2018 BURGUNDY

Rich, aromatic whites - Generous, opulent reds

2018 turned out to be a highly successful, generous vintage that will go down as one of the finest of the modern era.


After a difficult start to the growing season with a wet spring that brought an ever-present danger of fungal disease, a glorious summer made the vintage and fine weather at harvest time enabled the often bounteous crop to reach full maturity and be gathered in a perfect state of health and ripeness.

Despite the hot, dry summer, there was plenty of juice in the grapes as a result of the water reserves in the soil built up over the previous winter and spring and only shallow-rooted, young vines on the most free-draining soils suffered from excessive dryness.

Apart from a few specific areas that suffered from hail (the southern end of the Nuits appellation in particular), the crop size was generous with many growers exceeding the maximum legally-permitted yields. As a result, there are many particularly fine village and generic Bourgogne wines which have been made with a proportion of fruit from higher appellations.

The dangers to look out for are primarily those of over-ripeness. The hot weather at the beginning of September accelerated the ripening with sugar levels in the grapes rising fast and acidity levels falling dangerously. There was a short window in which to pick and those who dallied or did not have the capacity to harvest promptly and swiftly have made rich, generous wines but ones which lack Burgundy's unique appeal of freshness, harmony and minerality.

The best wines, however, are magnificent examples of ripe but fresh chardonnay or pinot noir and, as one would expect after a dry, warm summer, can be found throughout Burgundy, from Chablis in the north to Mâcon in the south. Burgundians are getting used to a warmer climate and are now geared up to harvest promptly, vinify carefully and adapt the *élevage* to the particular vintage. 2018 is the fourth successful year for the region in a row with 2019 looking extremely promising as well. Furthermore, despite continuing price increases in euro terms, the recent strength of sterling has enabled us to offer most wines at no more than last year's prices and at such levels, I commend them most wholeheartedly.

Domaine Ventoura

Domaine Ventoura started small. Smallholder Auguste Ventoura who owned a few animals and some land planted to cereals in Fontenay, just outside Chablis started growing Chardonnay in 1953, and never looked back. His son Claude expanded the estate to its current size of eleven hectares, comprising Petit Chablis, Chablis and a single 1er cru, Fourchaume. Auguste's grandson Thomas joined the domaine in 2009, and four years later began to bottle and sell the wines himself, rather than sending them to the co-op.

Domaine Séguinot-Bordet

Jean-François Bordet heads up this family estate that can trace its roots in the village of Maligny back to 1590. The domaine now extends to 20 hectares on the right bank of the Serein where the rich kimmeridgian limestone soils give the wines the minerality so typical of great Chablis.

Jean-François built a new stainless steel winery for the 2014 harvest and continues to favour his unusual horizontal vats which allow greater contact between the wine and the lees,

Samuel Billaud

Samuel continues to make many of the most exciting wines coming out of Chablis today. His 2018s combine pure, ripe fruit with fine, balancing acidity. Despite the warm, dry summer, his 2018s show marked minerality, combining a ripe, generous texture with a distinctive saline character. Like the 2017s they will be delicious to drink young but will also age splendidly.

After small crops in 2016 and 2017, 2018 sees a welcome return to normal levels of production. However, world-wide demand for Samuel's wines continues to grow so please let us know as soon as possible if you would like to secure stock of his premiers and grands crus.

Petit Chablis

This is as good as Samuel's Chablis as it comes from a single plot of vines beautifully sited just above grand cru Les Clos. Vinified in stainless steel vats, this is crisp and pure; a splendid example of unoaked chardonnay. Drink 2020-2023.

Chablis

Sourced from three parcels of vines in different sectors of the appellation; Les Pargues towards the village of Pr hy, Les Cartes between the premiers crus of Vaillons and Montmains where the vines are 60 years old and Bas de Chapelots just below Mont e de Tonnerre. Has fine balance of ripe fruit and thrilling acidity. Unlike most Chablis, it has great length on the finish and will develop well in bottle. Drink 2020-2023.

