SOMEBODY FLUNKED KINDERGARTEN

In simpler times, everybody took for granted the main points described in Robert Fulghum's classic regarding the "Golden Rule" and sane living. Ultimately we must come to the realization that despite the importance of knowledge, we are what we do, not what we know, think or say.

Knowledge is power. The responsibility of acquiring knowledge is applying what we have learned into positive action. In that regard, too many of us flunked Kindergarten.

Question: What's the difference between a smart man and a dumb man?

Answer: Absolutely nothing. They both think they know everything.

WHY DO PEOPLE DO STUPID THINGS?

Here are some of the reasons. Maybe you can add to the list.

- Fear: Paralysis
- Laziness: No need to check if it's safe or not.
- Carelessness: Rush, rush, rush
- Fatigue: Burn out Just hope it's not your doctor, pilot, or dentist
- Social Pressure: "What will the Cool people think?"
- Addictions: "I can't help it."
- Ignorance: "I didn't know" Ignorance is not bliss.
- Denial: "Not Me!" If you don't think it will happen to you then you won't take any precautions.
- Blame: "Somebody told me to do it!" Benjamin Franklin once said that he who is good at making excuses is seldom good for anything else.

WHERE HAVE ALL THE WISE ONES GONE?

The wisdom of the ages seems to be stranded in books stacked up on shelves in our libraries, only released in graduate theses when required, mostly relegated to footnotes that nobody reads.

So who can help prevent us from doing stupid things in a crisis? Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, Aquinas, Augustine, Confucius are not forgotten but sorely ignored when we need their wisdom most. Instead, we get the opinions of the "experts" who tell us what we must do and how we must live.

EXPERTS

A colleague who also conducts Active Shooter Training workshops for schools once told me he doesn't believe there are any experts. If there was such a person who knows exactly what to do to solve a problem, then there would no longer be a problem.

It shouldn't surprise us that "for every expert, there is an equal and opposite expert." (Arthur C. Clarke) Robertson Davies was even more to the point. "We all create an outward self with which to face the world, and some people come to believe that is what they truly are. So they people the world with doctors who are nothing outside of the consulting room, and judges who are nothing when they are not in court, and businessmen who wither with boredom when they have to."

WHO'S IN CHARGE?

A truck driver got the top of his semi-truck stuck under an underpass one day when he took a risk and thought he had enough clearance.

First the executives brought in a supervisor from the highway department, the supervisor immediately called an engineer. The engineer tried to figure out an elaborate way to raise the underpass up, so the truck could be freed without damage.

A little boy, named Cooper, on his way back from fishing at the nearby pond kept trying to get the engineer's attention. "Hi Sir!! Hi MISTER!" But he was ignored as the engineer's assistant yelled at him to keep back because they were doing dangerous, important work.

The highway department supervisor evaluated the engineer's plans and thought it was too complicated and too expensive, so he came up with another idea. He called a contractor with heavy equipment, who came out to the scene and said, "Maybe if we dig out the road under the truck with a backhoe? Then it will lower the truck and it can be driven off."



Cooper was jumping up and down to get the contractor's attention.. "Hi Sir!! Hi MISTER!" The contractor just scowled at the little boy. "Don't bother us now kid. We got an emergency here."

The precocious little boy wouldn't give up trying to get the truck driver's attention. "Hi Sir! Hi, MISTER!" The truck driver, who felt sorry for ignoring the kid, smiled at him and said, "What is it?"

"Mister, I know what to do!" Cooper said. "JUST LET THE AIR OUT OF THE TIRES!"

I always loved that story because it demonstrates clearly to the ones in charge, the "EXPERTS," that maybe they do not know best and maybe they do not have all the answers... maybe because they are not asking the right questions.



COMMON SENSE APPROACH: A Different Perspective

How many times have you heard someone say, "That's just plain common sense," or read in the news, "Just use your common sense." Based on these comments, it seems that people assume that everyone has or should have what is known as "common sense" and that people are born with this innate, practical wisdom. As a matter of fact, a nationwide survey reveals that the majority of Americans believe that a high level of common sense can lead to healthier, happier and more successful lives.

So the question remains, why is common sense not common practice? We believe that common sense is a life skill that has to be developed. Only a part of our intelligence is inherent in our genes. However, we have the ability to develop and enhance the rest of our Common Sense Perception.

COMMON SENSE FORMULA = IQ + EQ + VR + EX

• IQ = Intelligence

Einstein is an example of a genius who was extremely strong mathematically while being relatively weak verbally. Book smarts is another way to describe the analytical skills measured by IQ tests.

• EQ = Emotional Intelligence

An individual's ability to manage him or herself as well as other relationships. It consists of four fundamental capabilities of self-awareness, self management, social awareness, and social skill. Employers now recognize that an individual with high EQ makes for good leadership potential and is a competitive edge in the marketplace.

• VR = Virtual Reality

This is our label for learning that takes place through multiple learning styles such as visual learning, auditory learning, musical learning. For example, we learn from watching movies, by listening to recordings, by hearing stories, parables and fables read aloud to us. We learn about ethics and philosophy from proverbs and speeches or from mentors and the example of others. It's visualizing how to dance before we actually do the dance steps.

• EX = Experience

We learn by actually doing the deed and succeeding so we know what works; or failing so we know what doesn't work. As Marilyn vos Savant, the woman with the highest IQ ever recorded said, "If you don't make mistakes, you probably don't know much."

An individual with a highly developed common sense perception has a critical balance of all four qualities and continues to develop them regularly. Which of these are you most comfortable with? Do you consider yourself more analytical or creative? Do you think you are more practical or theoretical?

