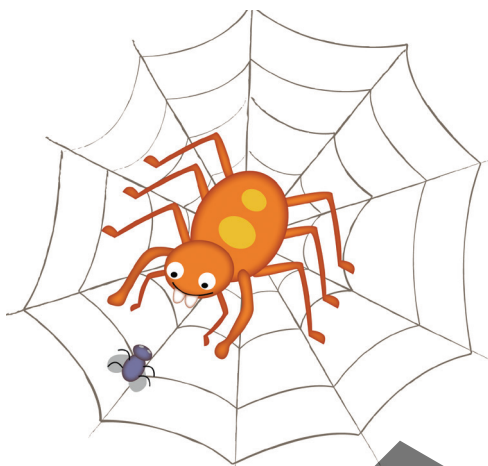
Spiders, Spiders Everywhere

<p>Q1: Let's talk about the cover. What do you see?</p> <p>A1: Possible answers: I see seven purple spiders. I see a girl who likes spiders. The spiders are friendly. They have spoons. I think the spiders want a bite of the girl's food.</p> <p>Q2: The girl on the cover is from a Mother Goose Rhyme. Do you know which one?</p> <p>A2: Yes! <i>Little Miss Muffet, sat on a tuffet, eating her curds and whey. Along came a spider who sat down beside her, and frightened Miss Muffet away!</i></p>	<p>Q1: Did you have fun counting the spiders? How many spiders are under the bed? In the tree? Behind the door?</p> <p>A1: Yes! I counted six spiders under the bed. I counted nine spiders in the tree, and five behind the door.</p> <p>Q2: Let's look at page 13. Does this remind you of another Mother Goose Rhyme?</p> <p>A2: Yes! The spider looks like Humpty Dumpty. Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall . . .</p>	<p>Q1: Is it easier to count the spiders on pages 14-15 or on page 16? Why?</p> <p>A1: It's easier to count the spiders on page 16. The spiders are on a graph and not scattered all over the page.</p> <p>Q2: How many spiders did you count on page 16?</p> <p>A2: I counted 55 spiders!</p>

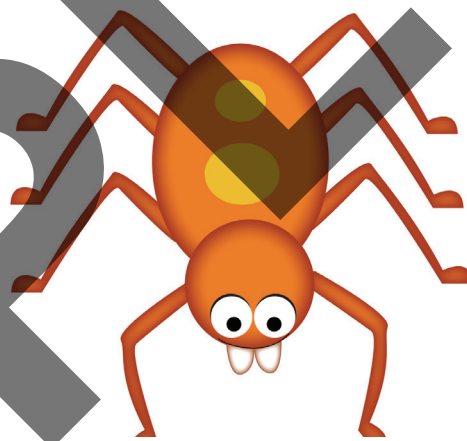