Chablis 1er Cru Vaillons Vieilles Vignes

Vaillons has an excellent south-easterly exposure that captures all the morning sun but stays relatively cool in the afternoon. The stony soil contributes bite and freshness to this fine, aromatic, vividly fruity wine. Vinified in stainless steel to preserve the maximum of fruit, this is the most forward of all Samuel's premiers crus. Drink 2020-2024.

Chablis 1er Cru Fourneaux

A hotter, more precocious vineyard on a south-facing slope in the village of Fleys. Made from 100% organically farmed grapes and vinified in stainless steel, this is a fatter, richer style of Chablis with a ripe, succulent texture and impressive, long aftertaste. Drink 2020-2025.

<p>Chablis 1er Cru Montée de Tonnerre</p> <p><i>Vinified in the same manner as the Mont de Milieu, this comes from two plots of vines at different altitudes within Montée de Tonnerre; Chapelots near the base and Triangle higher up. In my opinion, Samuel's finest premier cru in 2018, with tremendous depth of fruit, an intriguing salinity and an impressive, long finish. Drink 2021-2026.</i></p>	£161
<p>Chablis Grand Cru Bougros</p> <p><i>Like all the grands crus, this is fermented and aged for twelve months in 450 litre oak casks or demi-muids followed by six months in stainless steel vats. This enables the wines to spend longer on the fine lees, developing richness and complexity. This is rich and honeyed with intense purity of fruit and an impressive, crisp aftertaste. Drink 2022-2027.</i></p>	£311
<p>Chablis Grand Cru Blanchots</p> <p><i>The most easterly of the grands crus, adjacent to Les Clos. Tighter and more restrained with fine minerality. Drink 2022-2027.</i></p>	£311
<p>Chablis Grand Cru Preuses</p> <p><i>Les Preuses lies towards the western end of the grands crus and produces a fine, fresh, elegant wine of great class and intensity. Drink 2022-2027.</i></p>	£322
<p>Chablis Grand Cru Les Clos</p> <p><i>Samuel made two 450 litre demi-muids (from Chassin and Doreau) of this sublime grand cru. Regularly Samuel's finest wine with magnificent depth and concentration. Still tight and backward but with great ageing potential. Drink 2022-2028.</i></p>	£328



Alain and Corentin Chavy

Domaine Alain Chavy

Alain Chavy has been joined by his son Corentin at this splendid Puligny domaine, created in 2003 when Alain and his brother Jean-Louis went their separate ways.

Alain is one of the earliest to pick in the village: from 25th to 31st August in 2018. This enables him to retain good acidity and produce crisp, well-structured wines with fine minerality and ageing potential. All the wines are fermented and aged for twelve months in barrel followed by six months in stainless steel vats in one of the few underground cellars in Puligny.



<i>Folatières often produces some of the ripest, most opulent wines of Puligny but this is taut and mineral with beautiful, zippy fruit and a long, crisp aftertaste. Needs time to develop but will age magnificently. Drink 2021-2025.</i>

<i>Alain makes just two barrels of this magnificent grand cru. Rich and intense with great concentration of flavour. Drink 2021-2025.</i>	

Domaine Jacques Carillon

Ten years after dividing the family domaine with his brother, Jacques Carillon continues to make a brilliant range of Puligny, as good as any in the village.

In 2018, he started picking on the 28th August, even earlier than in 2017. Sensing that the fruit was ripening fast, Jacques harvested quickly and had finished by 4th September.

All the wines are barrel-fermented and aged for twelve months in small oak barrels followed by six months in stainless steel vats.

Although more famous for his Puligny, Jacques has a small parcel of vines in Chassagne and makes a beautifully stylish wine with lower acidity and a softer, more succulent texture. Drink 2021-2024.

