SNAP UP AN F1 MEMORY

Fifty photographs taken by Formula One luminaries are being auctioned to raise money for Great Ormond Street Hospital. Paul Hudson provides a preview

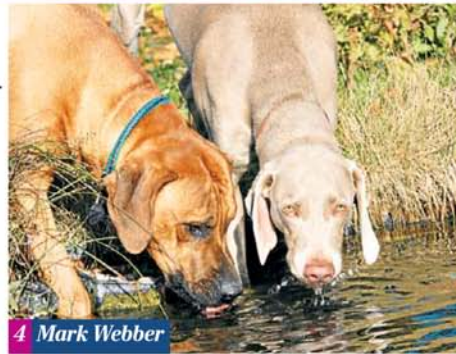
What do Formula One drivers do in their time off? A new collection of photographs of drivers as well as the team principals of each participating constructor, alongside a few former F1 world champions and recently active drivers. There are also contributions from the sport's "ringmaster" Bernie Ecclestone and Murray Walker, both of whose passion for motor racing at the top level remains undimmed.

The collection is called Zoom. Each of the 50 images will be printed and signed by the photographer before being auctioned by Coys on September 14, with proceeds going to Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children, one of F1's official charities.

Many of the images provide a glimpse into the personal lives of the drivers. They include Damon Hill's picture of surfing in Devon, Red Bull team principal Christian Horner's dogs, world champion Sebastian Vettel's favourite Alpine location and Bruno Senna's view from the family beachhouse. Others, such as Lewis Hamilton and Michael Schumacher, took pictures in and around the motorhomes, pitlanes and circuits to provide an insight into their day jobs.

Other pictures are of villas, vineyards, motorbikes and tractors - all very eclectic and, in some instances, abstract. The 50 images were taken specifically for Zoom and have never before been released.

1 Sebastian Vettel, Red Bull

"This is the mountain known as the Red Wall, in Vorarlberg, Austria. It's an awesome view. I went on my first skiing trip there with my family and I love to go there on holiday. It really is a home away from home."

2 Lewis Hamilton, McLaren

"I wanted to capture the fact that, while the car is very cramped inside, and there's a lot of action all around, it's where I feel most comfortable. The gloves on the wheel are like leaving your boots on the mat - a sign of being at home."

3 Sir Frank Williams, Williams

"Our team has a research and development facility in Doha and I was visiting to take a look at progress. Our first sponsors were from the Middle East, so the region has a special significance. The weather's not bad, too."

4 Mark Webber, Red Bull

"The good thing about going home to my dogs, Simba and Shadow, is that they don't know if I've had a bad day or a good day, they're always happy to see me. I live in England and even though I love racing everywhere, at Silverstone there is that extra that makes you a little more relaxed."

5 Bernie Ecclestone, F1 supreme

"These interesting statues are in my house in Gstaad in Switzerland. I can't remember where they came from but I like them a lot."

6 Adrian Newey, Red Bull

"After last year's Indian Grand Prix my family and I stayed in a wilderness camp in Rajasthan and toured some surrounding villages.

Life there is humble. The people are happy, friendly but have a tough existence, I thought this tractor epitomises those characteristics."

7 Murray Walker, F1 stalwart

"A very rare four-cylinder AJS of 1931 vintage at the 50th Graham Walker Memorial Run, held at Beaulieu in August in honour of my father who died 50 years ago."

8 Christian Horner, Red Bull

"The back of my Land Rover Defender, which our dogs love to ride in. Hugo, the Airedale in the back is particularly excited even though he doesn't know he's going for a haircut. Another dog, Poppy, died in January but we still have her two boys Bernie and Flavio."

9 Damon Hill, F1 champion 1996

"I'm a big fan of surfing and took this picture on a beach in Devon. After a day surfing I was trying to capture the light on the dunes at dusk when some other surfers ran into shot at just the right moment."

10 Vitaly Petrov, Caterham

"Every driver looks forward to racing in his home country, but so far I've not had the opportunity. I took this photo of a giant digger at the circuit which is under construction in Sochi and will host the first Russian Grand Prix. I'm really looking forward to racing in front of my home crowd."

