Silverclay Jewellery Making with Silverkupe

In this workshop, you will experience turning a material that looks like clay into 999 pure silver jewellery. Silverclay is a recycled product where silver from electronics, telephones etc mixed with an organic binder and turned into a clay form. After drying and firing stages organic binder burns off and what is left is pure silver which has more silver content than sterling silver.

You will be able to make 2 pieces of jewellery (for example: a set of small earrings or pendant charms and a small pendant). Price includes the silverclay, sterling silver jump ring for pendants, charms and/or earring wires and all the necessary tools to create your jewellery. No experience is necessary.

Emine Thomspon is a contemporary jewellery designer and maker. She specialises in limited collections of handmade jewellery in silver and gold with bold designs and colours.

With a background in design and 3D modelling and teaching these skills, she also provides various jewellery making workshops where she shares love of making and jewellery with others.
