## Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces. Press in the direction of arrows.

#### NOTE: Refer to the diagram for FQ cutting!

#### From Fabric A-E, G, I-L and N-P fat quarters:

- 1. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6" rectangles.
- 3. Cut four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut twelve 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Cut two 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 6. Cut two 3" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Cut four 1 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric F:

- 1. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6" rectangles.
- 3. Cut four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut twelve 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Cut four 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 6. Cut four 3" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Cut eight 1 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric H:

- 1. Cut four 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut four 2 1/2" x 6" rectangles.
- 3. Cut eight 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut twenty-eight 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Cut two 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 6. Cut two 3" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Cut four 1 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric M:

- 1. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6" rectangles.
- 3. Cut four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut twelve 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Cut two 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 6. Cut two 3" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Cut four 1 1/2" squares.
- 8. Cut eight 2 1/4" strips for binding.

#### From Fabric Q:

- 1. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut two 2 1/2" x 6" rectangles.
- 3. Cut four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut sixteen 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Cut two 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 6. Cut two 3" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Cut four 1 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric R:

- 1. Cut eleven 2 1/2" strips. Sew together end to end and cut six 2 1/2" x 70 1/2" sashes.
- 2. Cut four 3 1/2" strips. Sew together end to end and cut two 3 1/2" x 72 1/2" sashes.
- 3. Cut seventeen 2 1/2" strips. Subcut (180) 2 1/2" squares, and thirteen 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles.
- 4. Cut two 9 1/2" strips. Subcut four 9 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles.
- 5. Cut six 2" strips. Subcut one hundred and eight 2" squares.
- Cut seven 1 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty-six 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

#### From Fabric S:

1. Cut two 3 1/2" strips. Subcut eighteen 3 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric T:

1. Cut three 1 1/2" strips. Subcut eighteen 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

#### From Fabric U:

1. Cut six 3 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty-six 3 1/2" x 6" rectangles.

### Piecing Instructions:

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of each 1 1/2"
 A-Q square, four 2 1/2" A-G, I-Q squares, eight 2 1/2" H squares, and each 2 1/2" and 2" R square.

2. Pin four matching 1 1/2" squares to one 3 1/2" S square as shown. Sew on the line, trim the seam allowance to 1/4", and press open. Make one of each A-E, G-Q and two of F 1 1/2" squares and set aside as the A Units. (Figure 1)

3. Pin and sew the 2 1/2" squares to the 3" x 8 1/2" rectangles as shown, pairing up the fabrics according to the chart below to make the B Units. Make two B units of A-E, G-Q, four of F. (Figure 2)

4. Pin and sew the 2 1/2" R squares to the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" A-Q rectangles as shown. Set aside as Unit C/Cr. Make two each of A-G, I-Q, and four each of H. (Figure 3)






Figure 4 Make 36 D units.

5. Pin and sew the 2 1/2" R squares to two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" A-Q rectangles as shown. Set aside as Unit D. Make two of A-G, I-Q, and four of H. (Figure 4)

6. Pin and sew one 2 1/2" and 2" R square to two 2 1/2" x 6" A-Q rectangles as shown. Set aside as Unit E/Er. Make one each of A-G, I-Q, and two each of H. (Figure 5)








Figure 6 Make 18 Flower units.

7. Sew the A, B, C, and D units together as shown, matching the B units to the corners of the A units, and the C/D units to the corners of the B units, to make a Flower Unit. Make one of A-G, I-Q, and two of H. (Figure 6)

8. Pin and sew a pair of 2" R squares to opposite corners of the 3 1/2" x 6" U rectangles as shown to make eighteen each of the F/Fr units. (Figure 7)

9. Sew the matching E/Er units, two F/Fr Units, one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" T rectangle and two 1 1/2" x 6" R rectangles together as shown to make the Stem Block. Make one of A-G, I-Q, and two of H. (Figure 8)


Figure 9 Mäke 18 blocks.

10. Sew the matching Flower and Stem Units together to make the block. Make one of A-G, I-Q, and two of H. (Figure 9)

Ouilt Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Diagtram 1. Sew the blocks together in columns as shown in the layout diagram, with one 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" R rectangle between each block and 9 1/2" x 12 1/2" R rectangle starting and ending the odd columns. Sew the columns together with

- one 2 1/2" x 70 1/2" R sash between each column. Sew the 3 1/2" x 72 1/2" R sash to the top/bottom of the quilt top.
- 2. Sew the remaining 2 1/2" A-Q squares together into a pieced border in the order shown in the quilt image. Make two vertical borders 2 1/2" x 76 1/2" and two horizontal borders 2 1/2" x 76 1/2". Sew pieced vertical borders to the sides and the horizontal borders to the top/bottom of the quilt top.

# Finishing:

- 1. Prepare backing using two lengths to measure 84" x 88". Press seam open.
- 2. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- 5. Join eight 2 1/4" M binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.
