LOOK AGAIN

Their long nails help
red squirrels climb tall trees.
Squirrels collect fruit and nuts.
Acorns are their favorite food.

It's a raccoon, of course. Raccoons are clever and curious. They are always trick-or-treating! If they can't find treats, they try a trick, like turning over garbage cans at night. When they've had enough to eat, they may curl up and go to sleep in a hollow tree.



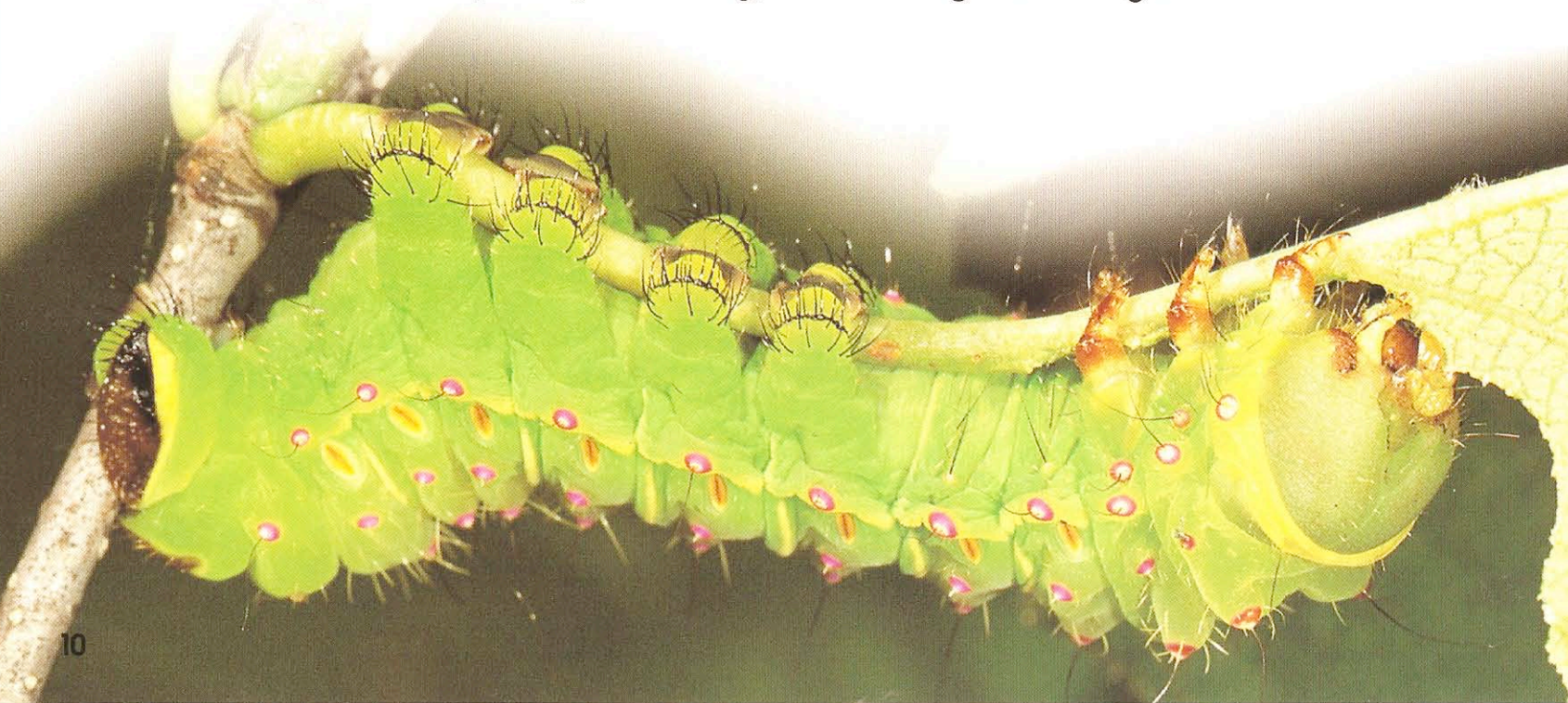
LOOK ONCE

Is this a mess that someone should clean up? Or is it here for a reason?



