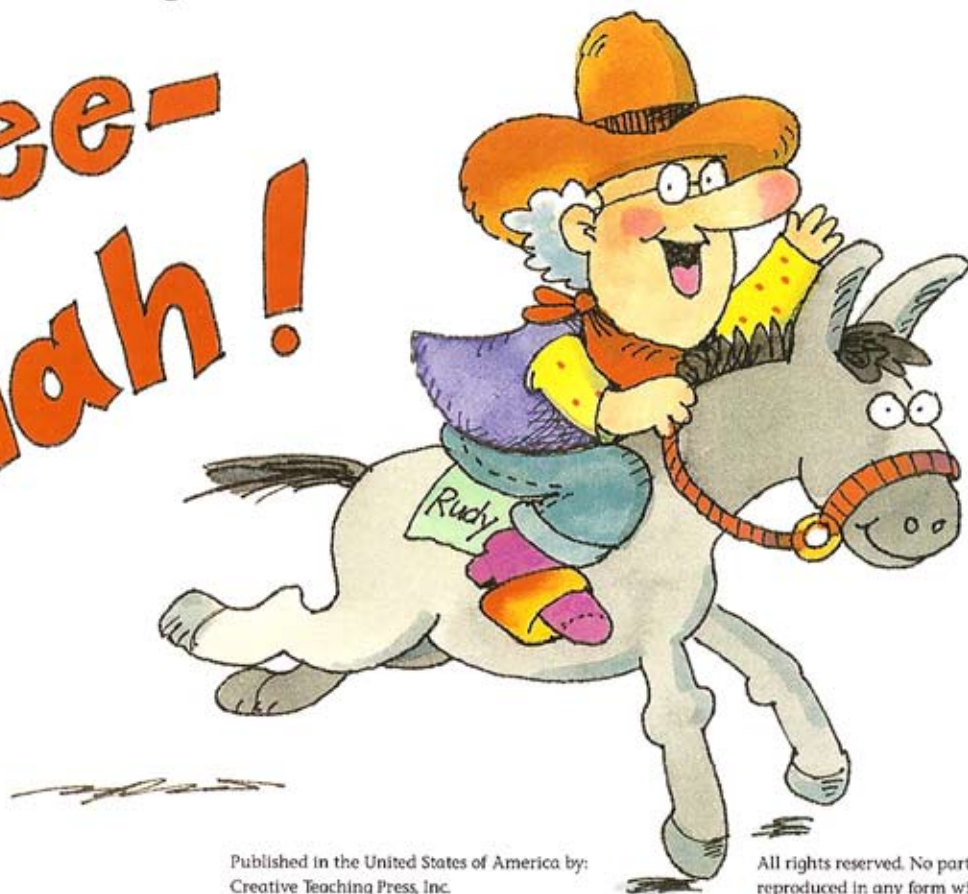

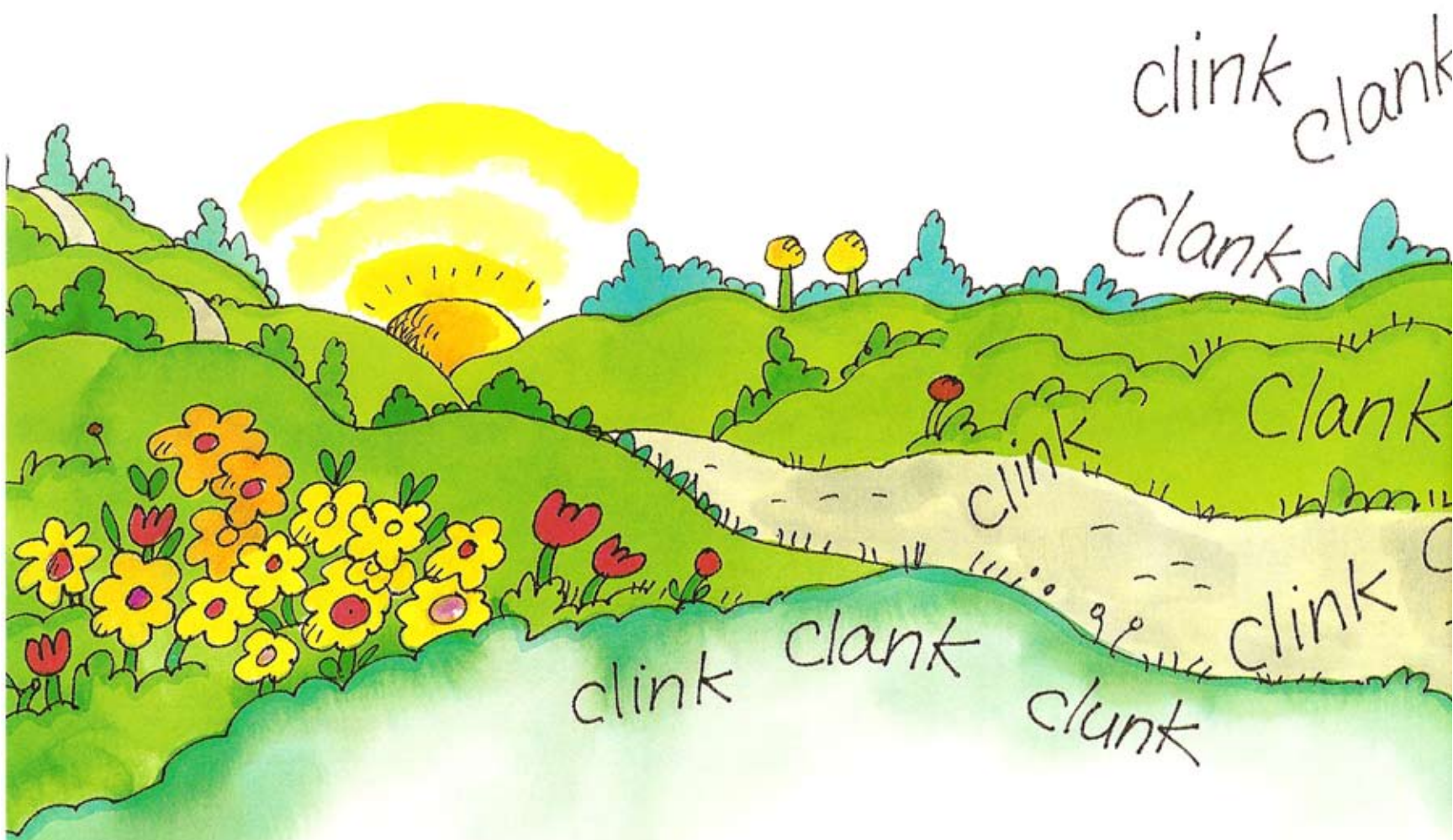

His jeep made lots of noise.