11 Stefano Domenicali, Ferrari

"Fernando Alonso training on his mountain bike. His level of competition is fantastic, like his attitude. He is flawless and accurate in working with his engineers, and a reference for the whole team."

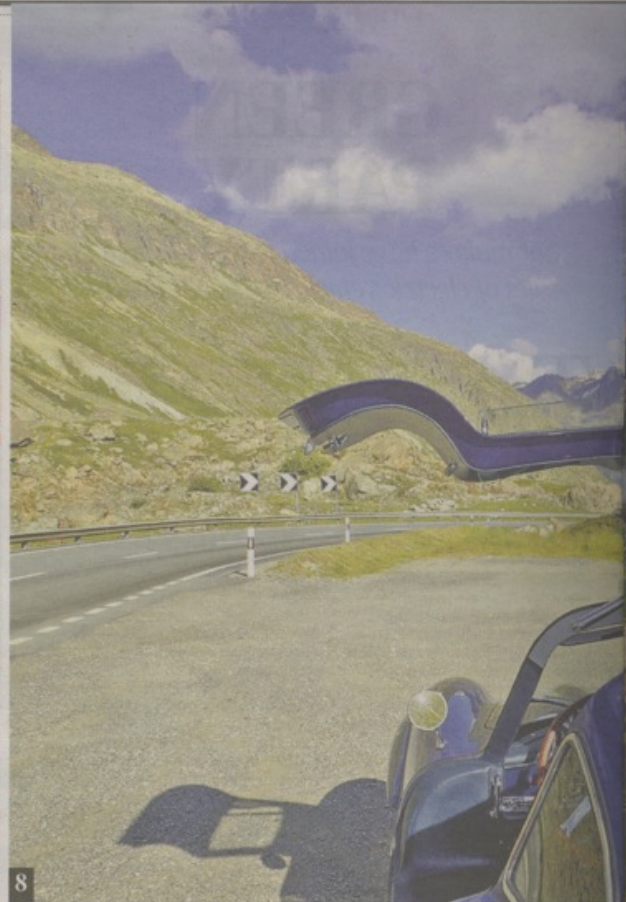
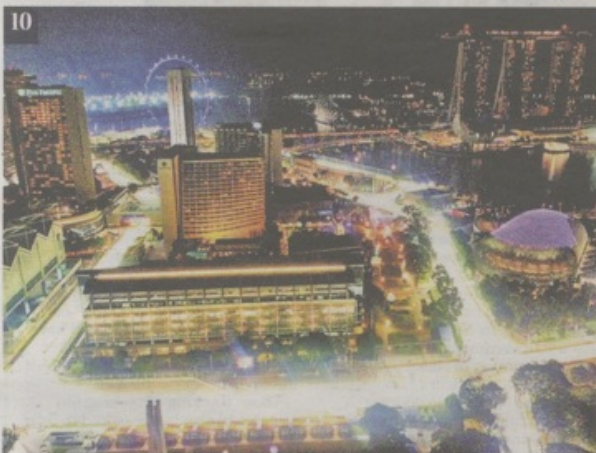
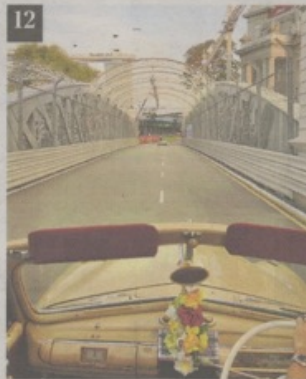

A collection of photos taken by Formula One drivers and team principals is being auctioned next Friday. Called Zoom, proceeds from the sale of the signed images will go to Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children, one of F1's official charities.

For the second year in a row, the star personnel of every F1 team were asked to take a photograph (not necessarily related to the sport). Those images will be sold by Coys at an auction in London hosted by Suzi Perry, the BBC's F1 presenter.

