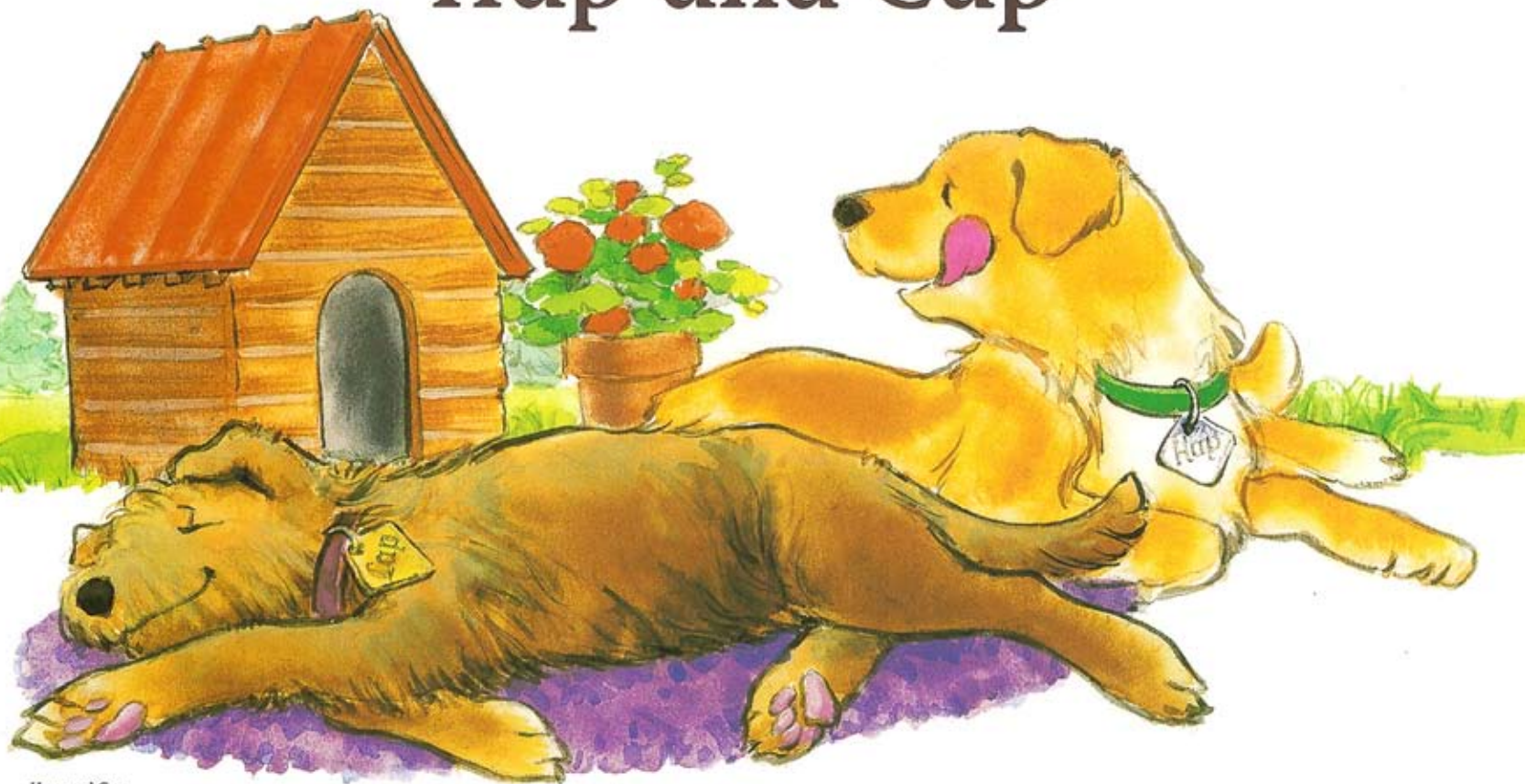

Hap and Cap

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