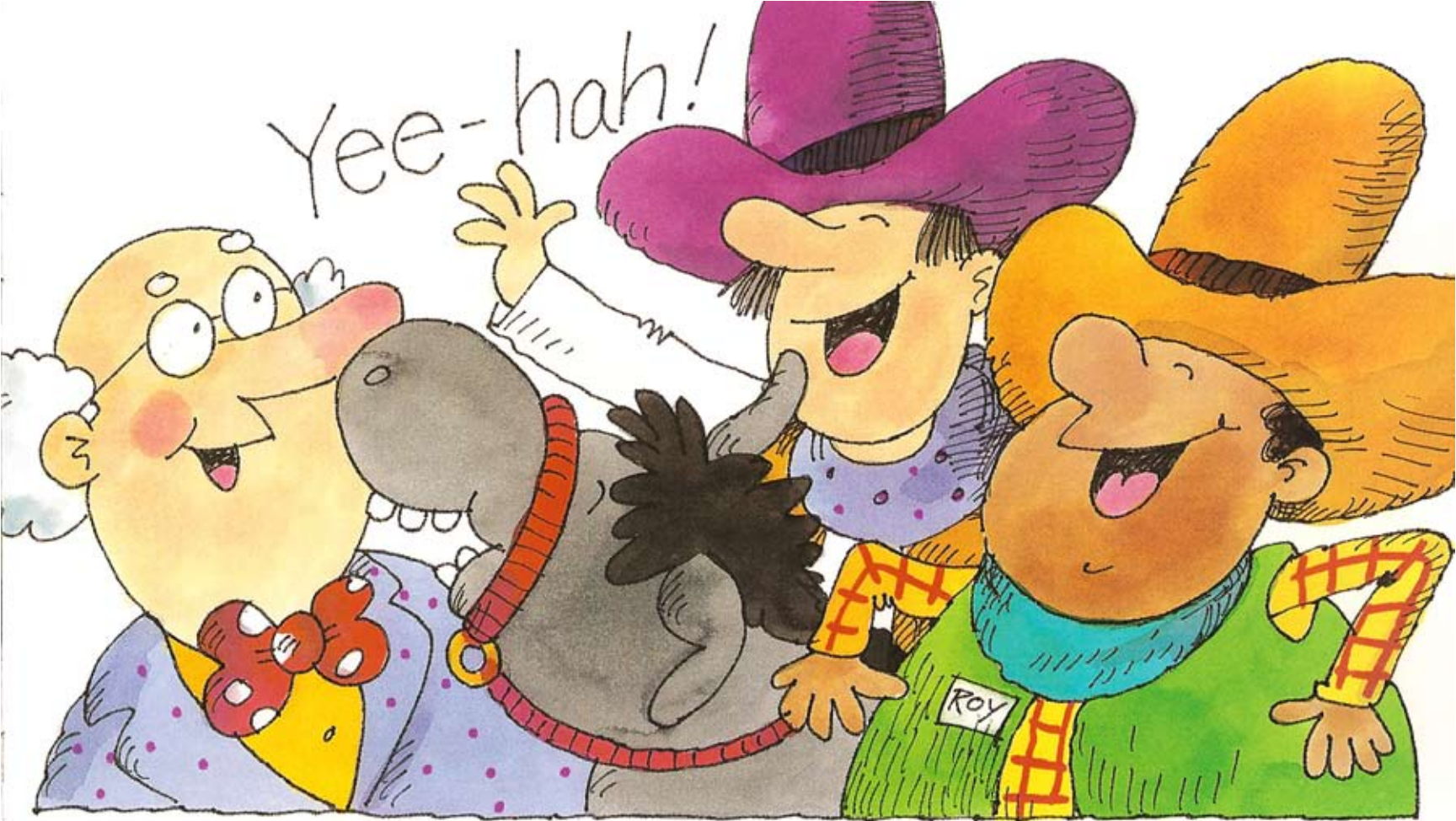


"Oh, no!" said Mr. Noisy. "What is that noise?"