The images range from Fernando Alonso's podium shot of the Monza crowd to Nico Rosberg with a 1938 W154 Mercedes and world champion Sebastian Vettel's take on the Alps during a skiing holiday.

Further pictures include those from Lewis Hamilton and Mark Webber in his final season of F1, along with commentator Martin Brundle. There's also an image taken by F1 legend Michael Schumacher.

The photographs will be collated in a special edition book, which will go on sale ahead of the 2014 F1 season which starts in Australia on March 16.

Along with the pictures, the Zoom auction includes cameras provided by Nikon, which have been signed by world champions including Vettel, Kimi Räikkönen, Damon Hill, Jacques Villeneuve, John Surtees, Alain Prost and Sir Jackie Stewart.

Christian Sylt, co-founder of Zoom, said: "Thanks to the support of the teams and Bernie Ecclestone, we are able to showcase a varied collection of photographs which encapsulate life inside Formula One."

"Every image provides a unique insider's view of motor racing and offers a rare opportunity for the public to own a slice of history and help support the incredible work at Great Ormond Street Hospital."

The sport's big names put their favourite photographs up for auction in their support of Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital

1. SEBASTIAN VETTEL (driver, Red Bull Racing)

I enjoy the mountains very much, they give me a lot of freedom and many possibilities for sports activities. It's especially great in winter when I can go skiing. The "Red Wall" in Austria's Vorarlberg is awesome. I went there with my family for my first ever skiing trip and just love to go back. I feel at home and can relax and enjoy.

2. FERNANDO ALONSO (driver, Ferrari)

I took this on the podium at the 2013 Italian Grand Prix. Stepping on to the Monza podium is always a special feeling, as it's the only one where you can feel all the love that the fans have for the team. And it's the best prize at the end of the weekend.

3. LEWIS HAMILTON (driver, Mercedes)

Brazil was the last race in the calendar and the home of my idol, Ayrton Senna, so going back is really special and makes me realise how privileged I am and how much I have to be grateful for. Last year I stopped off in Rio before going to the track and visited the Christ

the Redeemer statue. It's amazing how this statue looks over, and after, the whole city and the view is incredible.

4. FRANZ TOST (team principal, Toro Rosso)

As the only night race on the calendar, the Singapore Grand Prix represents the sport's ability to think of new ways to make the overall show more interesting. The guys here are carrying out one of the thousands of practice pit stops they do during the course of a season and it highlights key elements of the sport, namely speed, precision and teamwork.

5. NICO ROSBERG (driver, Mercedes)

6. MARTIN BRUNDLE (F1 commentator)

9. CHRISTIAN HORNER (team principal, Red Bull)

This is a photo of my two miniature donkeys. Bobby is on the left and it's Betsy close up.

10. MAX CHILTON (driver, Marussia)

Singapore. Wow, what a Grand Prix circuit. The only way to view it - at night! I won there in GP2 in 2012 so returning for my F1 debut a year later was really special.

11. STEFANO DOMENICALI (team principal, Ferrari)

Our drivers, together. In this sport teamwork is the most important thing and in Ferrari we have a great team, made up of people who are progressing together and who can now show what they are capable of.

12. PAUL DI RESTA (ex-driver, Force India)

I took this during the drivers' parade in Singapore. It's a rare moment before the race when you really get to soak up the atmosphere. It's one of the best events of the year and this photo helps sum up the spectacular nature and challenge of the track.

13. MARK WEBBER (former driver, Red Bull Racing)

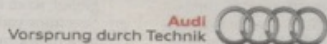
This is a shot I took while cycling in the French Alps during the F1 break.

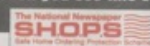

The fifth annual Zoom auction of photographs taken by the stars of Formula 1 takes place this Friday (February 3).