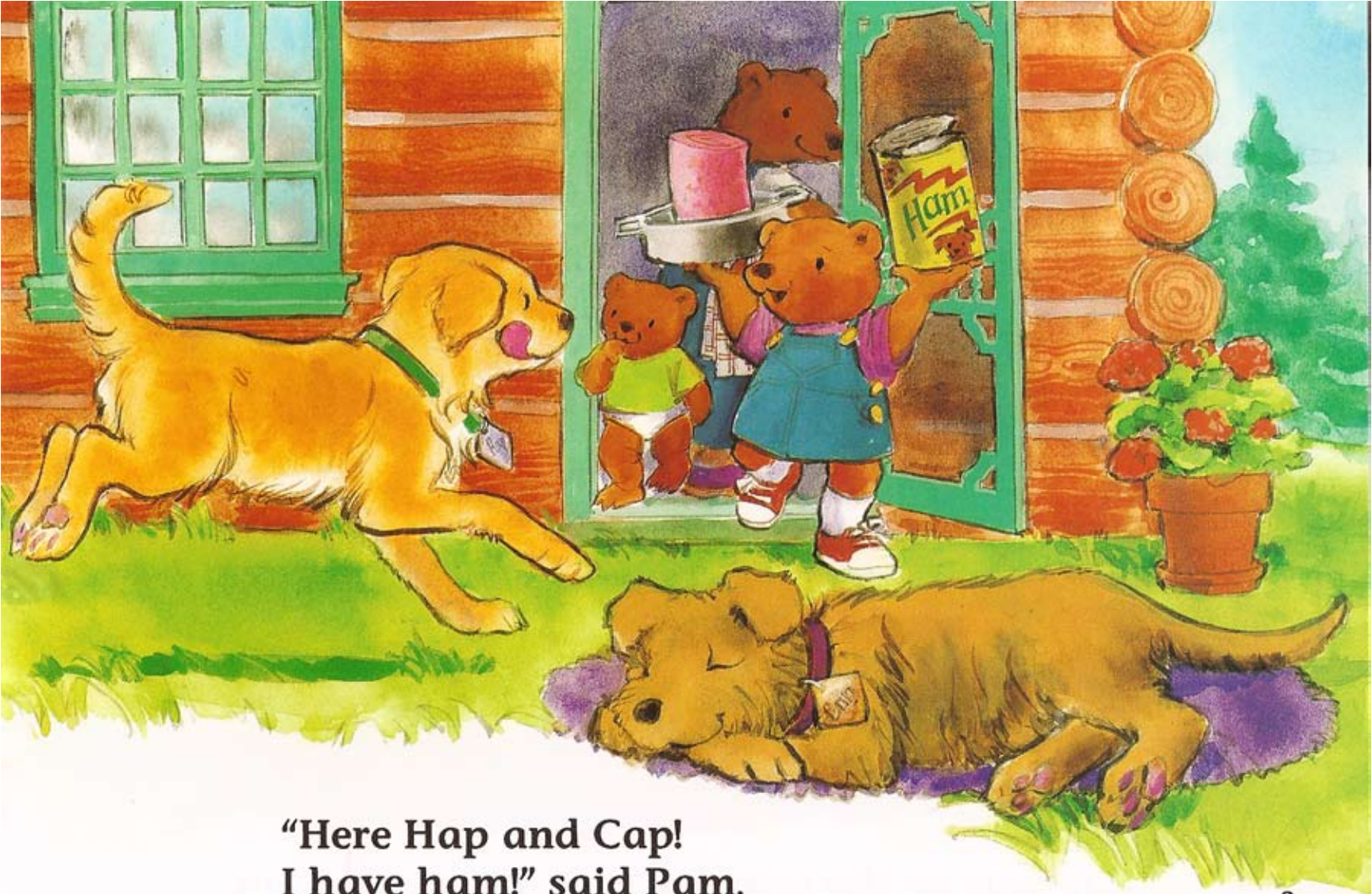
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