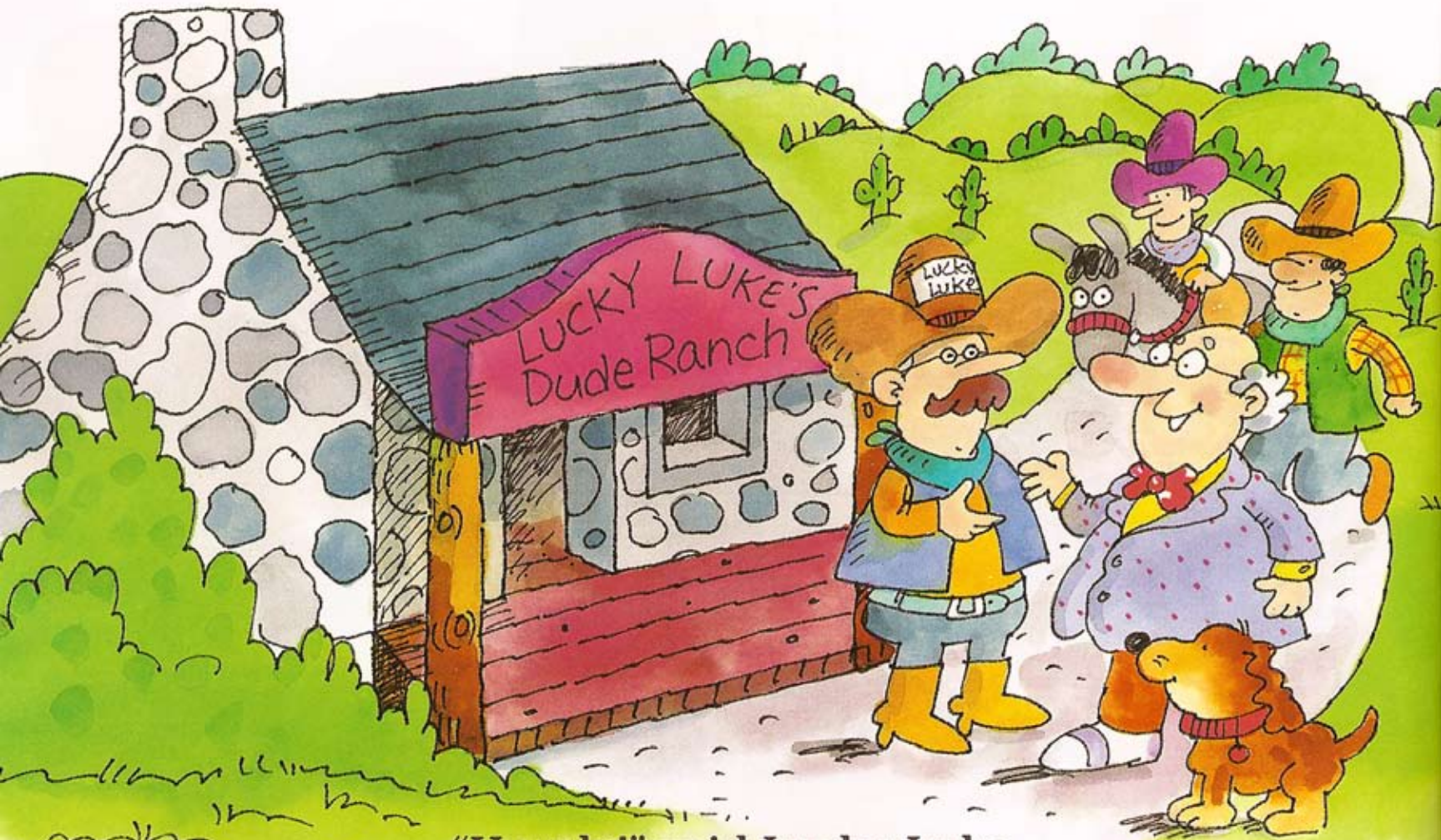


"Howdy! I am Duke. This is Roy," said Duke.

