How to use wide (108") fabric to make a quick & easy bed skirt!

Make use of the width of fabric compared to the size of your box spring/frame. Fabric can be laid vertically or horizontally depending on what is the most efficient use of the fabric width. Exception would be if there is a directional flow to your fabric and you want the fabric to be placed in one direction or another.

Here are basic bed sizes. Without getting into a lot of math, buying (2 1/2) yards works for:

Twin = 39" x 75"

Full = 54" x 75"

Buying (3) yards works for:

Queen = 60" x 80"

King = 76" x 80"

- Center fabric over bed frame. Roll up fabric to the back side along sides and foot of bed to "puddle" fabric.
- If you'd prefer a slightly "cleaner" look around bottom of skirt, you can cut off excess fabric with a pinking shears. Or, you can use fusible tape to fold up bottom of fabric and iron a hem in place.
