## Why Phonics?

Phonics is the study of letter-sound relationships, specifically that letters, and certain groups of letters, appearing in printed words represent different sounds. With solid phonics knowledge, readers can accurately recognize familiar words automatically and can "sound out" or decode new words. Being able to decode words is an important skill that helps develop reading fluency and a strong foundation in reading comprehension.