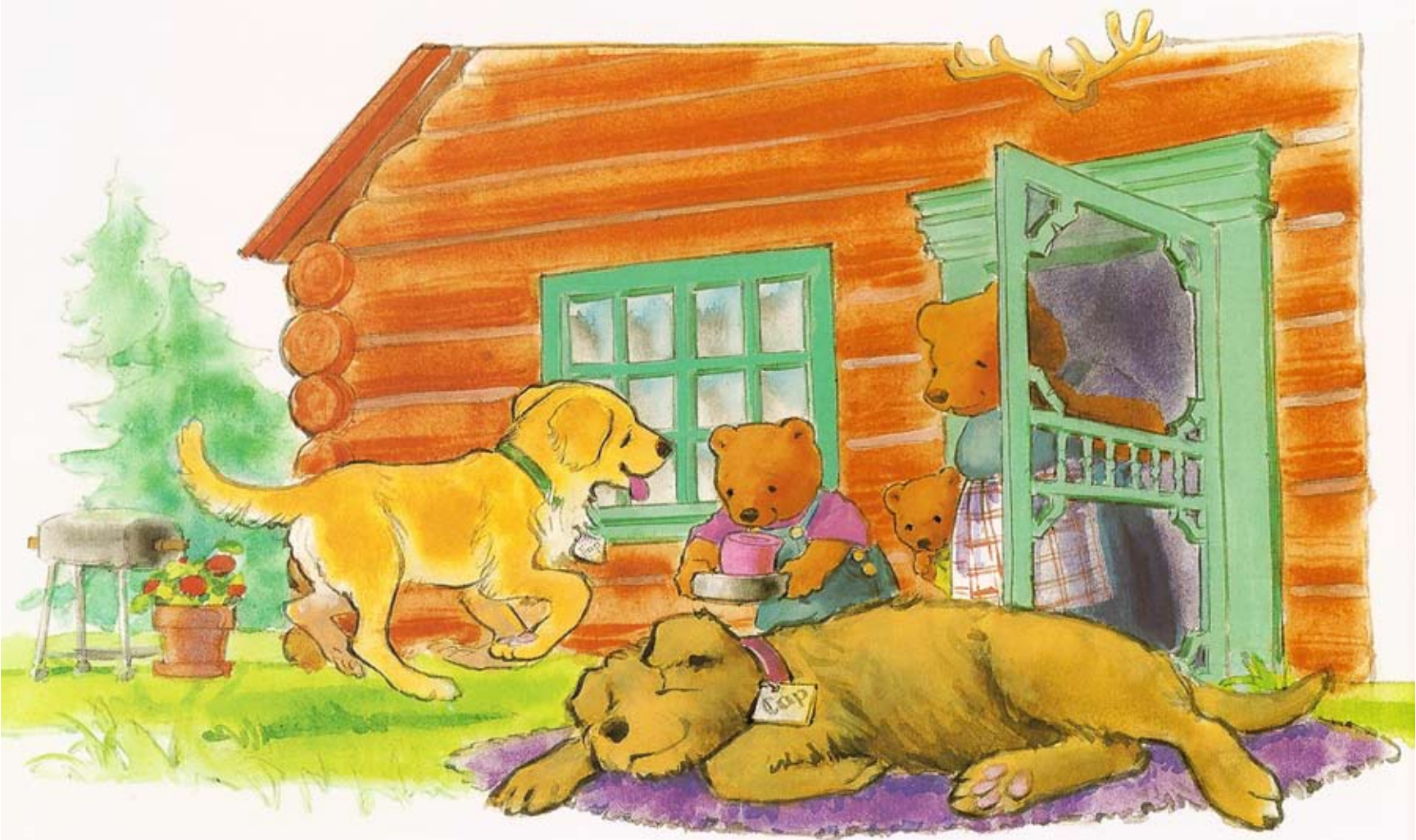
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"Hap! Cap!" said Pam.