Puligny-Montrachet

Made from nine different climats around the village. Rich and intense, this was the finest village Puligny I tasted this autumn and will age magnificently. Drink 2021-2025.

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Champs Canet

The most accessible of the Puligny premiers crus when young but the old vines dating from 1972 give a rich, concentrated wine. Ripe and honeyed with fine structure and length on the finish. Drink 2021-2026.

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Perrières

The deeper, stonier soil and 38 year old vines give a powerful wine with great intensity of flavour and a tight close-knit texture. Deserves a year or two in bottle and will age splendidly. Drink 2022-2027.

Has both the structure of Perrières and fruit of Champs Canet. Vines now approaching fifty years of age and giving wonderful wine. A splendid, complete Puligny, as good as any this year. Drink 2022-2027.

Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet

Only two barrels made of this fabulous grand cru. Aged in one new and one 2 year old cask from Tonnellerie de Mercurey. Dense and concentrated with fine structure and length. Drink 2022-2028.

Domaine Jean-Marc Pillot

Jean-Marc has extended his winery next to the old RN6 so that he can vinify his white and red wines in separate cellars at different temperatures.

His 2018s are a magnificent range of fresh, aromatic whites and rich, generous reds. Jean-Marc is now ably assisted by his son, Antonin, and the quality continues to soar. All the 2018 Chassagnes will be aged for twelve months in oak barrels followed by six months in stainless steel vats; a fantastic range of wines with each *cru* showing its individual character.

From a small plot of old vines near Jean-Marc's cellar. Vinified in stainless steel vats to maximise the purity of fruit. Shows just how good Bourgogne Chardonnay can be. Drink 2020-2022.

Montagny Les Bassets

Jean-Marc buys grapes from Stéphane Aladame in Montagny and vinifies them in Chassagne. 100% barrel-fermented, this is fresh and aromatic with beautiful, honeyed fruit, a touch of oak and lovely, crisp acidity. A great success. Drink 2020-2023.

Saint Romain La Périère

Saint Romain lies just above Meursault and Auxey-Duresses and does particularly well in warm summers such as 2018, the higher altitude bringing freshness and acidity. Vinified in barrel with the same care as the Chassagnes. Drink 2020-2023.

Chassagne-Montrachet

Most of Jean-Marc's Chassagne vines are situated near the Puligny border just below grand cru Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet and this continues to be one of the best Chassagnes in the village. Rich and aromatic with honeyed fruit and a fine, generous texture. Finishes long and fresh. Drink 2021-2024.

Puligny-Montrachet Les Noyers Bret

Jean-Marc's plot of vines in Puligny lies between the village and the grand cru vineyards. The soil is chalkier here and the higher limestone content gives extra bite and intensity to the wine. Drink 2021-2024.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Baudines

At the southern end of the appellation, where there is more clay in the soil and the wines are rich and fleshy. Full-bodied and generous with masses of ripe, honeyed fruit. Drink 2021-2024.

<i>The clay soil is ideal for red wine production and in 2018 has given a rich, generous wine with chunky tannins and perfectly ripe fruit. A great success. Drink 2022-2026.</i>

<i>From a number of plots to the south of the village where the richer soil is better suited to pinot noir than chardonnay. Softer and rounder than the Santenay with lovely red and black fruits on the nose, fine, silky tannins on the palate and a truly succulent texture. Drink 2021-2026.</i>	

Domaine Fontaine-Gagnard

A confusing number of Chassagne estates carry the Gagnard name. This branch derives from the Gagnard-Delagrance estate, split between two daughters. One of them, Laurence, married an air force engineer, Richard Fontaine, who handed control to his daughter Céline. Both white and red wines here have always had an easy elegance, but the many small refinements introduced by Céline, such as a different oak regime, have taken them to a new level.



