What's Included:

- Tov arch
- Storage organiser (+2 clips)
- Padded base

Cot frame

- 2-in-1 hood and mosquito net
- Bassinet (+6 poles)
- Changing table (+4 poles)

HOW TO SET UP THE COT FRAME:

NB The cot frame must be fully assembled and securely locked before adding any accessories. Do not use excess force as this will damage the cot. If the base does not lock down with ease, then try each step again.

NOTE: DO NOT push the cot base down yet. The side rails of the frame must be fully erected BEFORE lowering the base. The top rails will not lock properly if the base is pushed down first.

- 1. To set up the top rails, you will feel a lock at the centre of each rail. Hold one hand on each short rail lock and pull up sharply until you hear a click. Both sides of each lock should be rigid. Do the same for all four sides.
- 2. Once all four top rails are locked in place, push down the centre handle. The central mechanism will rotate and engage the safety lock in place.
- 3. Place the padded base at the bottom of the cot if you are not using the bassinet.
- 4. If you experience difficulty and one side of the rail will not lock but the other will, unlock the rail fully by squeezing the rail release button underneath the lock to try again, or start again at step 1.







ASSEMBLING THE CHANGING TABLE:

- 1. Insert the long curved bars into the long sleeves of the changing table.
- 2. Insert the smaller bars and ensure the metal buttons click in place.
- 3. The plastic connectors must face down in order to attach to the cot.



ASSEMBLING THE HOOD:

- 1. At the centre fold of each arch, locate the two tubes inside the fabric and slide together.
- 2. Attach to the cot using the poppers found on both the cot and hood.

ASSEMBLING THE BASSINET:

- 1. Secure the bassinet by zipping in place.
- 2. Using the 6 metal poles (3 male and 3 female), slot each pair together to make 3 long poles.
- 3. Insert the assembled poles into the loops on each short side of the bassinet.
- 4. Place the padded base into the bassinet with the padded side facing up.







HOW TO FOLD THE COT FRAME CLOSED:

NB Ensure all accessories are removed first. Do not use excess force as this will damage the cot. If the base or rails do not release with ease, then try each step again. Still stuck? Then visit the product page at www.rubymelon.com to view the instruction video, or contact hello@storkbrands.com for support.

NOTE: DO NOT unlock the rails yet, the cot base must be raised before the top tails will unlock.

- 1. Raise the centre by pulling the centre handlezz.
- 2. Ensure the centre is as high as the top rails and gather the legs together towards the cente.
- 3. At the cente of each rail, locate the rail release button found underneath each rail lock. With both hands on each long side, squeeze the release buttons until you feel the rails unlock, and then push down. The metal rails at the base will raise up ensure they fold inside the unlocked rails.
- 4. Do the same for the short sides. Gather the four corners and centre together tightly.
- 5. Wrap the padded base around the cot frame and secure using the three velrco fastenings.

KEEP INSTRUCTIONS FOR FUTURE USE.

GENERAL SAFETY GUIDE:

- Never leave your child unattended. Always keep your child in view while they are in the camp cot, even when sleeping.
- •Only one child should be in the camp cot at a time.
- •The camp cot is intended for a child that cannot climb out, and/or is less than 86cm tall, and/or is less than 14kg, whichever comes first.
- •The bassinet is intended for infants under 9kg, and/or cannot sit up or pull themselves up unaided, whichever comes first.
- Do not use this product unless it is correctly assembled with the top rails and base fully locked.
- •Do not use this product if any part is broken, torn, or missing.
- Before each use, inspect the camp cot for any damaged, broken or missing parts. Do not substitute parts from any other manufacturer or products.
- ·Use only the mattress supplied by the manufacturer.
- •Only use accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer.
- •To clean, wipe down with a damp cloth. Do not use bleach. Do not iron or tumble dry.

SUFFOCATON AND INJURY HAZARDS:

- •To avoid suffocation, the gap between the mattress and camp cot sides and ends should not be more than 3cm when the mattress is pulled tightly to one side. If using a bed sheet, the gap should not be more than 1cm.
- •Strings can cause strangulation. Do not suspend strings over the camp cot or attach strings to toys.
- •Do not place the camp cot near a window where cords from blinds or drapes may strangle the child.
- •Keep the camp cot away from stoves, heaters, campfires, and other hazards.

REDUCE THE RISK OF SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome):

- •SIDS can occur at any age before 12 months. It is most common between 1 to 4 months old, and less common after 8 months. It is advised to take precautions for the first 12 months to reduce the risk.
- *Pediatricians recommend that healthy infants be placed on their back to sleep.
- •Make sure the infants head and face remain uncovered during sleep.
- ·Avoid overheating and very tight wrapping.
- ${}^{\textstyle \bullet} \text{Never}$ use pillows, loose bedding or fabric, bumpers, or soft toys in the cot.
- ·Sleep in the same room as the infant.