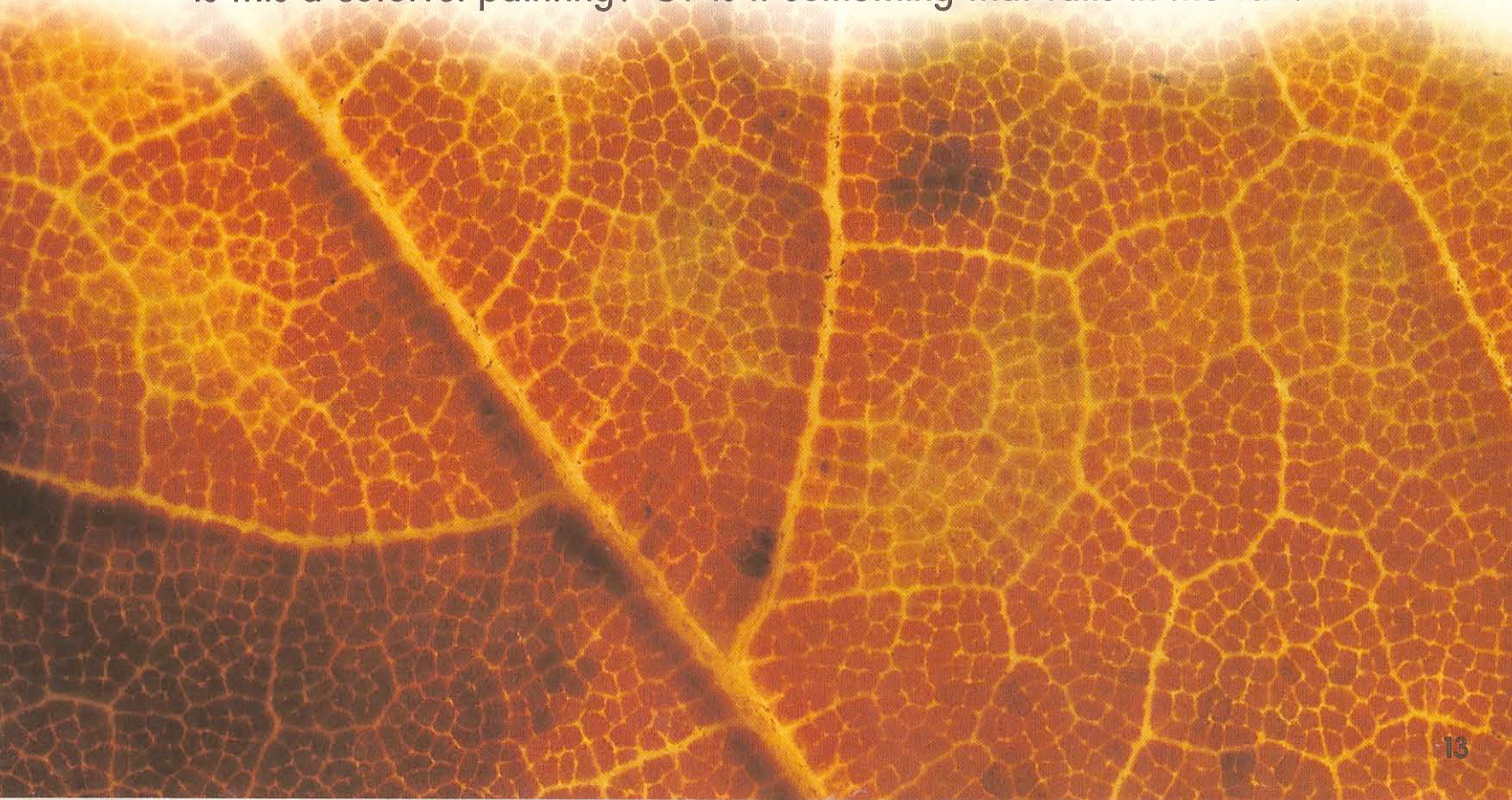
LOOK AGAIN

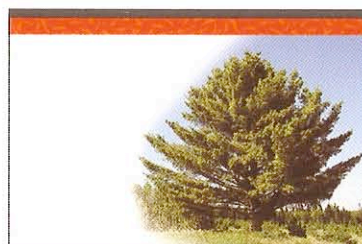