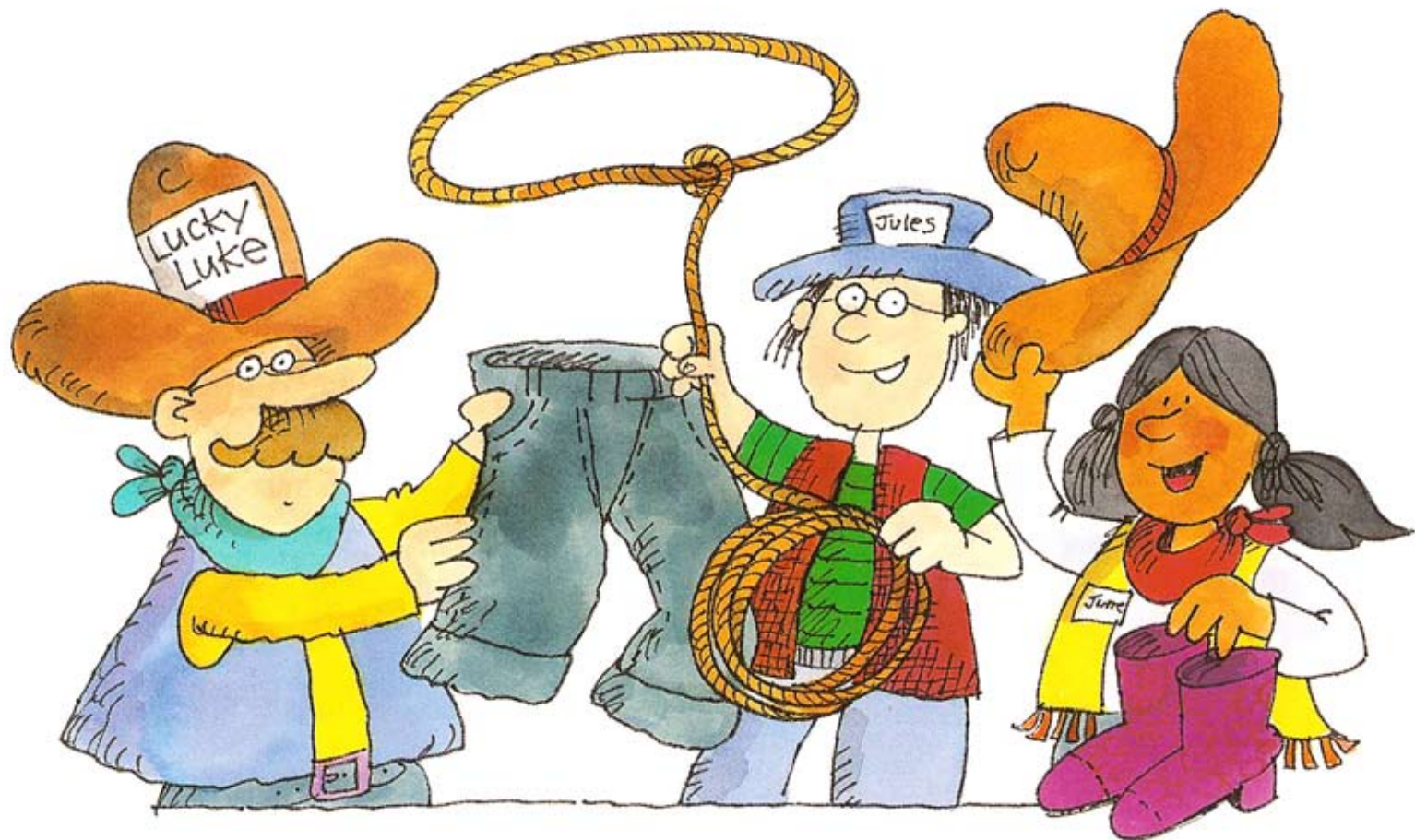
"Sounds like your jeep needs oil. We can fix it for you.

June gave him boots and a huge hat.



