



Puffins dive deep and catch fish with their beaks.

Puffin chicks keep their parents very busy!




You see teeth like these every day. Just look in the mirror!




Do you still have all 20 of your baby teeth?

When you feel this hairy tongue on your skin, you probably shoo this bug away.





Does this scary hook look like a dragon's mouth?






This animal is famous for changing colors. It is also famous for its long, sticky tongue.




Chameleons are slow on their feet, but fast with their tongues. A chameleon's tongue is almost as long as its body. There is sticky mucus at the tip. The tongue shoots out faster than your eye can see. Zzzaap! The chameleon has its meal.



Alligators have sharp, pointed teeth. They are good for grabbing and tearing food, but not for chewing.
Alligators cannot chew their food. They swallow big chunks of food. They do not often bite people. But don't take any chances!


