TEMPERATURE + STORAGE

Keep Dubia Roaches Between 50°F And 80°F. They can survive higher and lower temperatures, but they may become stressed. Maintain this range to maximize their health and longevity, and to keep stress levels low. A dark, quiet spot in your home that stays between 62°F and 72°F for most of the day and night, for example, would do nicely. Dubia Roaches Prefer Small And Dark Spaces. Dubia roaches prefer small spaces, so you do not need to transfer them into a larger one to keep them happy. Please leave the paper egg cartons in the container, because the roaches need this harborage for crawling on and hiding inside. The darker the enclosure, the better. Also, make sure to keep the lid on the container when you are not using the feeders to avoid any escapees!

DIET + NUTRITION

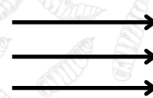
Provide Fresh Fruits And Vegetables. They are very healthy, and they're part of the Dubia Roach's natural diet. In addition to satisfying their hydration needs, they also provide excellent nutrition. Remove any uneaten food remnants from the enclosure before mold forms. This is especially important with high water content foods that break down quickly. Examples include apples, bananas, leafy greens, and moistened pet foods. Carrots and potato slices are examples of foods that tend to last longer and require less frequent changing.

ADDITIONAL + INFORMATION

Consider feeding your Dubia Roaches plants that contain the nutrients you want your animals to eat. For example, you might choose vegetables with lots of calcium or carotenoids if your animal needs more of these nutrients. Also keep in mind that for any animal, dietary diversity is almost always better than monotony, so mixing it up is often a good idea.



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
