- 1. What are some connections between *Animal Farm* and *Planet* of the Apes?
- 2. How is the *Planets of the Apes* an example of a dystopia?
- 3. How do the orangutans try to suppress knowledge?
- 4. How is the society of the apes unequal? Here's a quote from the film to think about: "All apes are equal," says Dr. Zaius. "It appears some are more equal than others," says Taylor.



- 5. Planet of the Apes was made in the 1960's during a time of great change in America. What specific struggle from this time period could Planet of the Apes symbolize?
- 6. How many of you saw the twist ending coming? What clues were given the viewers concerning the ending?
- 7. Taylor accuses Dr. Zaius of acting out of fear. Does fear drive the actions of dictators? Explain.
- 8. What does the ending of the film mean? How does it explain the rest of the film?
- 9. How is the ape society a class system?
- 10. What does *Planet of the Apes* have to say about the issue of animal rights? Explain.