Chassagne saw little rain during the latter half of the growing season, but the vines were saved by the cool nights in August: dew provided enough moisture to avoid drought stress. To the growers' surprise, at harvest time the small grapes were full of juice, and yields were generous, especially for whites. Production of reds is down, but they are amongst the best Céline has ever made, with pure fruit and vibrant acidity. The key here was to avoid over-extraction of tannin, so there were longer maceration times, and pumping over rather than punching down.

Domaine Vincent et François Jouard



François Jouard

Vincent Jouard looks after the vines whilst brother François takes charge of the cellar. Harvested between 3rd and 10th September, this is a lovely range of Chassagne-Montrachet with each premier cru showing its own personality.

All the wines were harvested at 13 to 13.5% natural alcohol with no need for any chaptalisation or acidification. After using a mixture of Vosges and Allier oak for many years, François has now decided to concentrate exclusively on the more refined, less powerful Allier oak barrels made for him by the local tonnellerie Chassin in Chagny.

This fabulous cuvée comes from the domaine's oldest (50+ years) vines in three of their finest climats; Plante du Gaie, Clos Devant and Meix Goudard. Aged in 25% new oak, this is premier cru quality with beautiful, pure fruit and lovely minerality. Drink 2020-2023.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Champs Gains

Aged in 1/3 new Allier oak barrels. This is the most forward of the premiers crus with fresh, honeyed fruit and ripe, generous texture. Low yields due to millerendange to which the old vines are most susceptible. Drink 2021-2024.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru La Maltroie

Maltroie lies just below the village and always give a rich, powerful wine with more body and structure. Impressive length on the finish. Drink 2021-2024.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Chenevottes

Splendid north-east facing premier cru overlooking Le Montrachet. This did particularly well in 2018; rich and concentrated with a dense, close-knit texture and lovely, fresh finish. Drink 2021-2024.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Chaumées '**Clos de la Truffière**'

£264

The domaine's finest premier cru, high on the slope at the northern end of the appellation. Particularly successful in 2018, the high altitude and easterly exposure giving freshness and vibrancy to the wine. Lovely complexity and length on the finish. Drink 2021-2025.

Bâtard-Montrachet

Only one and a half barrels made of this famous grand cru. Magnificent intensity and rich, generous texture. Drink 2022-2026.

Domaine Michel Moingeon

André Moingeon created this domaine in the 50s although certain parcels of vines have been in the family for over 150 years. André was joined by his son Michel 1978 and now by his grandson Florent and together they have grown the domaine to encompass 10 hectares of vines around St. Aubin. The style is open and modern and easy to drink although the Puligny retains its taut minerality perfectly. They only bottle 50% of the harvest each year and Michel maintains that prices are amongst the lowest in St. Aubin...and indeed, Puligny!

Domaine Jean-Louis Chavy

Jean-Louis always harvests a few days later (29th August to 4th September in 2018) than his brother, Alain, and, as a result, makes a more forward, fruitier style of Puligny. Jean-Louis also bottles earlier, usually within fifteen months of the harvest in order to preserve the maximum of fruit and freshness.

More and more 350 litre *demi-muids* from Meursault-based *tonnellerie* Damy are appearing in the cellar, replacing the smaller, 228 litre traditional Burgundy *pièce*. Overall, this is a splendid source of ripe, fruity Puligny, delicious relatively early but with the balance to age well in the medium term.

Fermented and aged in 20% new oak barrels of which 20% are now larger 350 litre casks from tonnellerie Damy. A gloriously fruity, open Puligny with ripe, honeyed aromas and a rich, generous texture. Can be enjoyed young or aged for 4-5 years. Drink 2020-2024.

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Folatières £280

Jean-Louis's finest premier cru, fermented and aged in 25% new oak barrels. The vines are now over 50 years old and give a magnificent, rich wine of great class and harmony. Ripe and honeyed with excellent freshness and fine length on the finish. Drink 2021-2024.