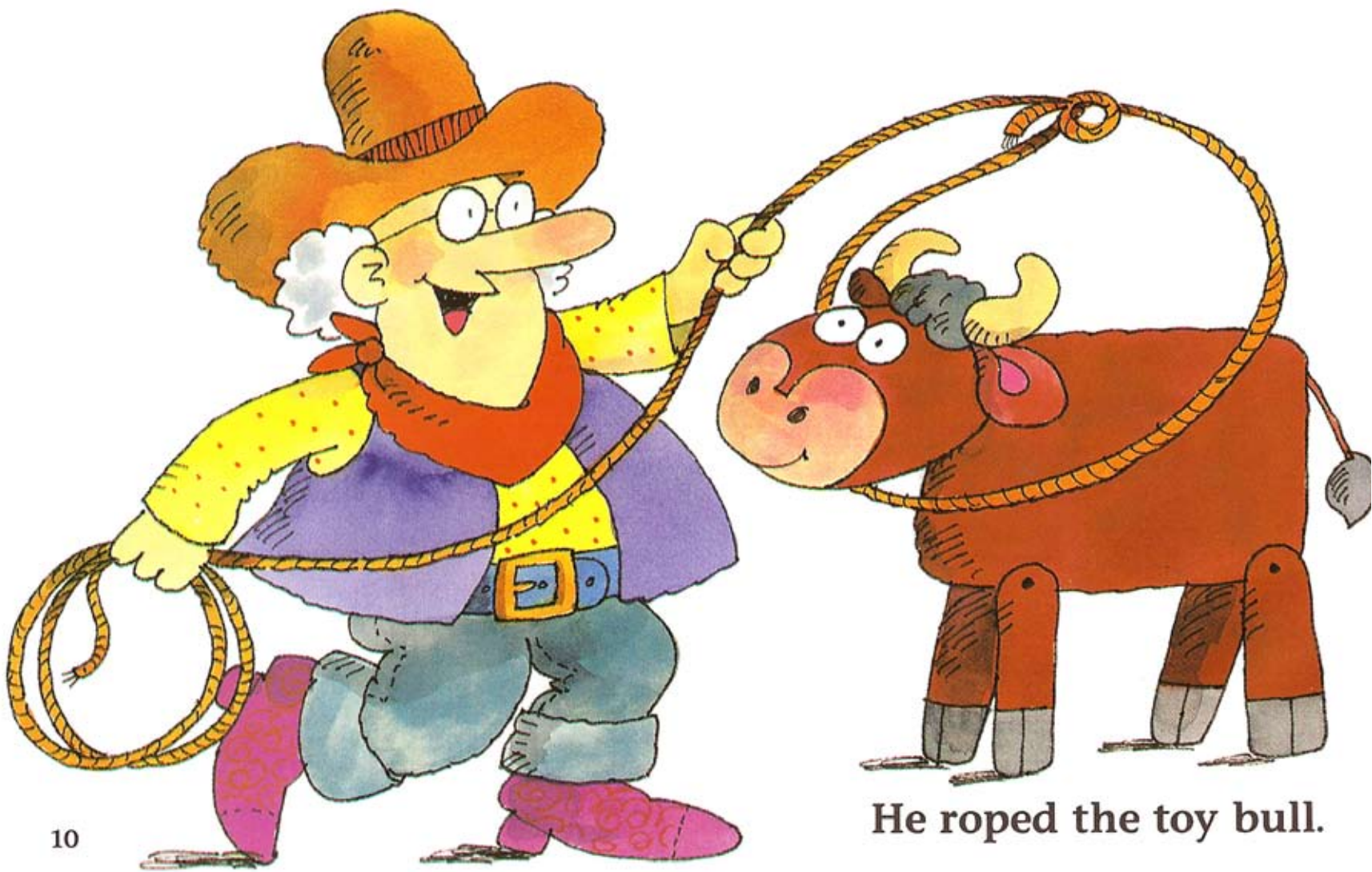

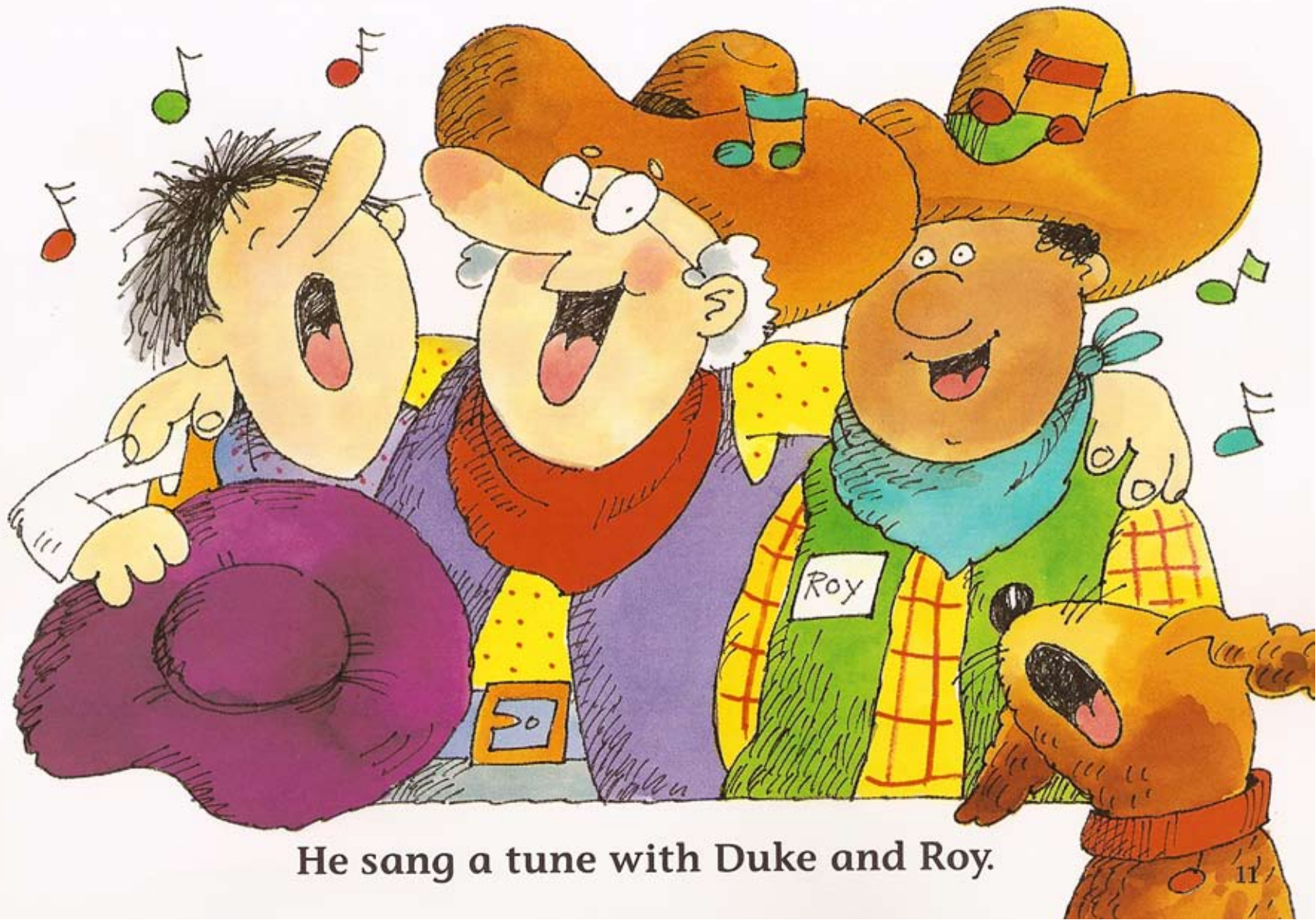
June said, "Oh boy, you are a cute dude now!"