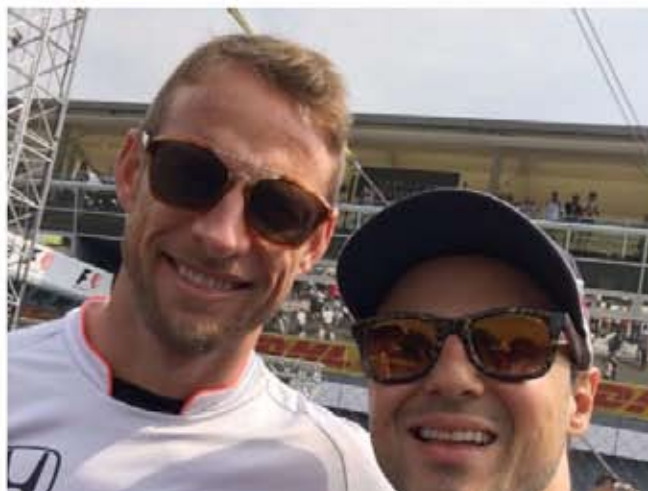
Drivers and heads of teams including F1 world champion Nico Rosberg, Daniel Ricciardo, Fernando Alonso, Sebastian Vettel and Eric Boullier have submitted photos for the auction in aid of Starlight Children's Foundation, the event's official charity partner.

Throughout the 2016 season, F1's drivers and team principals each took a snapshot of their world. The 2017 line-up will be auctioned by Coys in the ballroom of the InterContinental London Park Lane at a star-studded event on February 3.

Approximately half of the images are held for an online auction, in which anybody can participate. Head to <http://www.coys-zoom.co.uk/> to bid for a unique slice of F1.

Zoom, which has raised almost £100,000 for charity since it was launched in late 2012, is the only auction of signed photos taken by the stars of any sport. It gives fans a glimpse behind the scenes of the often cloistered world of top-level motorsport and also provides an insight into how F1's superstars enjoy themselves away from it.

The photos are like personal postcards from the sport's biggest names and they have been taken all over the world.

Images providing a glimpse of life in the **Formula One** circus have been auctioned at an occasion attended by star drivers and team principals, raising more than £20,000 for **Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity**.

The third annual **Zoom Charity Gala Auction** featured F1's drivers, team principals and well-known faces within the world of motor racing, including Lewis Hamilton, Jenson Button and Sebastian Vettel, as well as the sport's boss Bernie Ecclestone, who each took photographs for the initiative.

A selection of the photos, along with four Nikon Coolpix S9700 cameras signed by world champions such as Sir Jackie Stewart and Mika Hakkinen were auctioned by Chris Routledge of Coys, who also conducted bidding for the signed photographs.

Some of the biggest sellers from the evening were photographs submitted by Ecclestone (sold for £2,400), former Marussia CEO Graeme Lowdon (sold for £1,400), double world champion Fernando Alonso (sold for £1,100) and 1996 champion Damon Hill (sold for £900).

Some of the most notable faces within F1 were in attendance on Friday evening, including Ecclestone, Adrian Newey, Max Mosley, Eric Boullier and Claire Williams. Gen Halliwell, whose romantic black and white "selfie" with her fiancé Christian Homer sold for £800, led the celebrity contingent with Adrian Smith from Iron Maiden, Scott Gorham from Thin Lizzy and Stephanie Powers. The evening was hosted by the BBC's F1 presenter Suzi Perry.

Formula One drivers, team principals and its boss Bernie Ecclestone have once again contributed images they have taken to the **Zoom charity auction**.

Many of the images, which have been signed by the photographer, will be auctioned during a gala evening in London on January 16, with the remainder being offered in an online auction shortly afterwards.

This is the third annual **Zoom** event, with money raised going to the Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity, an official charity of the sport.

Throughout a tense 2014 season, F1 drivers, team bosses and its impresario were each asked to take a photograph that represented a snapshot of their world, to provide fans with a unique insight into the lives of those most closely involved in the sport. The results will be auctioned by Coys during an event hosted by the BBC's F1 presenter Suzi Perry at London's Intercontinental Park Lane on January 16.

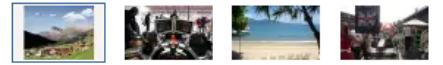
Sebastian Vettel (Red Bull), world champion