Domaine Yves Boyer-Martenot

Vincent Boyer took over the running of this famous Meursault domaine from his father Yves five years ago and is making profound changes to the winemaking at the estate. After successful trials in 2017, all the 2018 vintage will be aged for twelve months in traditional 228 litre oak barrels followed by six months in cement egg-shaped vats ranging in size from 900 to 1800 litres, each vat being designed to take the production of a particular wine. Based on the success of the 2017 wines, the longer *élevage* gives wines with additional purity of flavour, enhanced harmony and, as a result, greater ageing potential.

Domaine Bzikot Père et Fils

Sylvain & Béatrice Bzikot (pronounced BZee-cot) own an impressive estate of 15 hectares in Puligny Montrachet. Sylvain's grandfather arrived in Burgundy from Poland just before the Second World War and steadily built up the estate in the post-war years when land was plentiful and cheap. For a long time, most of the crop was sold in bulk to the Burgundy *négociants* but now all is bottled at the domaine. 

Domaine de l'Arlot

Domaine de l'Arlot has a rare thing: eleven hectares of monopole vineyards. These consist of two 1ers crus at the southern end of Nuits-Saint-Georges – the seven-hectare Clos des Forêts, and the four-hectare Clos de l'Arlot. Before the adventurous Jean-Pierre de Smet created the domaine – with financial support from AXA in 1987 – the wines were rustic. But with the help of the team from Domaine Dujac, where he learned to make wine, and assisted by his number two, Didier Fornerol, quality rapidly improved, and the domaine quickly became internationally recognised. Géraldine Godot assumed control in 2014.

The wines are not the sturdy, tannic Nuits of popular imagination. From the beginning, a high proportion of whole-bunch fermentation was used, the fruit and musts were handled with the utmost care, and the result is delicate, perfumed wines that are approachable young but have great staying power.

No fewer than three heavy hailstorms hit Prémieux in July. They did extensive damage to the vines and the vineyards, causing mudslides of such severity that the soil had to be carried back up the hillside by hand. On the plus side, the storms brought plenty of rain, so there was no risk of the drought that affected other areas. And very surprisingly, the vines recovered quickly, giving the same yields as in 2017 – in fact, that hail acted as a form of green harvest. Great care was taken to sort any damaged grapes before fermentation, and fewer whole bunches were used, as they leach acidity from the must. Now in her third vintage, Géraldine Godot has mastered her terroirs and has produced an excellent range.

Dominique Le Guen was an air force technician when his father-in-law announced his retirement and asked him if he would like to make wine. He took the plunge and joined the almost defunct eight-hectare domaine in 1998, making his first wines on his own in 2002. A supremely skilled craftsman, his production has become ever finer since.



After explosive growth in the Spring, the growing season was relatively easy here. Enough rain fell at the right time to avoid drought, and it became a challenge – like everywhere else – to find the right moment to pick as ripening quickened towards the end of August. Dominique's harvest started on 5th September, and finished a week later. During fermentation the tannins came out almost by themselves, and there was little need for punching down the cap. The wines are very successful – rich, fresh and not too ripe.

Charles was delighted with the 2018 vintage, placing it firmly in the category of 'great'. He was careful to watch ripeness levels, and was pleased with the generous crop, as it took longer for the sugars to ripen and allowed the phenolic maturation to keep pace. He began picking early, on 5th September. One of the keys was keep balance and not to over-extract, so there was a longer pre-fermentation maceration, and less punching down the skin cap. The result is a brilliant set of fresh, vibrant wines that will last well.

'You cannot become good at anything without making mistakes,' he says, and he must have made plenty because he is now one of the most brilliant winemakers in Burgundy. From his prime 15.5-hectare holdings, he turns out some of the finest and longest-lived wines of the region.



Etienne and Mathilde waited for complete phenolic maturity in 2018, and began harvesting on the 11th September, when most had already finished. The benefit was just over 20mm of rain on 4-5th that freshened the vines and allowed the tannins to mature fully.

