

Oversized and Soft Unicorn Plushie



Supplies:

- 3 pairs of socks
- Poly-fil
- Felt: pink, white and black
- Embroidery Floss: pink and coordinating with socks and hair
- Metallic thread for horn
- Yarn for hair
- Hot glue or fabric glue
- Needle and coordinating thread (sewing machine is helpful)



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KEY:

- SEW
- CUT

STEPS:

1. Take 1 sock and cut it off just past the curve of the heel (See Pic 1)
2. Stuff quite full, following the shape of a unicorn head and then sew shut (See Pic 2)
3. Sew along the outside of the sock, using a hidden stitch, where the muzzle widens out for the head (See Pic 3)
4. Tighten that thread just slightly to help hold the muzzle shape. Knot it off.
5. Take another sock then stuff $\frac{2}{3}$ of the sock as full as possible to create the body.
6. Cut it off at the base and sew the opening shut. Sewn part will be at the bottom on the back (See Pic 4)
7. Attach the head to the body (See Pic 5)
8. To make legs, take 4 socks, turn wrong side out and mark for sewing (See Pic 6)
9. Sew on the lines, double stitch if sewing with machine.
10. Cut just to the side of the lines then across the top (See Pic 6), setting aside two of the large cut off portions for the ears.
11. Turn right side out, stuff and turn edges in.
12. Sew legs into position (See Pic 7)






13. Cut out horn template, then trace onto felt and cut out.
14. Sew the horn (See Pic 8)
15. Flip horn so seam is on inside, then stuff with Poly-fil.
16. Using metallic thread, push the thread up inside through the point of the horn, then hem-stitch down the horn in a spiral pattern (See Pic 9)
17. Attach the horn to the head, using thread that matches the horn.
18. Cut out the large ear template, then trace on set-aside sock scrap, sew and cut out, then flip right-side out (do 2x).
19. Cut out small ear template, then trace onto pink felt and cut out (do 2x).
20. Glue small ears onto middle of large ears (See Pic 10)
21. Folding the bottom of the ear in half, stitch together (See Pic 11)
22. Attach the ear to the unicorn
23. Repeat 21 and 22 for second ear.
24. Cut out eye template, then trace onto black felt and cut out (do 2x).
25. Glue the eyes onto the unicorn. OPTIONAL: Embroider the eyes using black thread instead of felt eyes.
26. Stitch on the smile using coordinating thread.
27. Cut out leg heart template, then trace onto pink felt and cut out (do 4x).
28. Glue the hearts onto the ends of the legs.
29. Cut out nose heart template, then trace onto pink felt and cut out.
30. Glue the heart onto nose position.
31. To make the hair, cut strips of yarn into strips 2x the desired length of each strand (if you want it to hang down 6", cut a 12" piece).
32. Lay the yarn, centered length-wise in the desired position (See Pic 12)
33. Sew into place using thread that matches the yarn.
34. Repeat same process for tail.




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
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HORN



LARGE EAR




SMALL EAR
