

PEEPS SHOULD BE COMFORTABLE WITH CASTING ON AND OFF, AS WELL AS KNITTING AND PURLING IN THE ROUND

Are you ready to make the easiest, and dare we say CUTEST COWL EVA? Using your fav thick n thin yarn you can whip up a fun, fancy-looking cowl in absolutely no time, with very little thought involved. The perfect knitflix project, if we do say so ourselves.

This fabulous cowl only uses one skein of yarn!

Glossary:
K - Knit | P - Purl | CO - Cast On
BO - Bind Off | st(s) - Stitches

Size & Gauge:

One size fits all! Gauge is not super essential - we recommend getting a swatch you're happy with and going for it!

Yarns:

• 1 skein of <u>Bamboo Bloom</u> or <u>Borgo de'Pazzi Bibi</u>

Pro tip: these 2 yarns create very different cowls! (or use approx 150 yards of a similar gauge thick and thin yarn)

Needles n' Notions:

- 6mm (US 10) 16 inch circular knitting needle (We like <u>Chiaogoo</u> and <u>Lykke</u>!)
- 1 stitch marker
- A darning needle for weaving in ends



Two yarns, same pattern. Two very different results!

Pattern:

CO 70 stitches using a long tail cast on method, join to work in the round. Place marker for beginning of round.

Knit following the simple rule, explained below!

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The Simple Rule: always knit when the working yarn is thinner, and purl when the working yarn is thicker.

Simply put, you will be knitting most of the time, and purling whenever you come across a nice, big bump in your working yarn.

Work in pattern until piece measures 11 inches, or until you have concerns about running out of yarn before casting off.

BO loosely so that you can get your gorgeous head through the cowl. We recommend wet blocking your own for extra drape!

To make a double cowl: cast on 160 stitches and follow the pattern. (Note: you will need 2 to 3 skeins of required yarn.)

Give yourself a high five because you've just finished The Simple Rules Cowl!
