COMPLEMENTARY:

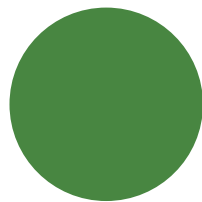

TRIADIC:

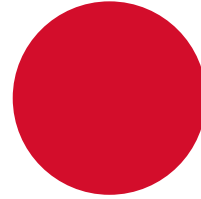
Three colors equally spaced from each other on the color wheel. Triadic color schemes offer contrast, but not as much contrast as a complementary scheme.



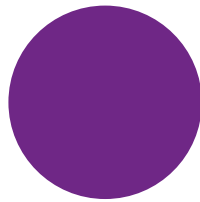
