


Starter Kit Instruction

How to:



Hinoki Label Book

Use each page as a whole, or follow the stamp tear lines to carefully separate into two parts. Perfect for scrapbooking, layering, making notes or sending a mini postcard.



Hinoki Print-on Sticker Sheets

Choose your desired pattern and snip from the sheet with scissors. Once ready to stick, remove the back paper and place face down onto the page. Apply pressure evenly with a flat and hard object, then slowly peel off the film layer to see the result.

Tip - practice with a small pattern first



Hinoki Iron Clip

Ideal for securing your journal pages open and flat whilst journaling, and for clipping your most treasured ephemera together. Perfect for using it with our Hinoki Travel Notebook.



Handmade Paper Pack

Add textures and a vintage aesthetic with these crafted handmade papers; simply tear or cut them into different shapes.





Hinoki Wax Seal Stickers

A perfect addition to your pen-pal envelopes or for decoration and crafts. Simply peel off the back film and secure it to your paper of choice, for the academia aesthetic.



Hinoki Loose Frame Labels

Decorate your page with two types of textured frame labels. Try putting the hollow frames over your favourite pressed leaves and flowers, mix and match with the print-on stickers, or write down your thoughts within or over the frames.



Hinoki Train Ticket Stickers

Take a trip on the Hinoki Express with us. Simply remove the adhesive backing and stick to the pages of your journal. Use as they are or cut them up into sections.



Lace Fabrics

Add delicate touches to your pages with these lace fabrics. Stick them in your scrapbook or use them to decorate the edges of your pen-pal letters and envelopes, or even use them as hair ribbons.



Paper Laces

Experiment with the two different sizes of the paper laces, bringing a touch of romance and elegance to your theme. Cut/tear them up and stick them on different paper textures and colours (e.g. kraft paper).

Tip - draw some patterns on them or use coffee or tea to dye them for an extra vintage aesthetic.