I have ham!" said Pam.**



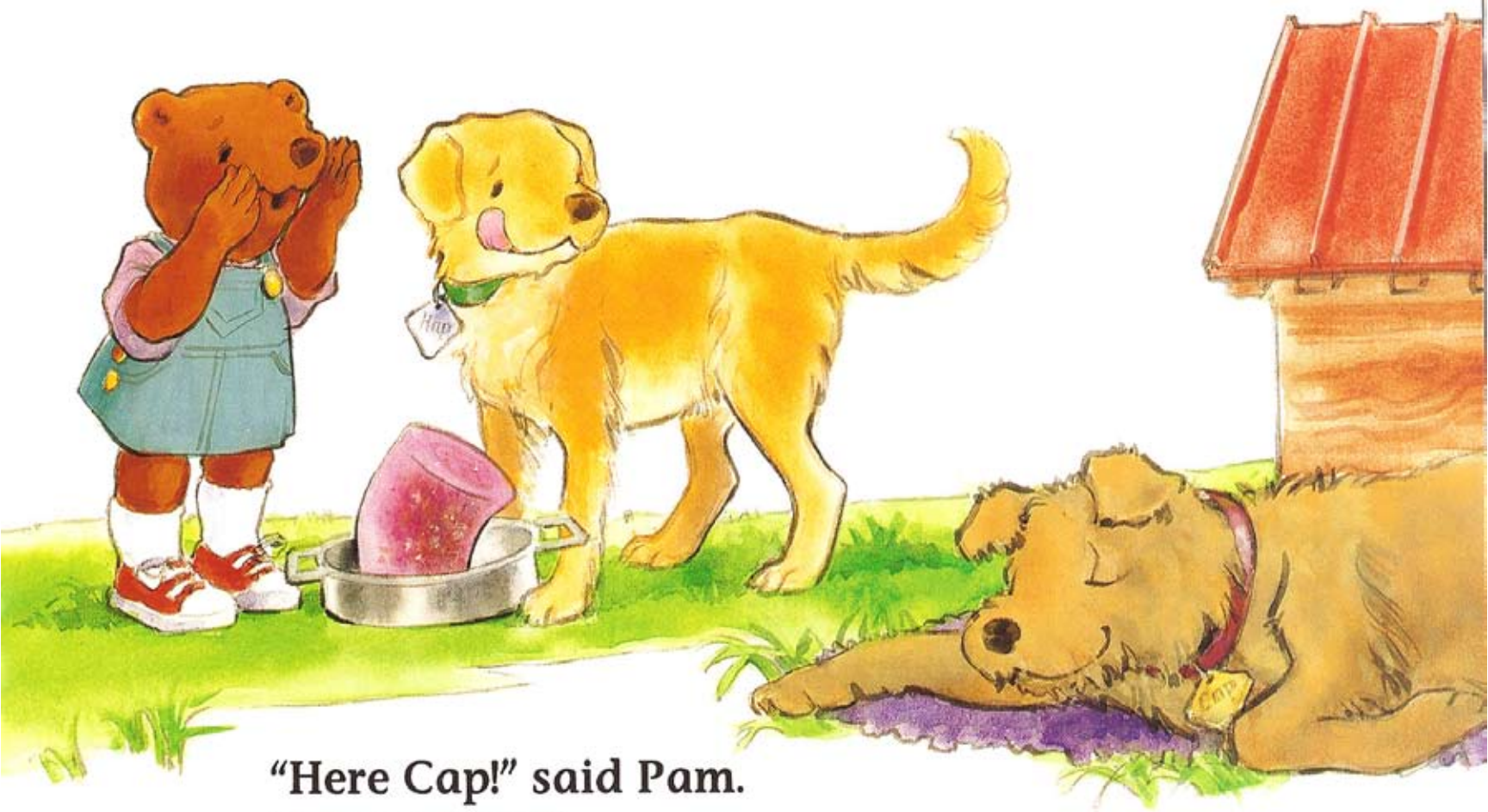
Cap was on the mat, but Hap ran to the pan.



Hap ran fast.