"Yee-hah!" said Mr. Noisy. "I am a cute dude now!"



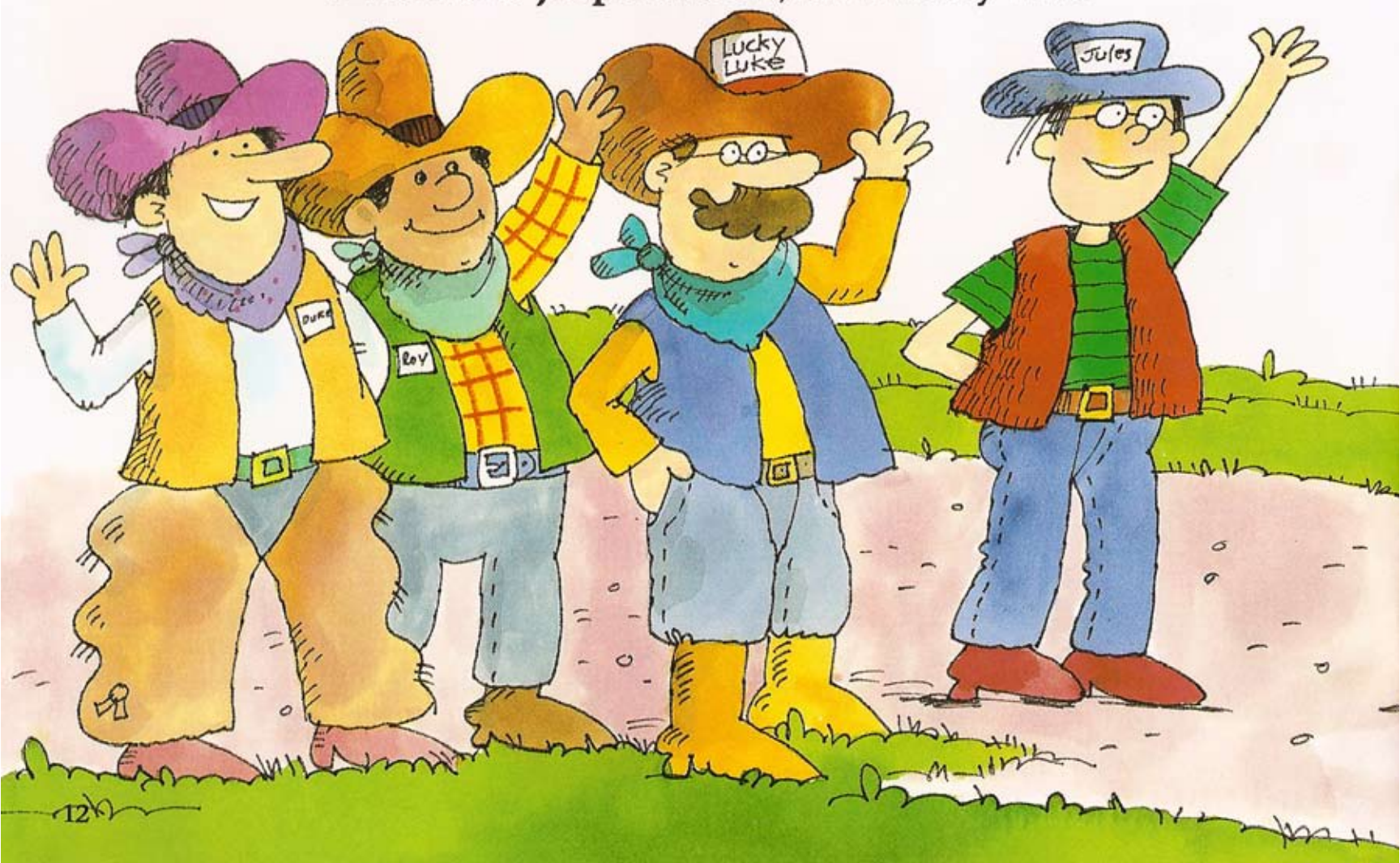
Mr. Noisy had fun at Lucky Luke's Dude Ranch.
He rode Rudy the mule.



