What do TVs, fridges, microwaves, gaming consoles and plug-in heaters all have in common?

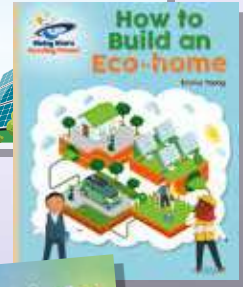
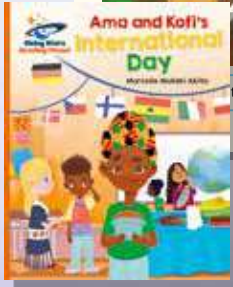
They all need electricity to work.

Most electricity is made in power stations that burn fossil fuels, such as coal and oil. These power stations release lots of carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide is a harmful gas that warms our planet.

Eco-homes are designed to use less electricity. Even so, they still need some power to make things inside them work.

An eco-home might have its own solar panels on the roof. These panels turn energy from the Sun into electricity. It might even have its own wind turbine, which uses energy from wind to make electricity.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF ...

Davinder Gill, Football Referee

My day starts quite early as there's no way I can be late arriving at the match I'm refereeing today. It'd mean the game would have to be abandoned. I travel around the country to referee and sometimes stay away overnight, but today I'm in my home town.

I usually research the two teams who are playing each other beforehand, but I know these local-league teams well already. I refereed a match between them last season, and it was a real challenge to keep order. I'm determined to be fully in control today.

I have a good, filling breakfast of porridge, but only a light lunch of soup before I head to the football ground. A referee has to be fit to keep up with end-to-end play, and you can't do that on a full stomach! When I arrive at the ground, I check the dressing-rooms and then the pitch, including the goalposts and nets. The players'

After checking I have my stopwatch, whistle and red and yellow cards, I meet my two assistant referees and fourth official (the time-keeper). No TVs or mobile phones or anyone except the match officials are allowed in the referee's room, so everything is seen to be fair and above board. The only people allowed in before kick-off are the clubs' managers with their team sheets.

When I was younger, my dream was to be a Premier League footballer. I was taken on trial as a teenager by a non-league club, but during a match I was roughly tackled and suffered a severe injury. My leg was badly broken, and the doctors told me that, while the break would heal over time, a career in professional football was no longer possible.

I was heartbroken, and it took me a long, long time to recover from the disappointment. But slowly I came around to the idea of training to be a referee instead because I still wanted to be involved with football.

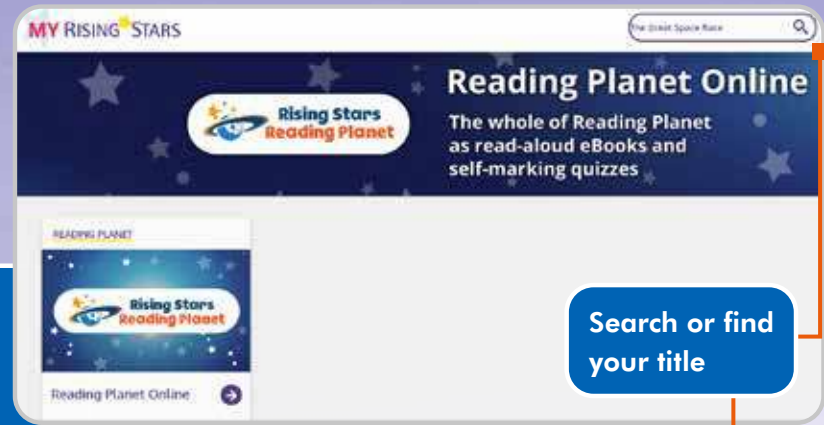

A NOTE FROM THE AUTHOR

I love to travel, and I'm fascinated by the many different ways that natural landscapes formed. I remember standing at the bottom of the Grand Canyon in the USA and looking up to see all the different layers of sedimentary rock making stripes on the canyon walls. Hiking down through them was like taking a trip back through time! The Grand Canyon took my breath away – and I hope you enjoy all the other breathtaking places in this book!

Now try this!

Get a camera, or a pencil and paper, and go for a walk in your local area. Take or draw a picture of a place that you think looks amazing – it could be in the countryside or in a town or city. Write a caption for your picture that explains where the place is and what is special about it.

Next time you are at the beach (or a park with a sand pit), use water to experiment with erosion. Pile the sand up...

DIG IN THE PIT

BOOK OVERVIEW

Dom and his baby brother, Sam, play in the sandpit but they both have very different ideas about how to dig in the pit!

AFTER READING

Return to the text:

- Talk about any words that the children found difficult to break down or pronounce.
- Discuss any words or concepts that they struggled to understand.
- Encourage the children to reflect on their learning. Ask them: Which part did you enjoy? Were any parts of the story tricky to understand? Use the comprehension questions at the end of the book to talk about the story and discuss the theme of playing with a sibling and/or playing in a sandpit.
- If time permits, ask the following to check understanding of the story and further explore the themes: Why do you think the boys were in the sandpit? How did the boys play in different ways? Why do you think this was? What would you do in the sandpit? Do you think Dom often played with his little brother?

