



# Banjo Brothers Rack Top Bag Instructions

(#01060 Handlebar Bag)

**Installation:** The bag's primary attachment is on the handlebars themselves with two hook & loop straps, but one of the secondary attachments below is required for stability.



Flip-up map case:  
Check the map while  
you are stopped, or  
risk crashing.

1. Attach the lower dropout hooks (included in the bag) on your fork's eyelets with bolts and nuts. Connect the elastic straps as shown and tighten the straps with the buckle.

2. For bikes with suspension forks or no eyelets on fork, use the optional strap included with the bag. Thread one side through the buckle as shown, pass around the bottom of the bike's head tube, and thread other side of strap .

## General comments

- The Handlebar Bag is made from waterproof fabric, but is **not** considered a waterproof bag because the seams are not sealed. It will keep your stuff remarkably dry, but a bag's got to know its limits. A commute in some drizzle – probably fine. An all-day ride in a downpour – you will have some leaks.
- We provide a tab on front for mounting a safety light, but they don't replace your bike's primary reflectors or lights. – we strongly recommend you ride with front and rear lights when it's dark, and it's also the law in most states.
- The maximum capacity is 7 lbs. It is ruggedly designed for daily commuting and recreational use, and for extra capacity for touring.
- If the bag gets dirty, hand wash with soap and water and air dry. Do not put it in the dryer unless you want it to melt. Solvents will damage the synthetic fibers. Sustained exposure to sunlight will also cause some fading and deterioration to all fabrics. We can't defeat the laws of chemistry and physics, but we do our best to resist them.
