


Cat and Dog rode the city bus to the circus.

Cathy and Cindy said, "Oops, we left it. We'll take it now."




Cat gave the box to Cathy.




Cat asked, "Where did you get that cotton candy, Cindy?" "From the man in the red and white coat," said Cindy.




Cat got cotton candy and gave some to Dog. The big top got dark. The circus show began.






"A giant clown in a cute little car down in the center ring."
