN THERE WAS A YEAR AGO?</u> Maybe you respond with a yes. Maybe a no. Maybe not as much as you'd maybe like. As we've said in this session over and over, fruit is the evidence of growth in your life. If there is not as much fruit as there should be, maybe it's time you made some changes.
- B. Are you walking with the Spirit in every part of your life? Are you following God's leading when it comes to your pursuits? Your desires? Your disciplines? Your ambitions? Your dreams? Because <u>THE PATHWAY FOR ALL OF THIS IS FOUND BY KNOWING AND</u> <u>FOLLOWING GOD'S WORD UNDER THE POWER OF HIS SPIRIT.</u>
- C. God desires to spend time in a relationship with you. This primarily happens through prayer and spending time with Him in the Bible. If you are ready to see an increase in growth in your life, it starts with a renewed commitment to spending time with God. Are you ready to take your commitment to being in God's presence to the next level?

- 2. When we talk about the idea of obedience, does it feel freeing or constricting? Why?
- 3. What does it look like, practically speaking, to give the wheel of your life over to the Holy Spirit?
- 4. Look at Galatians 5:22-23. Which fruit of the Spirit is most difficult for you?
- 5. If fruit is the evidence of growth in your life, rank your spiritual growth over the last month, six months, and one year.
- 6. Are you walking with the Spirit in every part of your life? Which areas are a struggle for you?
- 7. Look up 2 Peter 1:3. What does this verse mean in light of our discussion about fruit?
- 8. How often are you turning to the authoritative Word of God for guidance in your everyday life?
- 9. What is one small step you can take to turn to the Bible more frequently?
