

Feedsack

Pretty Paws

Quilt by Evonne Cook featuring the

Feedsack collection by Sara Morgan

Quilt Size 65" x 761/2"

This quilt uses <u>nearly</u> every print in the collection; however, every print can be used if you wish more variety in the blocks. Some prints are used more than once.

Fabric A CROS 358K Background 1½ yards

Fabric B **FEED 648Y** Sashings 1% yards

Fabric C FEED 649YK Cornerstones 3/8 yard

Fabric D FEED 646 BG Border & Binding 1% yards

Each Remaining Fabric Print 1/4 yard Backing 4½ yards of any **FEED** fabric

General instructions: Read through all directions before beginning. Sew using a scant ½" seam; seam allowances are built into the cutting directions. All pieces are sewn right sides together.

Cutting

Strips are cut across the width of fabric unless otherwise stated

From Fabric A (CROS 358K), cut:

- (6) 2" x 42" strips for block backgrounds; sub cut Into (120) 2" squares
- (15) 23/8" x 42" strips for block backgrounds; sub cut into (240) 23/8" squares

From Fabric B (FEED 648Y), cut:

(18) 2" x 42" strips; sub cut into (71) 2 x 10½" rectangles for sashings

From Fabric C (FEED 649YK), cut:

(2) 2" x 42" strips; sub cut into (42) 2" squares for cornerstones

From Fabric D (FEED 646 BG), cut:

- (6) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips for border; sides will have to be pieced
 - (7) 21/2" x 42" strips for binding

From FEED 649 BK, cut:

(1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strip; sub cut into (4) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for border corners

From each of the remaining fabric prints (EACH SKU),

cut: (4) 3½" x 3½" squares & (8) 2¾" x 2¾" squares


(4) 1½" x 5" rectangles & (1) 1½" x 1½" square

NOTE: Additional pieces of some of the fabrics will have to be cut to finish the number of blocks & rectangles needed to complete the quilt. Following the quilt picture, cut extra pieces from FEED 645T, 645B, 646BG, 647R, 648B, 648Y, 648R, 649BK, & 649YK as needed for blocks &/or cross bars.

Sewing

Draw a line from corner to corner on the back of all the $2\frac{3}{8}$ " background squares. Laying all of the $2\frac{3}{8}$ " background squares & colored squares RST, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from both sides of the drawn line, as shown, to prepare the half-square units to go into the blocks. Cut apart on the line & press the half-square triangles open with seams toward the dark side. Square units to 2" square.

Sew these half-square triangle units into pairs, as shown. You will need (120) total of each pair. Also add the background squares where shown.




Sewing 1 set of half-square triangle units to the <u>small</u> background squares & the other set of half-square units to the <u>large</u> squares, complete 120 total bear paw units, as shown.



Notice that the half-square triangle units are different & be sure to add them to the correct size squares. You will need 4 of each <u>fabric</u> combination per block. Square to 5"

Adding the cross bars, sew units together, as shown.



Switching fabrics within the blocks as the quilt picture shows, sew together 30 bear paw blocks, as shown.



Arrange your blocks into your personal setting or according to the quilt picture. Sew the rows together with the sashings. You will need to sew 6 rows, as shown.



Sew the sashings & cornerstones into 7 rows, as shown.

Assemble & sew together the quilt top. You will have 6 rows of 5 blocks. Press all seams well.

Borders

Measure your quilt from top to bottom through the center. Cut (2) side borders at this measurement from Fabric D strips. You will have to piece these.

Measure your quilt from side to side & cut (2) top/bottom borders at this measurement from Fabric D strips.

Sew the <u>side</u> border strips to the quilt <u>sides</u> & press seams out.

Sew (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of FEED 649BK to the ends of both top/bottom borders & sew them to the top & bottom of the quilt. Press seams out.

Quilt the quilt & bind with binding strips.