In the Spring, they had delayed ploughing, thereby holding back the vegetative cycle of the vines, which Etienne maintained was vital to keep the vines in balance. During fermentation, the acidity remained stable, and that alcohol levels remained between 13-14%. He describes his wines as luminous, resonant and fresh, and we can only agree.

Brothers Nicolas and David Rossignol converted the family estate to biodynamic viticulture in 2004 and produce some of the most elegant wines of Gevrey. In 2018, they picked promptly from the 4th to the 10th of September to obtain the maximum of freshness, retained 50% of the stems and extracted gently with minimal *remontage* and *delestage*. The village and premiers crus will be aged in one third new oak barrels with up to two thirds for the grands crus.



In 2018, the grapes were picked between the 4th and 12th of September, 100% de-stemmed and fermented at a relatively low temperature with minimal pigeage in order to retain the maximum of freshness and fruit. The wines were then aged in 35% new oak for the village wines, 50% for the premiers crus and 65% for the grands crus.



Domaine René Bouvier

Bernard Bouvier makes polished, very accessible wines mainly in Marsannay and Gevrey, but also from vineyards further down the Côte. He farms entirely organically, and firmly believes that he only began to discern the real terroir of his wines after the switch ten years ago. He has the good fortune to possess vines that are mostly over fifty years old. Last year he took over 12 hectares from his brother, who was retiring, and the domaine now comprises a healthy 30 hectares, mostly in Marsannay.



Bernard began harvest on 3rd September with a team of 120, and finished 11 days later. He reported a healthy crop of perfectly ripe red and white grapes: 'It is a great vintage,' he said, 'good ripeness, good balance and good acidity – what more can you ask?'

Domaine de Courcel

Domaine de Courcel is known for rich, tannic wines that require long ageing. Since 1996, they have been made by Yves Confuron, who somehow manages to find time to run his estate in Vosne Romanée as well. The estate comprises Pommard's finest vineyards, the 1ers crus Croix Noires, Fremiers, Grand Clos des Epenots (monopole) and Rugiens. Picking is always far later than other estates, and there is very long slow fermentation of whole bunches, with lots of punching down, and extended maturation in cask and quite unique. The wines are difficult in their youth but given enough time they turn into something very special: rich, elegant and fresh, and very well worth the wait.



Yves Confuron is a dedicated late picker, beginning this year on 23 September. His crop was healthy and ripe, and alcohol levels moderate. As usual, there was no destemming, and after a short cold maceration, fermentation proceeded much as normal, with punching down and pumping over. The wines are powerful and balanced.

Maison Camille Giroud

Camille-Giroud had a long history as a négociant that released powerful, very long-lived wines. In 2000, it was sold to a group of American investors, and David Croix was installed as director, who, to put it simply, is a genius, and made a raft of great wines until his departure in 2016. His successor is Carel Voorhuis, who is crafting similarly pure, seductive and terroir-driven wines.



For Carel Voorhuis 2018 is another in a line of classic Burgundian vintages. It is not dissimilar to 2015, with more freshness and finesse, and not far from 2017, though with more density. The greatest challenge in 2018 was to retain freshness, and here he has very much succeeded: both red and white wines are vibrant and balanced.

Domaine Daniel et Julien Barraud

2018 was a welcome year for the Barrauds. There were few major problems during the growing season, and despite the heat there was enough rain and no drought, though low temperatures slowed ripening at the beginning of August. The harvest was challenging, and again saw staggered ripening of the vineyards, causing logistical nightmares for the pickers. The grapes were very small and healthy, and have produced volumes not seen since 2015. The Barrauds describe the vintage as 'normal', and liken it to the friendly and approachable 1992s, which gave years of pleasure.



'I have said this before but I will say it again: no one makes better wine in the Mâconnais than Barraud. There are a few domaines that produce wines that are sometimes just as good...but none of them surpasses the quality he consistently produces.' Allen Meadows, Burghound, Issue 64, October 2016.