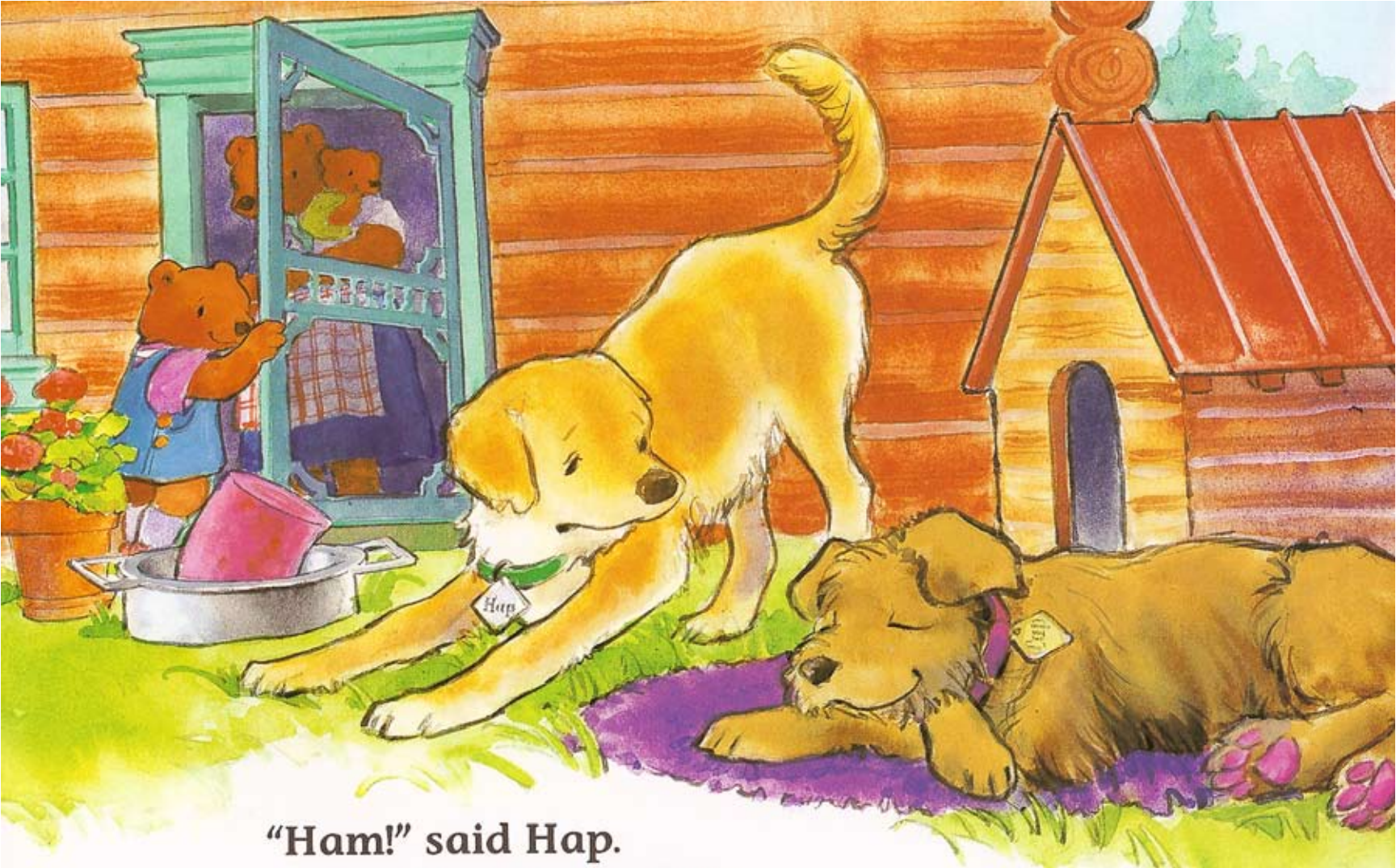
**"Ham!" said Hap.
"A can of ham! Mmm!"**



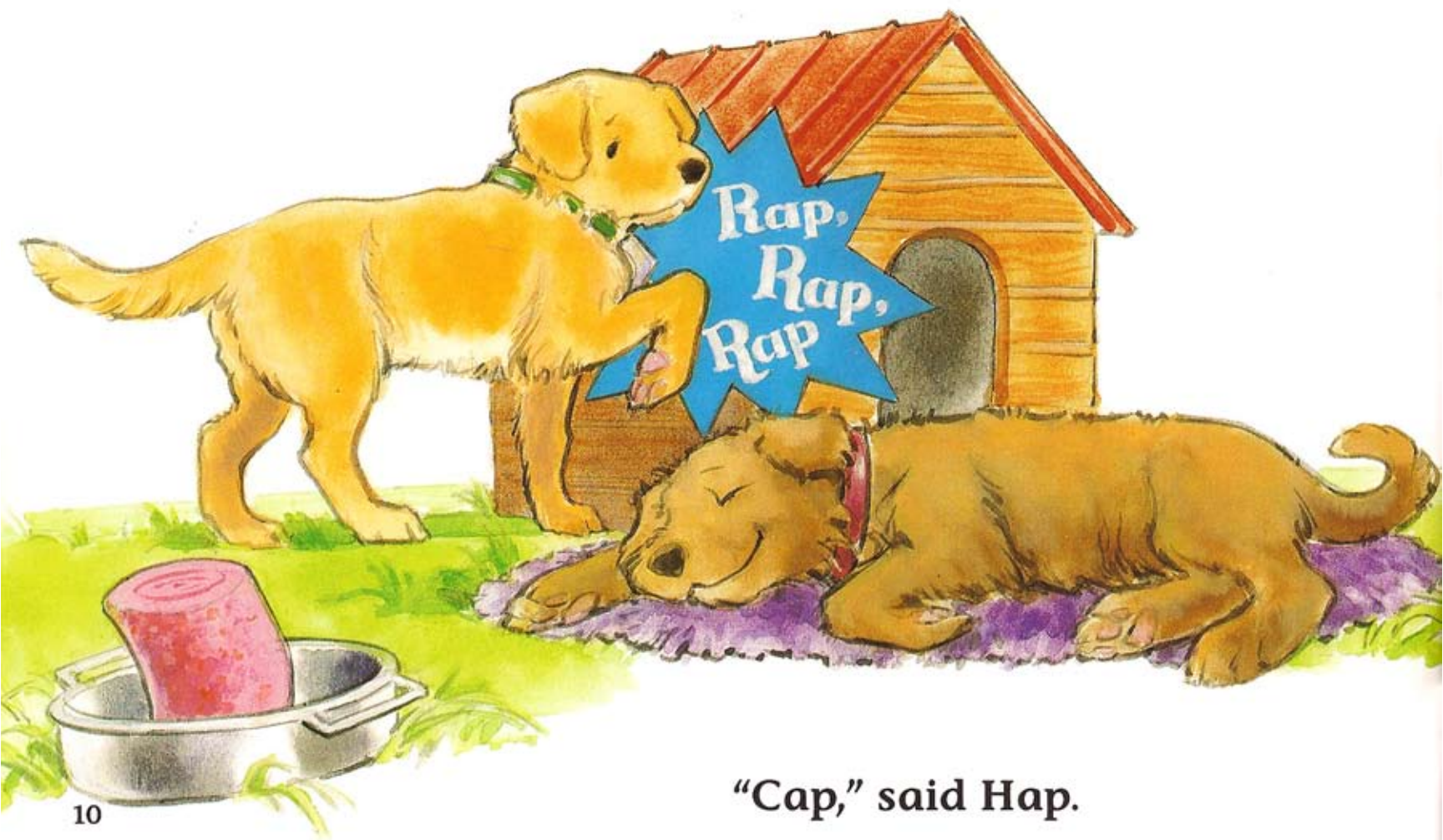
**“Here Cap!” said Pam.

Cap was on the mat, but Hap was at the pan.



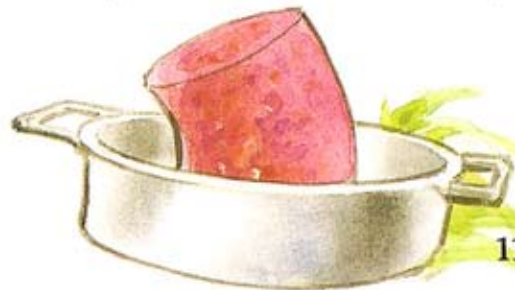
**"Ham!" said Hap.
