She is thinking about playing dress-up. She is wondering how life was different long ago.</p>	<p>Q1: What did people do long ago?</p> <p>A1: Long ago, farmers plowed the fields. People traveled. They hunted for food. They lived in houses and cooked meals. Children long ago went to school.</p> <p>Q2: What do people do today?</p> <p>A2: People today do the same things but in different ways. For example: Farmers long ago used horses to plow the fields. Today, farmers use tractors. Long ago, people traveled with horse and buggies.