The following story dramatically illustrates the difference between the two. Two students from a prestigious Ivy League school were camping in Yellowstone Park when they came across a grizzly bear. The first student, an academic whiz with a full scholarship, immediately calculates that the bear can reach them in exactly 19 seconds. "No way we can outrun him," he tells his companion who is putting on his running shoes. The other boy, who barely passed his entrance exams, says to his friend: "I don't need to outrun the bear. I just need to outrun you."

As a follow up on that thought, practical intelligence versus intellectual intelligence, did you know that scientists involved in the creation of Artificial Intelligence (AI) are at a loss when it comes to instilling common sense reasoning into it's robotic computers. The reason is the difficulty of programming emotional intelligence into their systems.

Question: In an emergency, which doctor would you choose to help your child?

- 1. Dr. with 10 degrees, 10 honorary titles, published 10 books, no patients.
- 2. Dr. with one degree, 10 years experience, multiple children patients.



Circle of Influence



COVD 19 Lockouts Mandates

Unintended Disastrous Consequences

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Remember what seems like a lifetime ago, we were sent invitations to workshops and conferences at the schools regarding emergency plans for countering Bullying and Cyber Bullying among the student body. We were encouraged to talk to counselors, teachers and administrators. We were asked to participate in antibullying efforts to combat the spread of bullying through the technology every student held in the palm of his hand. Parent participation was encouraged.

Active Shooter Training was the next required training. Parents were again asked to help prepare their children for the sometimes traumatic drills for every class. Board meetings were held to discuss how best to install new barriers on the outside of the school buildings. Parent input on what security system would be best to monitor the interior of the campus. Again, parents were advised and encouraged to submit their comments and suggestions.

BETRAYED

Is it any wonder then, that parents and grandparents felt betrayed when so many of our neighborhood schools just shut down and literally locked us out. There were no Parent-Teacher meetings to discuss options."

The parking lots were gated. Entrances to indoor facilities were chained. Access to outdoor facilities were blocked. Calls were not returned. Voicemail boxes were full.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Many schools stayed open.

Many schools chose to shut down.

Many schools were told to shut down by their local or state agencies

Many schools opted for a hybrid system.

WHAT DID YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOL DO?

RECKONING

The usual management term used to evaluate the response to an emergency is "post-assessment." After two years plus of our reaction, response and treatment of the pandemic in our schools, I believe the more appropriate term is the one I am using here "RECKONING."

Reckoning signifies not just an evaluation, it clearly suggests a "Price to Pay."

PRICE TO PAY

Preliminary reports are now substantiating our worst fears. The repercussions of imposing lockouts, at home instruction, mask mandates and one way only approaches will be felt for years to come.

DYA: DO YOU AGREE?

Every child is unique, so every one of our children's health, mental and safety treatment should also be unique.

UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES

Many of our schools mandated draconian rules with no exceptions and cited emergency powers. So why did we act surprised when we were faced with the following unintended consequences on our student population on every level Kindergarten through College.

- Bullycide
- Drug Overdose
- Mental Illness
- High School Drop-outs
- Domestic Violence
- Divorce
- Decrease in math and reading scores
- Increase in emotional needs
- Depression

COMMON SENSE

ZOOM WORLD

Would it surprise you to know that many teachers were blindsided by the ramifications of the Lockouts. Some of our schools opted for a hybrid system so that some students would be on campus and others would participate in the day's lessons via ZOOM.

Ironically, it was not the students who had difficulty with the technology of using Zoom, it was the teachers and the parents who were asked to monitor their kids on the platform.

PULLING BACK THE CURTAIN


For the very first time because of a confluence of unforeseen circumstances, parents had the opportunity to witness first hand their children's teachers in action on the computer laptop. Many parents, of course, sat in on their children activities in elementary school but never had a chance to do so for their older kids. What they witnessed was sometimes stunning, sometimes shocking.

Many parents were impressed by the professionalism of so many instructors who could handle teaching 15 children in the classroom while at the same time interacting with another 30 students who were participating from their homes.

On the other hand, many parents were taken aback by the lack of training their children and teachers were given on how to use the Zoom platform and were frustrated in their attempts to help, often because of equipment failure on the schools part, or procedural shortcomings on their own. Many parents found themselves basically home schooling their children without the proper guidance in the technology.

SECRETS EXPOSED

Most disturbing was the incriminating evidence piling up regarding the content. Subject matter did not seem to match the school's purported curriculum on file for the grade level in question. Even more surprising was the attitude from the school staff that students should not tell their parents what was happening in the classrooms. At times, students were asked to keep information from their parents.



HELICOPTER VIEW

To clarify our comments regarding schools. We usually recommend that people make sure to take the Helicopter View before forming any opinions outside of their own personal observations.

First of all, every school campus is unique. Therefore every school's policies and curriculum must be unique:

- Unique to the student body, enrollment, gifts and potential;
- Unique to the faculty and staff with their talents and capabilities;
- Unique to the school campus grounds, buildings, utilities;
- Unique to the location with its benefits and hazards;
- Unique to the community and its resources.

Taking the Helicopter view reminds us that what is going on around the country where the news centers are located, do not necessarily reflect on what is happening in our own neighborhood school. This is the reason we recommend focusing on what we can control.

Develop the background you need to ask the difficult questions. Develop the priorities to help you find the answers to the challenges facing your school.



The goal and the vision should be "How can we improve?" "How can I make a difference?" "What can we do better so this crisis doesn't happen again?"


RULE OF BENJAMIN

- 1. Does it help our children?
- 2. Does it hurt our children?
