












For a day or two, all the fry stay in the bubble nest for safety. Then they leave. Right away, they can take care of themselves.








Now they must catch all their food. They eat tiny animals floating in the water. The fry use their gills to get oxygen from the water.






Males are larger and more colorful, and their long fins droop like flags. Soon this male will build a bubble nest and look for a mate. Together they will start another generation of bettas.