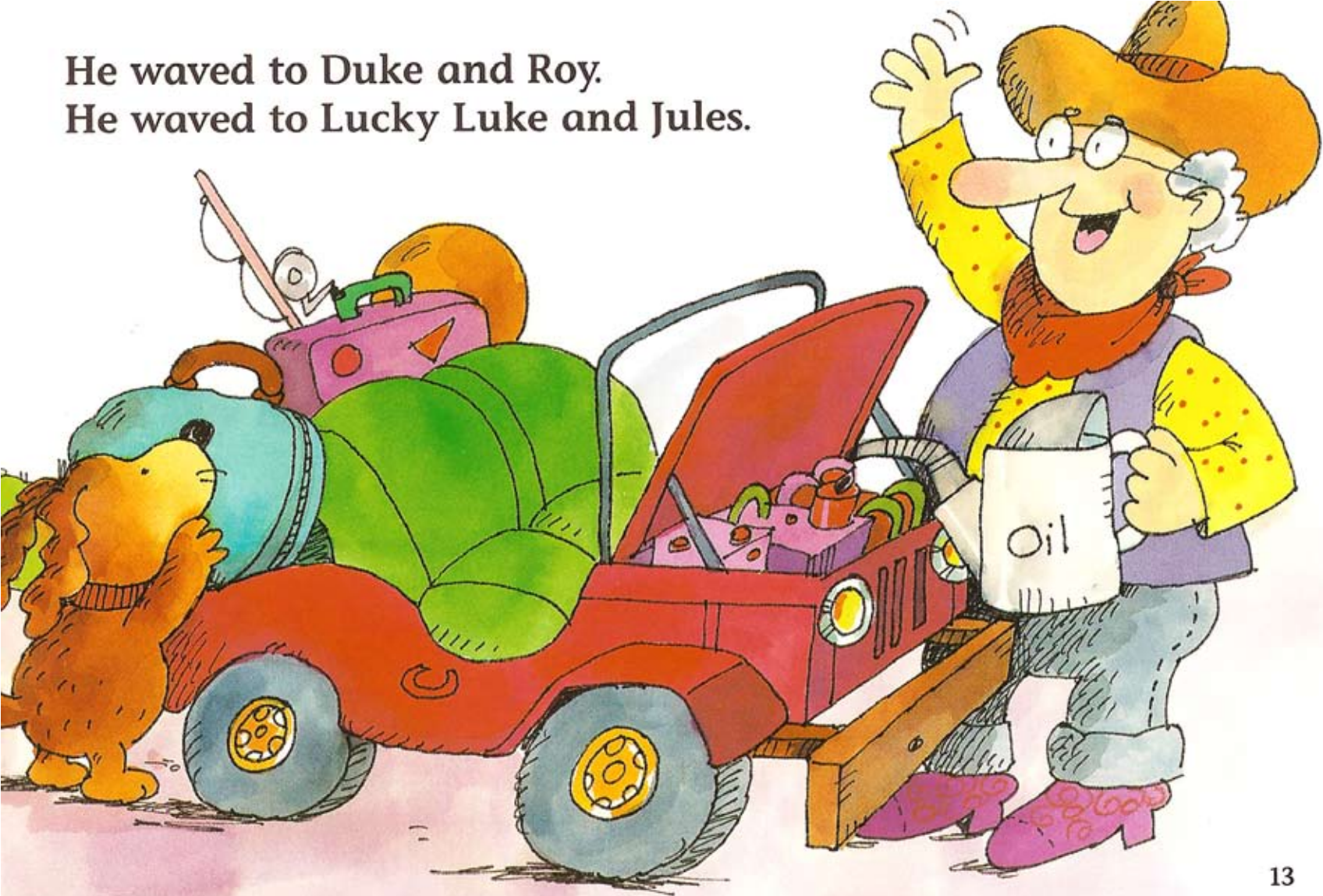


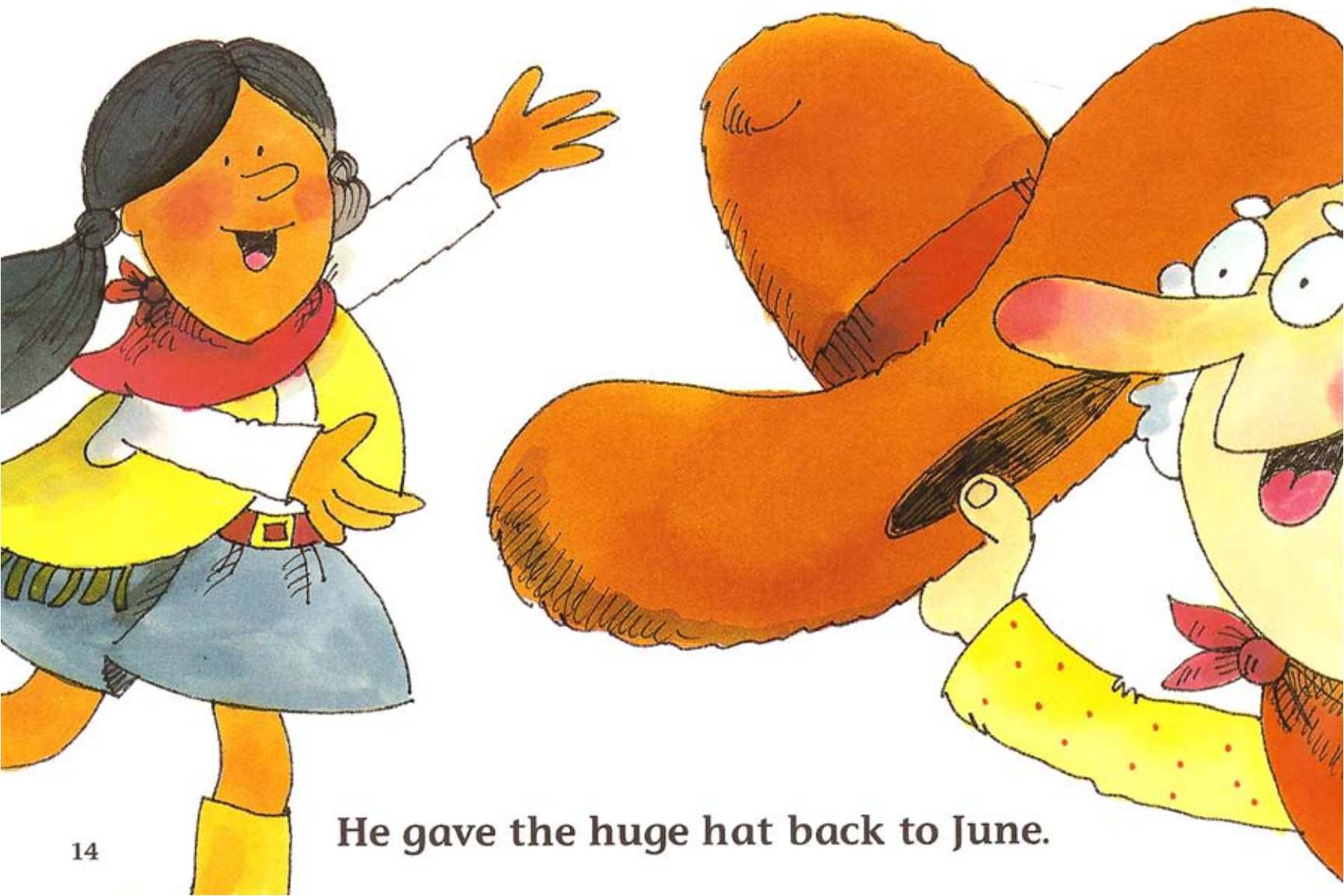
He sang a tune with Duke and Roy.