Follow-up activities:

1. Using the worksheet, the children practise both blending and segmenting skills as well as applying the story content to their own life. The children read the phrases in the actions box. This is a list of actions that the children could do in a sandpit, for example, dig in it. Then they draw a picture of themselves in the sandpit, and write a phrase to show what they are doing in the sandpit in their picture.
2. The children draw pictures of their favourite part of the story and add labels or a sentence.

	Loud and quiet sounds
	Make a loud or quiet sound by tapping a drum or other instrument lightly and then more heavily. Ask the children to copy you, or produce their own loud/quiet sounds.
Children's response	Say loud or quiet, or indicate small or large with their hands. Copy or produce a loud or quiet sound.

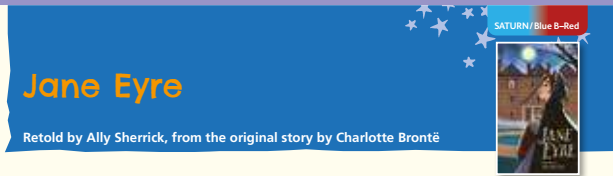

Book overview
This retelling of Charlotte Brontë's classic novel tells the story of orphan Jane Eyre's life from her childhood living with uncaring Aunt Reed until her eventual marriage to Mr Rochester of Thornfield Hall. The rich character and first-person narration of Jane and the mysteries surrounding Mr Rochester will provide lots of topics for discussion. The language used in the description of landscape, weather and the period setting will also be an effective stimulus for developing reading skills.

Discuss these key words with children to test understanding before reading or as you read.

This text and the suggested activities will support children to:
★ discuss and evaluate how authors use language, including figurative language, and consider how this has an impact on the reader
★ explain the meaning of words in context
★ identify the difference between structures used in informal speech and in more formal speech and writing.

Before reading
Show children the cover of the book and ask for their reaction to the cover illustration. Ask: *What does the illustration tell you about the story?* The most basic response could be that this is the story of a young woman and, looking at how she is dressed, it is set in the past. The setting also tells us that the story, or part of it, takes place in a big house. Point out the lighted window in the house. *Why do you think only one window is lit up?* This could hint at a mystery in the story.

Introduce *Jane Eyre* as a classic story written and set during Victorian times. It was first published in 1847. Assess children's prior knowledge of this period and discuss some of the key differences between Victorian times and the modern world. At this time, the government did not provide education for children. Many schools were private, and wealthy children were often educated at home. Society was more unequal than it is now, with many families employing servants, and there were far fewer opportunities for women.

During reading
Read Chapter 1 (pages 4–7) together as a class. This introduces the narrator and principal character, Jane Eyre, who begins the story living with her unpleasant aunt and cousins.
★ Ask: *What kind of mood does the author create at the start of the book?* Phrases like 'leafless shrubbery' and 'ceaseless rain' (both page 4) suggest a bleak setting, but we also soon learn that Jane does not want to be with her aunt and cousins.
★ Jane reports that her aunt tells her she doesn't 'deserve to be treated like a little children until I learned. Discuss why Jane is not content as an orphan and, as the incident her adopted family treat her.
★ *What impression do we get of Jane in this chapter?* Use e to support your ideas. Jane spite of lots of provocation she hides away and reads. the language reflects the u reads about 'desolate ship churchyards', etc.

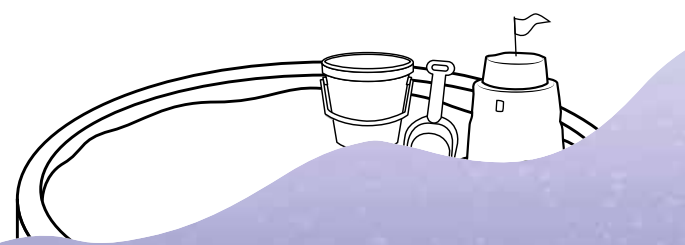

Guide to reading with your child

WHAT ARE BOOK BANDS?

Many reading schemes use coloured book bands to indicate the level of their books. But what do these colours mean? What if your child is on Yellow band but their friend is on Green? How long will it take for your child to be ready to move on to the next band? Can your child pick their favourite colours instead? Book bands may seem confusing at first, but they are a common system for grouping books according to their level of reading difficulty. Your child may

start reading books at the lowest level (Lilac or Pink), and move on to the next bands once their teacher feels they are ready. Using book bands helps children and teachers know which books are suitable to read at each stage of a child's reading journey. It's important to remember that it isn't a race to the finish, and that reading is about understanding as well as being able to successfully read (decode) words.