He waved to Lucky Luke and Jules.

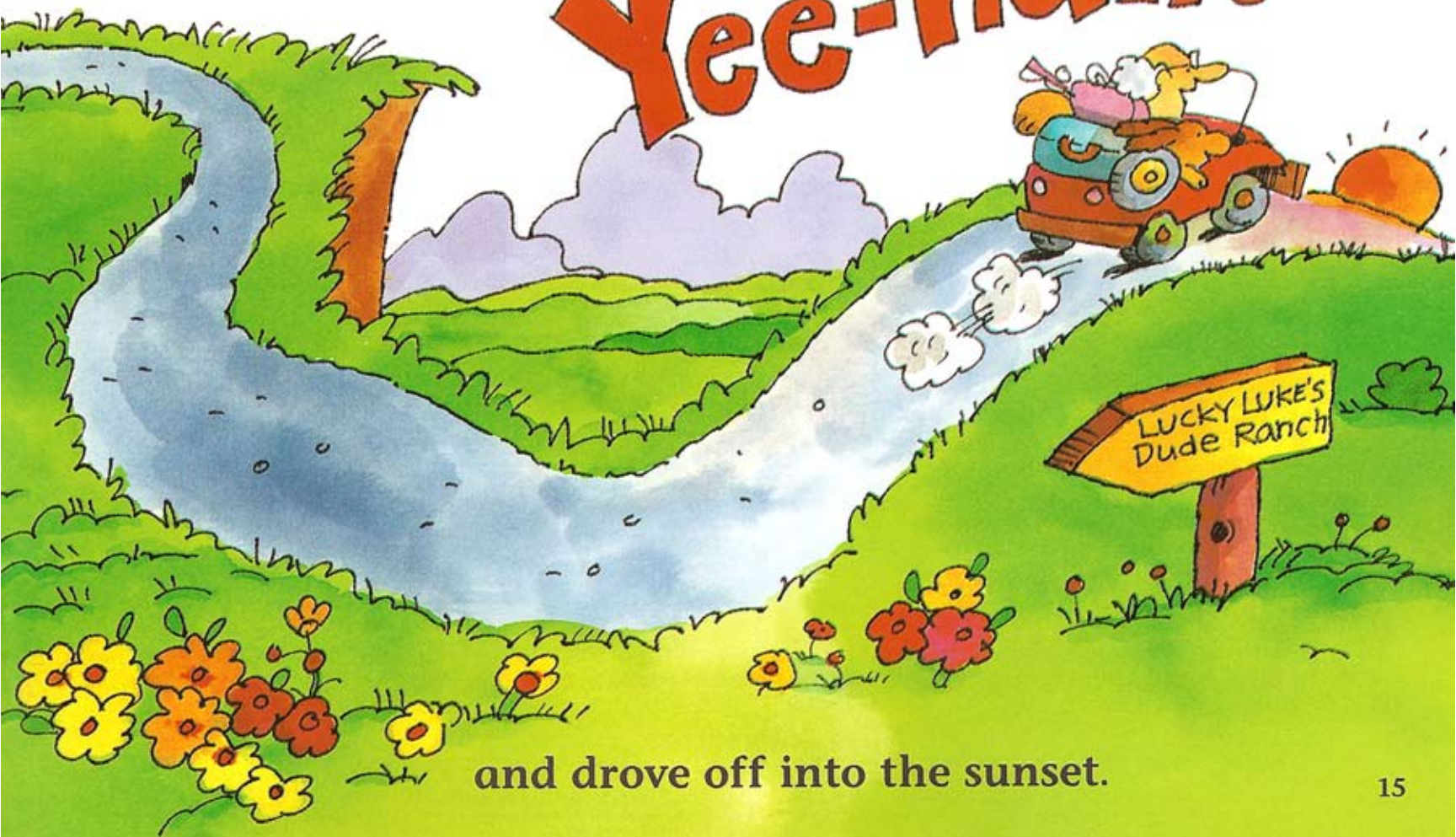




He gave the huge hat back to June.
